### ANNUAL REPORT OF PUBLIC HEALTH NURSE

Public health nursing service through the Department of Health and Welfare has been given your town since October 1955. This service is available to everyone in Waterboro, not just a special age group, or those with any one health problem. The aim of such a program is prevention of illness rather than cure. Therefore, the service includes home visits to mothers before and after the baby arrives, to infants, pre-school children, school children, crippled and cardiac children, and to adults with health problems. Schools are visited regularly, teacher-nurse conferences are held and home visits made to children with health problems. For the infants and pre-school children, child health conferences may be offered. To such conferences parents may bring children of these ages for a medical examination and for immunization against diphtheria, whooping cough, tetanus and smallpox. Our thought is that the earlier one is exposed to such medical attention, the easier it is to accept and follow through with routine check-ups as one becomes an adult.

Anyone known or suspected of having tuberculosis may be visited regularly by the nurse. She may give help in securing medical care, teaching the patient and family proper home care and arranging for examination and x-ray of persons in close contact with tuberculosis patients. This is the most effective method of finding new cases of tuberculosis and getting prompt medical care for them. The York County Tuberculosis and Health Association is always cooperative in giving any assistance requested.

Much time has been spent in meeting people and becoming acquainted with the town since I first started working in Waterboro. Visits to teachers have been made regularly. The teachers and I have talked over health problems, and I have made several home visits as a result to talk with parents. I cannot help but notice the quiet orderliness of the pupils as they pass through the corridors and the cafeteria and on the stairs, which is maintained without rigid discipline. The vision testing, individual student inspection and weighing and measuring has been assumed by the teachers as provided by the State Department of Education. Hearing testing will be done in the first three grades by the nurse with a Puretone audiometer. This is an instrument to test the hearing of one child at a time more accurately than the group method. I have also visited infants and pre-school children. Many children are not being seen by their doctor unless they are sick. Very few of the young children are immunized against diseases such as whooping cough, diphtheria and smallpox—diseases which can occur if adequate immunization is not maintained.

In considering future plans to meet these and other interests and needs, cooperation from both sides is of the utmost importance. There are many health problems of which I am not aware. The people in the town who are aware of them have the privilege and responsibility of calling these problems to my attention. I have services that I can offer to help you meet them. One way of pooling this information and getting the most from your nursing service is by the formation of a group of townspeople who meet to plan for community health. Such a group, usually called a Health Council, has as its functions: 1) findings, studying, and seeking volunteers to health problems, 2) furnishing volunteers at community health activities, 3)

interpreting public health nursing service to the community and 4) cooperating with local service groups.

In order to expand the public health nursing program in Waterboro, the continued cooperation of the town officials, school personnel, and the members of the community is necessary.

I would like to take this opportunity to express my appreciation to the many citizens who have shown me so much friendliness and cooperation.

## REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDING SCHOOL COMMITTEE

To the Citizens of Waterboro:

Throughout the past year the School Committee has continued the policy of keeping the public informed of the activities, problems, accomplishments, and also of the needs and plans for the future, of the school system of your town. This was done through the Weekly Teacher Progress reports in the Sanford Tribune, through the holding of the annual School Open-House Program during National Education Week in November, and more recently through the organization and publicity of the newly formed Waterboro Parents Club.

It is customary to review annually in the Town Report what the School Committee and the Schools have been doing during the previous twelve months along with comments thereon; this year we are attempting to brief our comments due to the previously mentioned good publicity and because the report of the Superintendent and the listing of the itemized school expenditures provides most of the detailed information about the schools and it need not be repeated here.

Last June 15 Waterboro students were graduated from Sanford High School, several members of this group attained high honors, and several others attained honors. This was a fine group of Waterboro students and a remarkable achievement in view of the total enrollment at Sanford of well over 600 students. Most members of this class we are pleased to report have



now either gone on to college, joined some branch of the Armed Forces, or are working at gainful employment and holding down respectable jobs.

As reported many times previously school expenditures are high here just as they are elsewhere and they are still continuing to increase yearly due mainly to several uncontrollable factors such as rapidly increasing teacher salaries, rapidly increasing school enrollments, and improved modern educational materials, thus bringing on higher school costs and increased tuition rates. In face of these factors your Committee has worked hard in attempting to keep your 1956-1957 school budget within reason. The school buildings are in reasonably good repair, so the Repairs Account is to be reduced; the teachers' salaries are now at the minimum wage standard that a four-year teachers college graduate can command on first teaching position, thus this will be held as is for the coming year; the bus conveyance has been surveyed carefully and no increase is anticipated here, and a sizeable balance on hand has been carried over from the 1955 school year account.

Bearing the above paragraph in mind and that it is anticipated that only two Waterboro students will graduate from Sanford High School in June, it is anticipated that 22 present eighth graders will enroll as freshmen at Sanford High School in September, and that it is anticipated that approximately 27 children will enroll in the first grade in September, increasing our total school enrollment by 25; we as a Committee feel that we are making a very reasonable request in asking for an increase of slightly less than \$3,000.00 more at Town Meeting this year over and above that which was so generously appropriated for the 1955-56 school year.

A recent survey shows that there are now 45 more Waterboro children attending school than were enrolled four years ago, and in September it is anticipated that there will be 70 more Waterboro children attending school than were enrolled five years ago.

Regarding tuition for Waterboro students to Sanford High School as mentioned in our 1955 report there was no increase as promised in that tuition rate for the 1955-56 school year over that of 1954. There will be a tuition increase of \$50.00 per student over the present rate starting with the 1956-57 school year. As for the comment in our 1955 report about the "anticipated no tuition increase statement for a number of years to follow," which was based on a conversation between the Sanford Superintendent and one of your present board members, the statement was made in good faith by a man of good faith and was passed on by your School Board with every good intent. As to our board member who was responsible for this comment, that member was at one time cautioned by a local man that although the Superintendent has much influence, the Sanford School Board makes the final decision, this advice proved to be true. With increased school costs, and the present Sanford economic condition—thus the reversed decision from a year ago. In spite of this increase this still is a bargain rate as high as secondary education rates are running elsewhere.

As stated in 1951, your present committee and the State Department of Education still maintain that the Waterboro-Sanford arrangement is educationally sound and financially practical. It is understood that several exhaustive studies have been made on this by local people as well as by members of your committee. Reports seem to indicate for the time being at least, and they coincide with ours; there at present is no



alternative or better solution from any angle of approach. The record of Waterboro students now attending Sanford High School and the record of Waterboro students who have attended or graduated from Sanford High School speaks for itself, no further elaboration is necessary on this subject.

Early in February your School Committee along with other school committees of towns sending students to Sanford High School attended a very interesting program on the school curriculum there. Mr. Lawrence Page, Principal, prepared the program and we heard faculty members discuss such subjects as guidance, business education, vocational education, college preparation, physical and health education and many other important aspects of the educational program being carried on at Sanford.

Early in February we are very pleased to report that Waterboro passed a milestone for a Parents Club was formed, a club which today is a very necessary and essential unit for a fully successful educational operation in any community.

As a semi-climax it is with regret that your School Committee, an affiliate of School Union No. 6, has accepted the resignation of Superintendent Maynard E. Wright, effective July 1st, after 36 years of loyal and faithful service to Waterboro and the other six towns within our school union. It is our hope that Mr. Wright may have a long and happy retirement after a lifetime of devotion to the educational progress of our area. It is our prediction that it is going to take an extremely capable and patient individual to fill this position equally as well as it has been filled these past 36 years.

In closing we wish to take this opportunity to thank all of the individuals and organizations which have so fully cooperated with us in our endeavor to maintain a good educational system for all Waterboro pupils.

## REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

Members of the Superintending School Committee, Citizens of Waterboro, I herewith submit my thirty-sixth and final annual report of schools.

Elementary enrollment at the present time is one hundred eighty-six. Of this number five are tuition pupils from Lyman. Thirty-eight pupils attend Sanford High School and until recently tuition was being paid for one in Limerick High School. Grades one and two at East Waterboro have a registration of twenty-six each. The remaining six grades at South Waterboro are grouped as follows: Grade 3, 35; Grade 4, 21; Grade 5, 16; Grade 6, 16; Grade 7, 23; Grade 8, 23.

The practice of repairing and improving the two school buildings has been continued during the year. The classroom windows of the building at East Waterboro were weatherstripped. This together with a change made in the oil burner has greatly improved heating conditions there. Fluorescent lights were installed in Grade seven room and new seats were purchased for grades four and five. Minor repairs have been made where necessary.

The school lunch program is being continued at South and East. The extra expense of maintaining two programs resulted in a deficit in this department. The town was asked to help meet the situation. This was done by a special appropriation.

Very recently an association of parents and teachers was organized. Such a group working together

can offer the schools much support morally and financially. They have our hearty endorsement.

At the last session of the legislature the law governing the distribution of subsidies to schools was changed. The change divides the towns of the State into twenty-four classifications instead of nine as was formerly the case. Subsidies range from sixty-five percent in towns where the State valuation per resident pupil is \$3,000.00 and under to fifteen percent where the State valuation per resident pupil is \$15,000.01 and more. Waterboro is in classification 16 and for the next biennium will draw 28 percent of the cost of school maintenance.

Thirty-six years in retrospect is a long time. Much has happened. Undoubtedly mistakes have been made but we sincerely hope that the overall accomplishment has meant progress for the schools of Waterboro. We have tried to keep pace with the years.

In 1920 five buildings were in use for elementary purposes; a two-room building at South and four one-room buildings at Old Corner, East Waterboro, Waterboro Center, and North Waterboro. Most of the secondary pupils attended Alfred High School until the fall of 1922 when Waterboro High School was opened. It was not until the following January that the building was completed and sufficiently equipped to take care of the grades.

The present two-room building at East Waterboro was begun in 1925 and was ready for occupancy in January, 1926. That same year the school at Center was closed and the pupils from that district were conveyed to East.

In 1935 the school house at North Waterboro was remodeled making it a two-room building and it was



maintained as a two teacher school for about four years. Later it was modernized and used as a one-room school until it was finally closed in 1952.

June, 1934 saw the closing of the school at Old Corner. Pupils from there were conveyed to South.

By vote of the town Waterboro High School was closed in 1952. It was also voted to pay the cost of conveying pupils to Sanford High School. The educational advantages offered by this change and the record made by Waterboro pupils attending school in Sanford speak for themselves.

REPORT OF WATERBORO CIVIL DEFENSE  
AND PUBLIC SAFETY AGENCY

North Waterboro, Maine  
February 27, 1956

To the Selectmen, Town of Waterboro, Maine.

Following is a report of the Waterboro Civil Defense and Public Safety Agency for 1955.

Having been appointed as director in October, I should like to express my thanks to Mr. Lawrence Mansfield for his assistance in orienting me in the various duties of Director, to the Selectmen for their co-operation and to all other citizens of the town who have given support to me, for a better Civil Defense organization.

There are now 62 persons enrolled in First Aid Classes in Waterboro. Two classes are conducted, one for adults and the other for young people. These classes were organized by Miss Jeannette Tibbetts, of the Saco Chapter of Red Cross. These classes are sponsored by Civil Defense.

There is at present time no radio communication with other towns. In case of telephone failure in the near future we plan to have communication with Alfred and Sanford. In this connection, the Civil Air Patrol of Sanford has performed a very important service in one occasion.

We have at North Waterboro a very well equipped Control Center for Waterboro Civil Defense. There has been, in the last few months, a telephone installed



there for Civil Defense. The building is the old school house.

Alfred and Waterboro Civil Defense have worked together on the Ground Observer Post. The building has been moved to the old spot in Alfred, remodeled and painted inside. The post will be manned 24 hours a day with the help of the citizens from Alfred, Waterboro, and the institution at Alfred.

There are now 123 citizens enrolled in Civil Defense, they having taken the oath. Our quota is 210. Anyone who has not received their identification card with picture, should make arrangements as soon as possible.

# WARRANT

### GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby commanded to notify and warn the Inhabitants of said Waterboro, qualified to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the Town House, in said Town, on Saturday, the 10th day of March, A. D., 1956 at 10 o'clock A. M., then and there to act on the following articles, to wit:

Article 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

Article 2. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

Article 3. To see if the town will vote that all unexpended balances in the several departments of Town Government of Waterboro be reappropriated and added to the appropriations for 1956 made this day.

Finance Committee recommends yes.

Article 4. To see what sum the town will grant and raise for Roads and Bridges for the year ensuing, including Pond Roads.

Finance Committee recommends \$3,500.00.

Article 5. To see what sum the town will grant and raise for Winter Roads for the year ensuing.

Finance Committee recommends \$2,000.00.

Article 6. To see what sum the town will grant and raise for the support of Charities for the year ensuing, the same being in lieu of former appropriations for Support of Poor, Aid to Dependent Children, etc.

Finance Committee recommends \$3,000.00.

Article 7. To see what sum the town will grant and raise for Incidentals for the year ensuing.

Finance Committee recommends \$2,000.00.

Article 8. To see if the town will vote to grant and raise the following amounts for Salaries of Town Officers, to wit: Selectmen, Assessors and Overseers of Poor—Chairman, \$500.00; two other members \$400.00 each; Treasurer, \$300.00; Town Clerk \$25.00; Members of Superintending School Committee, Chairman \$75.00, two other members \$50.00 each, Total \$1,800.00.

Finance Committee recommends \$1,800.00.

Article 9. To see if the town will grant and raise the sum of \$36,000.00 for the maintenance of Free High School, Common Schools, Text Books and Supplies, Tuition and Superintendent's Salary for the year ensuing.

Finance Committee recommends \$36,000.00.

Article 10. To see what sum, if any, the town will vote to grant and raise for Civil Defense for the year ensuing.

Finance Committee recommends \$350.00.

Article 11. To see if the town will grant and raise the sum of \$4,700.00 for High School Transportation for the year ensuing.

Finance Committee recommends \$4,700.00.

Article 12. To see if the town will vote to grant and raise the sum of \$1,500.00 for Repairs, Equipment and Insurance Account, School Buildings for the year ensuing.

Article 13. To see if the town will vote to grant and raise a sum sufficient to pay the County Tax for the year ensuing.

Finance Committee recommends a sum sufficient.

Article 14. To see what sum, if any, the town will grant and raise for the maintenance of a Town Dump for the year ensuing.

Finance Committee recommends \$400.00.

Article 15. To see if the town will vote to pay the Collector of Taxes a compensation of  $1\frac{1}{2}\%$  as compensation for services as such Collector for all taxes collected for the year ensuing.

Finance Committee recommends ought to pass and that a sum sufficient be raised.



Article 16. To see if the town will grant and raise a sum of money for Health Nursing in Waterboro for the year ensuing, and if so, how much, to be expended by the Maine Health & Welfare, Bureau of Health, for local service.

Finance Committee recommends continued service of Health Nurse.

Article 17. To see if the town will vote to grant and raise a sum of money for the observance of Memorial Day.

Finance Committee recommends \$100.00.

Article 18. To see if the town will vote to grant and raise the sum of \$1,200.00 for State Aid Construction (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of Ways, Highways and Bridges), under the provisions of Section 44 and 49, Chapter 23, R. S. 1954.

Finance Committee recommends \$1,200.00.

Article 19. To see what sum the town will grant and raise for Street Lights, Beacon Service and Town House Lights for the year ensuing.

Finance Committee recommends \$1,660.00.

Article 20. To see if the town will vote for the installation of four additional street lights upon the highways of Waterboro, namely: Two on Hamilton Road, one near the residence of Grace Scribner, and one at South Waterboro village for the better lighting of the "Square", so-called.

Finance Committee recommends yes.

Article 21. To see if the town will vote to grant and raise a sum of money and, if so, how much, to continue the application of tar to the following highways in Waterboro: 1. From State Highway No. 4 to residence of Robert Ramsell; 2. Ossipee Hill Road, from Waterboro Center to residence of Louis Wood; 3. The Champ C. Gould Road; 4. The road from North Waterboro to residence of Austin Carpenter; 5. On that section of Twomey Road that was rebuilt in 1955.

Finance Committee recommends \$3,000.00.

Article 22. To see if the town will grant and raise a sum of money and, if so, how much, to be used in connection with the Red Cross funds, for the maintenance of a Dental Clinic for School Children for the year ensuing.

Finance Committee recommends \$200.00.

Article 23. To see if the town will vote to grant and raise a sum of money to be paid to the Maine Publicity Bureau to advertise the natural resources, advantages and attractions of the State of Maine, under the provisions of Chapter 91, Section 108, R. S. of Maine, 194, and, if so, how much.

Finance Committee recommends \$50.00.

Article 24. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for the benefit of the Waterboro Fire Department.

Finance Committee recommends \$3,200.00.

Article 25. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to borrow money on

the credit of said town to pay current bills in anticipation of taxes.

Finance Committee recommends that authority be granted.

Article 26. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to repay to Starrett Pierce the amount paid by him for a tax on the so-called "Lane place" in 1954, the same having been sold to him prior to April 1, 1954 to one Kennedy, who also paid an assessment on the same property.

Finance Committee recommends yes.

Article 27. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen on behalf of the town to sell and dispose of any real estate acquired by the town for the non-payment of taxes on such terms and conditions as they may deem advisable and execute Quit Claim Deeds for the same.

Finance Committee recommends this to be voted on Town House floor.

Article 28. To see if the town will grant and raise a further sum, and if so, how much, to repair the road from the top of "Hasty Hill," so-called, to the former residence of the late David Gray.

Finance Committee recommends \$150.00.

Article 29. To see if the town will vote to grant a certain sum for the maintenance of the Hot Lunch Program in schools in Waterboro for the ensuing year, and to raise the further sum of \$299.54 to balance the 1955 account, no appropriation having been made therefor.

Finance Committee recommends \$700.00.

Article 30. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Collector to charge interest at the rate of  $\frac{1}{2}\%$  per month on all 1956 taxes unpaid 1957, February 1st, from October 1, 1956.

Finance Committee recommends this should be passed.

Article 31. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to enter into a compact with the State of Maine for the suppression of the Dutch Elm disease, and for the suppression of the Gypsy and Brown Tail Moths in town in infected areas.

Finance Committee recommends \$100.00.

Article 32. To see if the town will instruct the Selectmen to replace the bridge across the so-called Downs brook, located on the way leading from the "Sand Crossing" to North Alfred, and if so to appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for this purpose.

Finance Committee recommends \$200.00.

Article 33. To see if the town will vote to ratify the actions of the Selectmen of Waterboro in negotiating for the sale and conveyance of certain real estate known as the Orrin C. Boothby place in South Waterboro to Arthur C. Frizzle and Ronald A. Frizzle by Warranty Deed, and to ratify the acts of the Selectmen made in behalf of the Inhabitants of the town of Waterboro in executing, signing, sealing, acknowledging, and delivering a certain Warranty Deed, dated September 17, 1947 and recorded in the Registry of Deeds for said County of York in Book 1109 at Page 275, of the said Orrin C. Boothby place, so-called, to



said Arthur C. Frizzle and Ronald A. Frizzle, and to further clarify the title to said property, to see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to execute a deed of Quit Claim of said property to said Arthur C. Frizzle and Ronald A. Frizzle in behalf of said town, and said Inhabitants, in further ratification thereof.

Article 34. To transact any further business that may lawfully come before said meeting.

The Selectmen hereby give public notice that for the purpose of correcting and making additions to the check list of voters, they will be in session at the town house at 9 o'clock on the 10th day of March, 1955.

And they give further notice that the polls for the election of Town Officers under Article 2 of this Warrant, will be opened fifteen minutes after the completion of business under all other articles of this Warrant, and remain open until 7 o'clock P. M. of said day.
