SELECTMEN'S MEETING MINUTES 3/31/92

Regular meeting of the Waterboro Board of Selectmen.

PRESENT: Chm. Dennis G. Abbott, John C. Monteith. Also present: Selectmen's Assistant Dwayne G. Morin, Art Smith and Bob Gobeil.

NEW BUSINESS:

Board voted to send a letter to the Shaker Valley Little League stating that no advertising sign for a business on Town of Waterboro fields will only be allowed if the business sponsors a team. Voted 2-0.

Board voted to allow Peppercorn Restaurant to add spirituous to their liquor license application without holding an additional Public Hearing. Voted 2-0.

Board voted to go out to bid for the audit. Voted 2-0.

Board voted to wait to discuss dump stickers and permits until there is a full Board present.

YCCA: Debby Downs was in to update the Board on what YCCA has been doing and what the Town would like to see happen. Sel. Monteith told Debby that there are some General Assistant clients who signed up for HEAP and have not heard yet if they have been accepted or denied. Debby told Sel. Monteith that all applicants will be hearing if they were accepted or not, but people should still apply. Was in agreement that Ruth Byrnes has been available enough for the Town.

EDWARD MARKHAM: Mr. Markham is the Pastor at Wayside Chapel and has been in contact with Mark Caldwell on the taxes on the church since last year. He has also met with Michelle Boisjoly to discuss this also. At one point the land was being gifted to members of the church which caused an illegal subdivision which now has been resolved. The 1991 tax bill amount was in error. Mr. Markham feels that if the land is being utilized by the church for church functions then it should be exempt. Dwayne explained that the church and the land it sits on and the parsonage with required lot size is exempted. The parsonage has a \$20,000. exemption. Board voted to abate Wayside Chapel \$306. for the 1990 taxes and \$352.35 for the 1991 taxes. All interest and lien fees will also be abated.

GRADER: Doug Foglio bought a grader at the auction and suggested taking the cost of the grader, \$4,400., from the balance of his snowplow contract. The Board voted that Doug Foglio will have to pay the Town for the grader, and the Town in turn will issue a check to the state.
