 - research/respond to letters from concerned family members of people buried in town
 - measure the Abial Jones cemetery for chain to replace the rusty barbed wire that is currently there
 - look into the possible new state requirement that the town have a written standards of care for their cemeteries
 - and compose a rough draft if necessary
 - look into the requirements and process for hosting a MOCA Leaning and Cleaning workshop in town
6. We will contact David Lowe to get town emails.
7. Need to let Donna know which cemeteries do not have signs so she can get some made up
8. Went to the basement to show members where we keep our supplies, everything seemed present
9. This summer we want to work on:

- finishing up the Hamilton/Ricker Cemetery (Hamilton Rd.)
- restoring the William Thing Cemetery (West Rd.)
