

COMMENTS

CASH

The General Fund Cash Balance, as noted in the Balance Sheet, was reconciled with the bank statement, and a written confirmation with the Depository Bank was made.

The Savings Account Balances of the Municipal Building Fund, Fire Engine Fund and Trust Funds were verified by written confirmation with the several Depository Banks.

Uncollected Taxes and Tax Liens unpaid at the time of audit were verified by written confirmation.

GENERAL

The procedure for keeping the municipal records of the Clerk. Treasurer, and Tax Collector was examined, found to be adequate, and in compliance with the General Laws of the State of Maine, as required of the several officers mentioned herein.

Although, the selectmen do not keep the town records by double entry bookkeeping methods, and do not have a general ledger, their distribution book allocating disbursements, was found to be in agreement with the total warrants drawn, and in good order.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

This audit was made as required by the State Department of Audit. Chapter 405, Section 26, of the General Laws of 1957.

Records were checked to determine the accuracy of recording cash transactions. The systems of internal control was reviewed as to the handling of cash and other matters of financial concern, and external correctness of recorded assets and liabilities.

Receipts and cancelled checks were examined for the year under audit. Vouchers were examined, for a selected period, Bond and Insurance coverages were examined. Excise tax collections for a selected period were verified with copies of the receipts retained by the Tax Collector.

Various laws relating to the administration of the financial affairs of the municipality were reviewed to determine that the financial transactions had been properly administered.

FIRE DEPARTMENT REPORT

To the citizens of the Town of Waterboro:

We submit our report for the year ending December 31, 1969.

The department responded to a total of 113 calls, broken down as follows:

Fire Calls	43
Out of town fire calls	4
Ambulance calls	42
Pump out cellars	15
Lost persons	1
Calls for blood	5
Pump out wells	3
Total calls	113

In order to keep abreast of modern fire fighting techniques, the men of the department attended a smoke mask school, under the direction of a state instructor from Kittery.

We also sent two men to Maine Medical Center to attend an ambulance driver and emergency personnel course. This training is very beneficial for the ambulance attendants, and also the townspeople. We are hoping for another course this spring.

The department bought necessary equipment needed to be recognized by the New England Insurance Rating Association. What we bought cost \$792.05, which we took out of our own department fund, gained by putting on suppers and our annual field day.

We are also, at this time, looking for a later model ambulance. We have an ambulance fund from which this will be purchased.

We also have been recognized by the New England Insurance Rating Association. The rates have been dropped from Grade "F" to Grade "E", as of Sept. 30, 1969. This is a three mile radius of the South Waterboro station. We are very pleased to announce this to the townspeople.

The department has been pleased again this year to sponsor the Boy Scouts and Cub Scouts.

I wish to thank the men of the department, the auxiliaries, and the citizens of the Town of Waterboro for their help and cooperation during the past year.

The health of the people is really the foundation upon which all their happiness and accomplishments depend. Health is not something that parents can present to their children as a lifelong gift.

In order to help people and the community as a whole to achieve and maintain optimal health, the Division of Public Health Nursing of the Department of Health and Welfare has provided the following services in the town of Waterboro during the past year.

Child Health Conferences were held during April, May and June with a total attendance of 9 infants and 34 preschool children. Only 3 from this group took advantage of the physical examination offered. The main purpose of the Child Health Conference is health supervision of the well child. The following immunizations were given:

Hearing tests were done in January on 29 pupils from grade 2 and teacher referrals. Following the custom of previous years I have again participated in preschool

registration to discuss the health history and immunization needs of each child and include this information on the school health record.

A major change in the program is the appointment of a full-time school nurse for the district. Since we are both working towards the same goal we will plan to work together and share information that will help to provide better health services for your community.

Home visits to individuals and families are still the closest link between the patient and the public health nurse. I have made as many visits as time would allow to meet specific health needs.

I would like to thank everyone who has contributed in any way towards my efforts for better health for the people of Waterboro.

Article 23. To see if the Town will grant and raise the sum of \$3,000.00 to be deposited in a bank, same to be known as Waterboro Building Fund for future use, and that this article appear in every Town Warrant until a sum sufficient has been established to build a municipal building when needed.

Finance Committee recommends: No recommendation.

Article 24. To see what sum of money the Town will grant and raise for the Waterboro Fire Department for the year ensuing.

Finance Committee recommends: Taxes \$5,295.00.

Article 25. To see if the Town will grant and raise \$1,000.00 to be used for a new Fire Engine Fund.

Finance Committee recommends: Taxes \$2,000.00.

Article 26. To see what sum of money the Town will grant and raise for pay interest charges on tax anticipation notes.

Finance Committee recommends: \$800.00 Surplus.

Article 27. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Collector of Taxes to charge interest at the rate of 1% per month on all 1970 unpaid taxes as of November 1, 1970, and to see if the Town will vote to continue the discount methods.

Finance Committee recommends: Ought to pass.

Article 28. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for street lights and beacons, including Town House Lights for the ensuing year.

Finance Committee recommends: Taxes \$2,200.00.

Article 29. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money to cover overdrafts that might be created in Winter Roads or Charity Accounts to be raised by taxation the following year.

Finance Committee recommends: Ought to pass.

Article 30. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise to pay the Towns share of Social Security and to pay the State Agency of the Town's share of the cost of Administration: \$100.00 of this amount is Bookkeeping Compensation to Treasurer.

Finance Committee recommends: Surplus \$400.00.

Article 31. To see what sum of money the Town will grant and raise to pay for Workmen's Compensation Insurance on Town Employees for 1970.

Finance Committee recommends: Surplus \$150.00.

Article 32. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell and dispose at public auction any by mature tax liens sales or sales by said public auction to be advertised in advance by posting notices in four Also it shall be printed 2 weeks in the Sanford Tribune Quit claim deeds signed by all three for such property. Be responsible for establishing boundary lines. The Tax

Collector shall submit a list of all Tax Title Properties to the Selectmen by the 1st of each year.

Finance Committee recommends: That the Selectmen be instructed to sell all Tax Title Property, at public auction, except those properties deemed best to hold for the overall benefit of the Town of Waterboro. It is also suggested that said auction be held the second Saturday of August.

Article 33. To see if the Town will enact the following Dump Ordinance: (1) Noperson, firm, corporation or other legal entity shall deposit, or cause or permit to be deposited, any waste matter in any structure or on any land within the Town of Waterboro. which waste matter originates, or is collected, or is in any way gathered or assembled from sources outside the Town of Waterboro. (2) Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit: (a) the transportation of waste matter into the Town of Waterboro for use as a raw material for the production of new commodities which do not constitute waste matter as defined in this ordinance: (b) The Municipal Officers of the Town of Waterboro from entering into a contract with any other municipality in the State of Maine for the use of any public dump which may presently exist or be hereafter so designated within the Town of Waterboro. (3) As used in this ordinance, waste matter shall mean all garbage, refuse, solid or liquid wastes, ashes, rubbish. industrial or commercial wastes and all other refuse of every type, nature and description, whether loose, in containers, compacted, baled, bundled or otherwise. (4) Whoever shall violate any provision of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not more then \$100.00 for each violation. Each day that such violation continues to exist shall constitute a separate offense. In addition, the Municipal Officers or the health Officer of the Town of Waterboro may file a complaint with any Justice of the Superior Court seeking to restrain and enioin the violations of the provisions of this ordinance.

Finance Committee recommends: Ought to pass.

Article 34. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to purchase land for new Municipal Offices, and if passed, to see what action they will take to construct the new offices.

Finance Committee recommends: The purchase of the land, and that a committee be appointed to assist the Selectmen in the plans and construction of a Town Office Building, on aforementioned property.

Article 35. To see if the Town will vote to enact a fine of not less then \$10.00, nor not more then \$20.00, to the Parking Ordinances passed at a Special Town Meeting held August 23, 1969.

Finance Committee recommends: Ought to pass.

Article 36. To see what action the Town will take in regards to having a Town Tax Map made.

Finance Committee recommends: Ought to pass, and that it should be financed by the revenue from the sale of Tax Title property held August 30, 1969. This money to be held in escrow for same.

Article 37. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to join the Maine Municipal Association Admission Fee to be paid from Incidental Account.

Finance Committee recommends: Ought to pass.

Article 38. To see if the Town will vote to allow all revenues from the Registration or Taxes, derived from snowmobiles, to be placed in a separate account, and be 67

expended by the road commissioner and Fire Chief, for maintenance of all fire roads.

Finance Committee recommends: Ought to pass.

Article 39. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 to be paid to the Maine Publicity Bureau to be expended and used for advertising the natural resources, advantages and attractions of the State of Maine in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 91, Section 108, of the revised Statutes of 1954.

Finance Committee recommends: No recommendations.

Article 40. To see if the Town will grant and raise \$200.00, to be paid to the Community Child and Family Guidance Association, to support its work on behalf of the municipalities now in said Association.

Finance Committee recommends: No recommendation.

Article 41. To transact any further business that may lawfully come before this meeting.

The Selectmen hereby give notice that for the purpose of correcting additions to the check list of voters, the Registrar, Harry A. Smith, will be in the office.

And they give further notice that the Polls for the election of Town Officers under Article 2 of the Warrant will be open fifteen minutes after the completion of business under all other articles of the Warrant and remain open until 7 o'clock of said day.

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
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
