REPORT OF WATERBORO FIRE DEPARTMENT

During the past year the fire department has bought a V-8 Ford truck equipped with a pumper of 125-gallon capacity and a 250-gallon Booster tank. The tank is of the greatest value to the protection of farm property because of the lack of water on farms. We also carry 170 gallons of water and chemical on the truck with three new lengths of suction hose to draft water from a pond or lake, when possible. We now have eight fire tanks for fighting forest fires. At present, our main trouble is to finish the balance on our equipment and get more hose and a heated place in which to keep the truck in the winter months.

If the voters will notice, there hasn't been any money expended for fighting forest fires, which in the past, has cost the town two or three hundred dollars. This was made possible by the members of the fire department and the citizens of the town, for whose volunteered services I wish to thank.

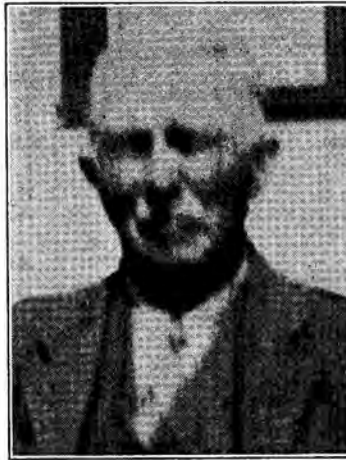

WARRANT

State of Maine

To Frederick H. Goul, Constable of Waterboro, in the County of York and State of Maine, Greeting:

IN THE NAME OF THE STATE OF MAINE, you are hereby commanded to notify and warn the inhabitants of said town, qualified to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the town house in said town on MONDAY, March 13, 1939, at 10 o'clock A. M., then and there to act on the following articles to wit:

First: To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

Second: To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

Third: To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for Roads and Bridges for the year ensuing.

Fourth: To see what sum the town will grant and raise for state aid road construction (in addition to the amount regularly raised) for the care of ways, highways and bridges under the provisions of Section 19, Chapter 28, Revised Statutes of 1930, or under the provisions of Section 3, Chapter 229, Public Laws of 1937.

Fifth: To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for winter roads.

Sixth: To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for State Road Patrol.

Seventh: To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for the support of a Free High School, for the year ensuing, including transportation and money, already spent for same.

Eighth: To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for the support of Common Schools for the year ensuing.

Ninth: To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for Text Books and Supplies for the year ensuing.

Tenth: To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for the repair of school buildings for the year ensuing.

Eleventh: To see what sum the town will grant and raise of salary for the District Superintendent of the year ensuing.

Twelfth: To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise of Public Health Nurse for the year ensuing.

Thirteenth: To see what sum the town will grant and raise for the Support of Poor for the year ensuing.

Fourteenth: To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for Incidentals for the year ensuing.

Fifteenth: To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for State Tax for the year ensuing.

Sixteenth: To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for County Tax for the year ensuing.

Seventeenth: To see what sum the town will grant and raise for 50-50 Road Machine work for the year ensuing.

Eighteenth: To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for Principal and Interest on Town Bonds for year ensuing.

Nineteenth: To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for Observance of Memorial Day for the year ensuing.

Twentieth: To see what action the town will grant and raise for Interest on tax anticipation notes for the year ensuing.

Twenty-first: To see what action the town will take with reference to the town farm for the ensuing year.

Twenty-second: To see if the town will vote that, for the purpose of procuring a temporary loan or loans, for the use of the town of Waterboro to pay indebtedness of said town due, and to become due during the municipal year 1939, such loans

to be paid out of money raised by taxation during the municipal year beginning March 15, 1939, and ending March 15, 1940, the Town Treasurer be, and he hereby is authorized and directed to borrow from time to time a sum, not exceeding in the aggregate fourteen thousand dollars, said sum being less than the tax levy for the year 1938, and to execute and deliver a note or notes of the town therefor, signed in his official capacity as Treasurer, countersigned by the Selectmen, all of said notes, or any renewal or replacement thereof shall be payable on or before December 31, 1939.

Twenty-third: To see if the town will authorize the Collector to charge interest on all unpaid taxes at the rate of one-half per cent per month upon all taxes unpaid October 1, 1939, interest to begin September 1, 1939.

Twenty-fourth: To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for the cutting of bushes on improved roads during the municipal year 1939 and see what method the town will adopt in the cutting of the same.

Twenty-fifth: To see what sum, if any, the town will grant and raise for the cutting of bushes on unimproved roads in said town for the year 1939 and if so to see what method the town will adopt for the cutting of the same.

Twenty-sixth: To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for the extermination of brown tail moths for the year ensuing.

Twenty-seventh: To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for the maintenance of third-class roads for the ensuing year.

Twenty-eighth: To see what action the town will take regarding the recommendations contained in the report of the Finance Committee relating to abatement of delinquent taxes of taxpayers in the town of Waterboro.

Twenty-ninth: To see if the town will vote to print the Tax Commitment every *third year*, beginning with the Town Report of March, 1940.

Thirtieth: To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$150.00 to cover the cost of re-planking the New Dam and Edgecomb's Bridges over the Little Ossipee River.

Thirty-first: To see if the town will vote to rescind the

action taken in the Town Meeting of March 12, 1934, at which time it was voted to adopt for use in the annual Meeting the Secret Ballot as provided for in Sections 38 to 52 of Chapter 5, Revised Statutes.

Thirty-second: To see if the town will vote to accept the provisions of Chapter 8, Revised Statutes, using henceforth the so-called "Buxton type" of Australian Ballot.

Thirty-third: To see if the town will vote to direct the Selectmen to bring suit against the Town of Buxton to recover sums spent by the Town of Waterboro for school conveyance and board of the children of Bert Cressey, and to force the Town of Buxton to accept responsibility for the current board bill of Bertha Cressey who now attends the East Waterboro school.

Thirty-fourth: To see if the town will vote to direct the Selectmen to abate, in favor of the Cumberland County Power and Light Company, the taxes on the water privilege at Little Ossipee Lake in consideration of an agreement on the part of the said Company that no water will be drawn from said Lake prior to September 15, 1939.

Thirty-fifth: To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for advertising our natural resources, advantages and attractions, under the provisions of Chapter 5, Section 82 of the Revised Statutes of 1930, said sum to be expended under the direction of the State of Maine Publicity Bureau.

Thirty-sixth: To see if the town will grant and raise the sum of \$200.00 for the improvement of the road, beginning at the Charles Earle place at Waterboro Center and leading past the residence of Erving Stuart to the homestead of the late Almon Walker on the top of Pound hill, so-called.

Thirty-seventh: To see if the town will grant and raise the sum of fifty dollars to partially reimburse Ray S. Chadbourne for taxes paid to the town of Waterboro on real estate never owned by him during the years prior to 1938.

Thirty-eighth: To see if the town will raise the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150.00) for the repair of the road on Deering's Ridge, wherever it may be most needed, from the Lyman line to the residence of Mrs. Lincoln Deering, a dis-

tance of approximately one mile.

Thirty-ninth: To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise for street lights for the ensuing year.

Fortieth: To see if the town will vote to raise and expend the sum of \$50.00 for the improvement of roads in Johnson Park, so-called.

Forty-first: To see if the town will vote to grant and raise the sum of two hundred thirty-six dollars and eighty-five cents to cover the overdraft of the Orrin Boothby account.

Forty-second: To see if the town will vote to authorize the assessors to rescind any amounts appropriated by the town for State Aid Highway construction in excess of the amount required to meet State apportionments.

Forty-third: To see what sum, if any, the town would recommend to take from the joint state aid account for the purpose of applying bituminous surface treatment to state aid roads, in excess of the requirements of Section 2, Chapter 132, P. L. 1935.

Forty-fourth: To see if the town will grant and raise a sum of money for the Waterboro Fire Department.

Forty-fifth: To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money sufficient to sheath or provide a suitable place in which to keep the fire truck and tractor heated during the winter months.

Forty-sixth: To see if the town will vote to authorize its Finance Committee on behalf of the town to sell and dispose of any real estate acquired by the town for non-payment of taxes thereon, on such terms as they deem advisable, and to execute quitclaim deeds for such property.

Forty-seventh: To transact any other business that may be legally brought before said meeting.

The selectmen will be in session at their office in the Town House on Thursday, March 9th, Friday, March 10th, and Saturday, March 11th, for the purpose of correcting the list of voters.

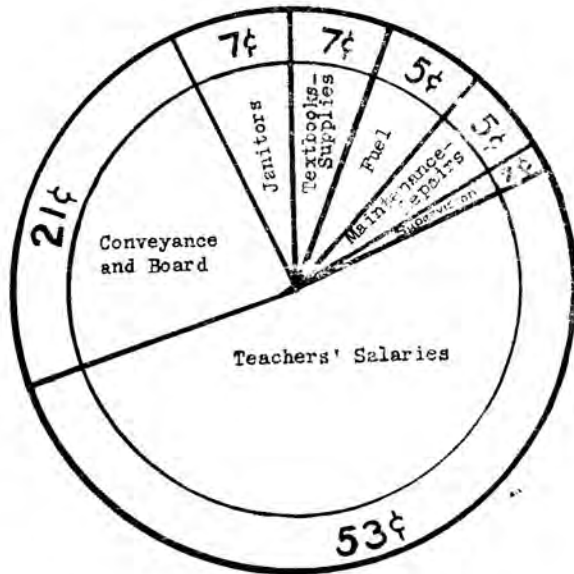

*To the Superintending School Committee and the Citizens
of Waterboro:*

I submit herewith for your consideration the annual report of the schools of Waterboro.

Through the interest of the members of the school board and the generosity of the taxpayers, this has been a progressive and, in our opinion, a profitable school year.

Several projects have been made possible that have tended to make school privileges more equable and uniform for all the pupils of the town.

At a special town meeting, held in October last, the town voted to transport the pupils of the high school who live in the outlying districts and all the pupils of grades seven and eight in the same districts to South Waterboro. This seems to be a matter of fairness and we sincerely hope that the town will continue to transport these pupils.

Bringing all the seventh and eighth grade pupils of the town together has made it possible to organize the high

school on the six year unified plan. Under this scheme Mrs. Ricker teaches seventh and eighth grade English as well as regular high school English, thus making the instruction in this subject uniform for all pupils. Mr. Libby teaches Freshman Civics. Incidentally, the teaching load in the other schools has been lightened, no teacher in town at the present time having more than three grades.

The school committee has recently voted that, beginning next September, grades five and six of North Waterboro will be transported to South Waterboro thereby dispensing with the services of one teacher in that district. Registration in that particular school is not sufficient to justify its profitable maintenance. The money thus saved will in a large measure offset the cost of conveyance recently incurred.

Last summer a steam heating plant, which works very satisfactorily, was installed in the school building at East Waterboro. Other improvements made on the same building were the addition of a coat of paint to the exterior and the building of a shelter over the basement bulk head. This shelter prevents rain or melting snow from entering the basement.

At North Waterboro a well has been driven and water may now be pumped into the schoolhouse.

Other general repairs have been made on all buildings where necessary.

Two teachers resigned last June, Miss Martha Goodwin from the Primary School at East Waterboro and Mrs. Esther Brock Abbott from the Grammar School in the same building. These respective positions were filled by the election of Mrs. Gladys Johnson and Mrs. Florentine Roberts.

In conclusion I wish to express to the committee, the teachers and pupils, and to the citizens of Waterboro my appreciation of the kindness and consideration shown me during the past year.

REPORT OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH NURSE

To the Citizens of the Town of Waterboro:

I herewith submit my annual report as Public Health Nurse for the year 1938.

The following is the report of the health inspections done in the schools during 1938:

Special inspections for evidence of skin diseases were made during the year at some of the schools. These were made on request of Superintendent Wright or from the teachers. Several children were excluded from school for evidence of skin disease or for pediculosis, and home visits were made on some to urge medical care. Other home visits were made following the regular health inspections at school regarding defects found and to urge corrections be made. Conferences were held with social workers of the Bureau of Social Welfare regarding children in need of tonsil operations.

In October, conferences were held with Superintendent Wright, members of the school board and the teachers regarding conducting a diphtheria immunization clinic. All schools were visited and talks given the pupils regarding the purpose of the clinics. Consent slips were given them to take home for signature. On November 3, with Mrs. Nellie Morse, State Field Nurse, a joint pre-school and school immunization clinic was held at South Waterboro school. Eighty-eight school children were given diphtheria immunization by Dr. Carl Richards of Alfred, who gave his services.

I wish at this time to assure you that the cooperation of all in your community is appreciated and I hope you will continue to call upon me for any service which I may be able to render you.

To all who have helped with the health work this year, I am grateful.

5. To teach a vocation.

We are accomplishing much with the first four, but our small schools are neglecting the fifth. Teaching a vocation is a subject which should be considered seriously. For our locality, I would recommend Industrial Arts, Domestic Science and Agriculture.

Again, I bring to your attention the need of introducing music in the schools.

I wish to thank all who have cooperated with me in my years at Waterboro.
