From Sue: For the agenda, we should continue the discussion about an establishing a berry garden and if agreed order bushes soon. We should spend money on a project this year and it would fulfill the original goal.

I'd love to see beach plums included. They check all the right boxes for soils (they like sandy Waterboro soil!), deer resistance, pest resistance and butterflies love them! I've looked at a few online nurseries, and we need to consider pre-ordering now for spring planting. They bloom in May. Fruit in August. Two bushes needed minimum. Fruit in 2-4 years depending on what size we buy. As it takes time, perhaps get the larger plants -- 3

gallon about \$50 each, from a NE grower. There is also NorthEast nursery in Peabody MA https://www.northeastnursery.com/shop with smaller plants but no shipping to worry about. Probably others? I don't know if a place like Estabrooks stocks them? Longfellow garden shows them on their site but not to order.

Their plant sale requires pick up. Ellsworth is 2 hours and 47 minutes but a nice ride! \$6 plants to promote pollinators. 6-12" bare root. Would take 8 years to maturity though. FEDCO is sold out.
