

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of Waterboro:

It is my pleasure to submit for your consideration the annual report of the schools of Waterboro.

For high school registrations I respectfully refer you to the report of the Principal.

Number of persons between the ages of 5 and 21 years: Boys-128, Girls-134, Total 262

During the fall term the school house at North Waterboro was remodeled to make a two room building. This arrangement does away with transportation of pupils to South Waterboro and thus far has proved to be a decided step in advance. At present the rooms are somewhat crowded. More space would be available if a furnace were installed thus doing away with the stoves. This building should be painted during the coming summer.

Sanitary conditions at East Waterboro have been improved by new toilets which were annexed to the rear of the building. Heating conditions at this school were recently improved by the installation of a new fan which forces the heat with increased velocity.

The roof of the South Waterboro building will need attention during the coming summer.

Owing to depletion of the balances which accumulated up to the last fiscal year, a substantial increase in appropriations will be necessary to carry on the schools on their present basis.

In conclusion, I wish to express to the committee, to the teachers and to the citizens of Waterboro, my appreciation of the kindness and consideration shown me during the past year.

To the Superintendent of Schools:

I herewith submit my third annual report of Waterboro High School.

The registration in September was forty-nine divided as follows:

Three Freshmen boys left school shortly after school began in fall. One transfered to Alfred and the other two went to work. The average attendance to date is 46.75

Again I call attention to the depleted condition of our Science Laboratory. The requirements of the State Depart-

ment of Education in regard to its maintenance is being stringently enforced, thereby endangering our Class "A" rating.

The School Library is also in need of attention. The State Department recommends that at least seventy-five dollars shall be spent each year. We have supplemented our Library this year by borrowing one hundred books from the State Library.

I am pleased to report that the debt of ninety-seven dollars owed to the Webb-Smith Printing Co. of Cornish has been reduced to nine dollars. Arrangements are now being made to raise the balance.

I wish to thank the school officials and townspeople for their cooperation in carrying out the work of the school.


