Report of the Selectmen

Within the pages of this, the 164th Annual Report of the Selectmen of the Town of Waterboro, you, the citizens of the town, may read of the programs of the various departments of our government and the methods used to carry out the wishes of the citizens as expressed in town meeting.

We are pleased to again report that the town has no indebtedness. Prior to the last three years, or from 1920 on, we have paid many thousands of dollars for interest on bonds and notes for town borrowings. Payments of interest benefit none except those loaning the money. The liberality of the 94th Legislature gave us an opportunity to stop interest payment and today we enjoy a boom not given to many towns in the State. We believe that our citizens desire that we shall remain free from debt and that we should use extreme caution before contracting costly obligations.

The work of Road Commissioner Guy E. Bagley again deserves special commendation. His work on the Cotton Road, on the Pound Hill Road, on Mill Street at South Waterboro, and on Pearl Street in that village has not been of the "patch" variety; rather has he striven to perform work of an enduring variety, which has received our approbation in every respect.

For the general cooperation of the great majority of our citizens with our efforts, we return our hearty thanks and again assure you that we shall do everything in the future, when given the opportunity, to keep the town on an even keel and, always, solvent.

REPORT OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH NURSE

I herein submit a brief report of service rendered the town of Waterboro by the York County Tuberculosis and Health Association for the period beginning January 1, 1951 to January 1, 1952.

Medical efforts have been notably successful in the eradication of Smallpox, Diphtheria, Whooping Cough and other common contagious illnesses. In the control of Tuberculosis, success has been less marked because no vaccine has been developed which is completely effective to the entire population. The Tuberculin Patch tests are an effective means to finding tuberculosis, with a follow-up of chest X-rays. Tuberculosis causes more deaths than all other infectious and contagious diseases.

Our activities consist of School Health Program and constantly working to find and eradicate tuberculosis.

One hundred and fifty-four students received Tuberculin Patch tests. Three positive reactors were found. Arrangements were made for X-rays of students and their families at the State Diagnostic X-ray Clinic in Saco.

Also X-ray appointments were made for routine check-up on suspected tuberculosis cases.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

Superintending School Committee, Citizens of Waterboro, it is again my privilege to submit the annual report of schools:

Elementary enrollment this year is 157. They are registered and classified in the various schools as follows: South Waterboro, grade 1, 11; Grade 2, 12; Grade 3, 17; Grade 4, 15; Grade 5, 11; Grade 6, 10; Grade 7, 22; Grade 8, 14; total, 112. East Waterboro: Grade 1, 3; Grade 2, 6; Grade 3, 7; Grade 4, 8; Grade 5, 5; Grade 6, 4, total, 33. North Waterboro: Grade 1, 3; Grade 2, 2; Grade 3, 6; Grade 4, 1, total, 12. Enrollment of high school students will be found in the report of the High School Principal. Four secondary pupils attend Sanford High School and are taking occupational courses. There has been no serious interruption in attendance.

Teaching personnel remains the same with two exceptions. Miss Frances Coombs of Yarmouth was engaged as high school assistant to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Miss Patricia Miller.

During the fall term we were fortunate in securing the services of Mrs. Agnes L. Tibbetts of Springvale as supervisor of music.

Last summer the two classrooms at East Waterboro were redecorated and fluorescent lighting installed. Fluorescent fixtures and other necessary material have been purchased for installation at South Waterboro during the coming year. Major improvements have been undertaken at North Waterboro. Last fall a well was driven. Flush toilets and lavatories were installed.

The sewerage system for these was begun and will be completed in the spring.

Beginning with 1952 the State will adopt a new method of distributing state aid to schools of the different municipalities. According to a recent law, towns will be classified in nine categories to be determined by state valuation per resident pupil. The procedure consists of dividing the latest state valuation by the total number of resident pupils attending school either in or outside the town. This determines the category in which the several towns belong and shows what percentage of school costs is to be paid by the state.

Consideration is being given by interested citizens of Waterboro and neighboring towns to the building of a regional high school in this area. The advantages of such a school over present secondary facilities have been presented so many times that repetition on my part is not necessary. *It is a project, however, that should be very seriously considered and acted upon.*

Recently the legislature passed a law known as the *School Building Authority Act*. Under this Act the State will finance the building of schoolhouses and the towns taking advantage of the Act may reimburse the State on a rental basis over a period not to exceed forty years.

In closing I wish to express my appreciation to the citizens and all school personnel for their helpful cooperation during the year.

TOWN WARRANT

STATE OF MAINE

County of York, ss.

GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby commanded to notify and warn the Inhabitants of said Waterboro, qualified to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the Town House in said town on Monday, March 10, 1952, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, then and there to act on the following articles, to wit:

Article 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

Article 2. To choose all necessary town officers for said town for the year ensuing.

Article 3. To see what sum the town will grant and raise for roads and bridges for the year ensuing.

Article 4. To see what sum the town will grant and raise for winter roads for the year ensuing.

Article 5. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for the support of charities for the year ensuing, the same being in lieu of former appropriations entitled: Support of Poor, and including monies to paid for Old Age Assistance, Aid to Dependent children, etc.

Article 6. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for incidentals for the year ensuing.

Article 7. To see if the town will vote to pay the Tax Collector on a percentage basis at the rate of 1½% of all taxes collected, starting with the 1952 Commitment. On petition of J. Millard Hughey and thirteen others.

Article 8. To see if the town will grant and raise the sum of \$1,910.00 to pay town officers' salaries for the year ensuing.

Article 9. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for Free High School, Common Schools and text books and supplies for the year ensuing.

Article 10. To see what sum the town will grant and raise for repairs, improvements and insurance for school buildings for the year ensuing.

Article 11. To see if the town will grant and raise a sum of money for a public health nurse for the year ensuing.

Article 12. To see what sum the town will grant and raise for State Tax for the year ensuing, said sum, if granted, to be applied to the cost of winter roads for the year 1952-1953.

Article 13. To see what sum the town will grant and raise for County Tax for the year ensuing.

Article 14. To see if the town will vote to grant and raise the sum of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00)

for the maintenance of a town dump for the ensuing year.

Article 15. To see if the town will vote to grant and raise a sum of money, and how much, for observance of Memorial Day.

Article 16. To see if the town will grant and raise a sum of money for the construction of a section of State Aid Road for the year ensuing, and if so, how much.

Article 17. To see what sum the town will grant and raise for street lights for the year ensuing.

Article 18. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to borrow money on the credit of said town to pay current bills, and in anticipation of taxes for the year ensuing.

Article 19. To see if the town will grant and raise a sum of money to aid the Waterboro Fire Department for the year ensuing, and if so, how much.

Article 20. To see if the town will grant and raise a sum of money for the benefit of the continuance of the reforestation program, and if so, how much.

Article 21. To see if the town will grant and raise a sum of money, to be used in conjunction with Red Cross funds, for the maintenance of a dental clinic for school children, and if so, how much.

Article 22. To see if the town will grant and raise a sum of money for the further improvement of Ossipee Hill road from the end of tar to the residence of

Nellie Thompson, by the preparation and use of tar thereon, on petition of S. Peter Starrett and sixteen others.

Article 23. To see if the town will grant and raise the sum of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) to be paid to the Maine Publicity Bureau and used for advertising the natural resources, etc., for the State of Maine.

Article 24. To see if the town will vote for the privilege of controlling the gate in the dam on the outlet of Little Ossipee Lake, known as the Chadbourne Mill Privilege, from June 1st to Labor Day for each of the years 1952, 1953, 1954, 1955, and 1956, the Selectmen be authorized to enter into and execute an agreement on behalf of the Inhabitants of the town, with the Central Maine Power Company, whereby the Selectmen of the town are to have full control and management of the operation of the outlet gate in said dam from June 1st until Labor Day for each of said years, and whereby the town is to pay to the Central Maine Power Company for said privilege a sum of money annually equal to the sum of Seventy-five Dollars (\$75.00) plus any, and all, municipal taxes laid or assessed on said property for such year; and whereby said Company is to repair and maintain the outlet gate in said dam so that the leakage therefrom shall not be unreasonable, and that all monies payable under this article shall be taken out of the Contingent, or Incidental funds of said town.

Article 25. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Collector of Taxes to charge interest on unpaid taxes on September 1, 1952, interest to commence October 1, 1952, at the rate of one-half per cent per month.

Article 26. To see if the town will vote to grant unto the Selectmen authority to convey by quit claim deeds any real estate in said town to which it has gained title through matured tax liens or other property of said inhabitants.

Article 27. To transact any other business that may lawfully come before said meeting.

The Selectmen hereby give public notice that for the purpose of correcting the check list of voters, they will be in session at the Town House, in said town, on the eighth day of March, 1952, from 1 o'clock until 4 o'clock P. M.

The Selectmen give further notice that the polls for the election of Town Officers under Article 2 of this Warrant will be opened fifteen minutes after the completion of business under all other article in this Warrant, and remain open until 7 o'clock of that day.
