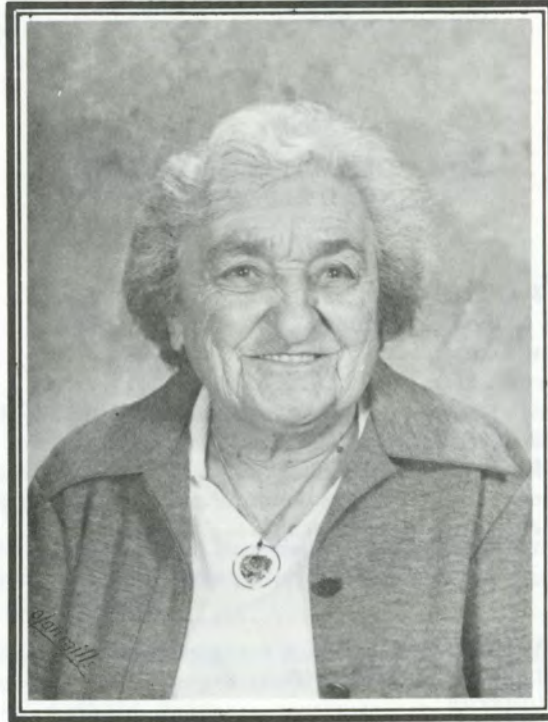

*Her laughter and sense of humor were a delight to all who knew Alice, and more than that, her door was always open to those in need of a friend, a meal, or comforting.*

*Howard was born on April 5, 1918 in Sanford, Maine. He was the son of Ralph and Edna B. Bennett. He graduated from Colt Memorial High School in Bristol, Rhode Island. ASSESSOR'S NOTICE**

The Assessors of the Town of Waterboro hereby give notice to all persons liable to taxation in said Town, that they will be in session at their offices in the Municipal Office Building in said Town, on the 4th day of April, at 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM for the purpose of receiving lists of the estates taxable in said Town.

All persons hereby notified to make and bring to said Assessor's true and perfect lists of all their estates real and personal, which they were possessed of, or which they held as guardian, executor, administrator, trustee, lessee/lessor, or otherwise, on the first day of April 1987, and be prepared to make oath to the truth of the same.

When estates of persons deceased have been divided during the past year or have changed hands from any cause, the executor, administrator, or other persons interested, and hereby warned to give notice of such change, and in default of such notice will be held under the law to pay the tax assessed although the such estate has been wholly distributed and paid over.

Any male or female veteran, or blind person, or widow or minor child of any veteran who desires to secure tax exemption under Chapter 399 of the 1955 Laws of Maine, shall on or before the first day of April 1987 give written notice of the Assessors of the City, Town or Plantation in which he or she resides, and furnish proof of entitlement.

## HAZARDOUS WASTE COMMISSION

The Hazardous Waste Commission was formed in 1986. The first meeting was held on April 22; members include: Kenneth Corthell, Raymond Dyer, Chairperson, Pamela L'Heureux, Secretary, Timothy Nelson, Robert Full.

The main concerns of the Commission during the year were hazardous waste activities at Southern Maine Finishing, Co., and the old Leather Mill Tannery in South Waterboro, also an illegal dump site in North Waterboro was investigated.

An inspection of the Leather Mill was investigated in July by the Commission; as a result several thousands of gallons of a hazardous degreasing fluid was found; it was reported; and later removed by a waste disposal contractor. A subsequent investigation by the Department of Environmental Protection at this site has indicated that the sub soil in the immediate plant area is contaminated with process organic chemicals which could endanger the ground water in the local area. This investigation is being continued.

In Augusta a permit application was forwarded to Southern Maine Finishing, Company; no completed permit application was received by the Commission. In October a permit application was received for Down West Motors, after review it was determined a permit was not necessary. Since the amount of waste stored was far below the minimum specification in the Ordinance. Even though a permit was not needed the owner was advised of proper handling and disposal procedures of the type of waste generated.

In November an illegal dump site in North Waterboro was investigated and it was determined the waste was not of a hazardous nature since it consisted mainly of building demolished materials. Subsequently a cleanup operation was mandated by the Town of Waterboro. A provision of the agreement was that a member of the Hazardous Waste Commission would be present at all times to supervise the operation.

The Commission has reviewed and recommended several changes in the Hazardous Waste Ordinance that would make it more effective for the protection of the health and welfare of the residents of the town.

## SACO RIVER CORRIDOR COMMISSION

The Saco River Corridor Commission administers the Saco River Corridor Act, which regulates land use within 500 to 1000 feet of the Saco, Ossipee, and Little Ossipee Rivers. The Commission is made up of representatives of the twenty communities bordering the three rivers, and each town within the corridor is represented by one regular and one alternate member appointed by the Selectmen or Mayor. The Commission meets once a month, generally on the fourth Wednesday, to consider applications for permits and to discuss other matters which relate to the Saco River Corridor region. Waterboro's regular Commission member is Tom Cole, and the alternate member is Clarence Woodsome, Jr.

One of the Commission's major functions is the consideration of permit applications for building construction or other activities requiring a permit. 1986 was an extremely busy year for the Commission, and during the past year (January 1 through December 31, 1986), the Commission considered a total of 93 applications for permits or variances. It also considered 36 amendments to permits previously granted and held 17 public hearings. Of the permit applications and amendments considered by the Commission this year, fifteen permits and nine amendments were for activities within the Town of Waterboro.

Any Waterboro residents interested in obtaining additional information about the Commission or about the effects of the Saco River Corridor Act on their land should feel free to call their representatives to the Commission or Margaret Roy, the Commission's Executive Director, who may be reached at the Commission office on Main Street in Cornish, Maine (Telephone 625-8123).

**REPORT OF THE WATERBORO FIRE DEPARTMENT**

In 1986 we put our new utility truck in service. It holds 100 gallons of water, has a generator, 4 telescoping flood lights, and 2 portable floodlights, along with other equipment, some of which came off the ambulance in order to lighten the load on that vehicle.

We also purchased a 2,000 gallon tank which we put on the tank truck at North Waterboro. We are in the process of getting this set up with a quick dump valve.

For the year we had 98 fire calls. They are broken down as follows: chimney fires - 8; structure fires - 14; smoke investigations - 9; auto accidents - 35; car fires - 2; power lines down - 2; animal rescue - 1; furnace problem - 2; brush fires - 12; kerosene spill - 1; woodstove problem - 1; lawnmower fire - 1; investigation of possible drowning - 1; trash fire - 1; boat fire - 1; rekindle - 1; dump fire - 1; mattress fire outside - 1; standby - 1; electrical problem - 2; grease fire - 1.

The animal rescue was successful and the possible drowning turned out to be negative.

We want to thank the people of Waterboro for their help and cooperation in 1986 and we look forward to working with you in 1987.

### **MOODY POND DEVELOPMENT MORATORIUM**

#### Section I: Findings and Purpose

As a consequence of groundwater contamination from various sources and materials including but not limited to heavy metals; petroleum products; and bacteria, the Town of Waterboro recognizes that many private water supplies within the Town have been contaminated and that more will be jeopardized in the future. Because of this crisis, the feasibility of creating a public water supply must be investigated. Moody Pond, a small undeveloped pond in the southern part of the Town, is a potential public water source. Extensive hydrogeological testing must be conducted before it can be determined whether or not Moody Pond is an appropriate public water source. Construction near the pond while that testing is taking place could jeopardize the eventual suitability of Moody Pond as a public water supply, in the event testing ultimately demonstrates its suitability.

Regulation of development around Moody Pond through municipal ordinance, or taking of the property by eminent domain, is contemplated if testing determines it to be a suitable water supply for the Town.

#### Section II

There shall be a six month moratorium on all development or construction of any kind, beginning on the date this ordinance is approved by affirmative vote of the Waterboro town meeting (March , 1987) and ending six months thereafter (September 1987), on land around and near Moody Pond, so-called, more specifically described as Tax Map 3, Lot 63A; Tax Map 6, Lot 41A; and Tax Map 7, Lot 8.

**ARTICLE 18:** Shall amendments to the Town's "Land Subdivision Regulations" be enacted to minimize the adverse effect of subdivision development on the Town's groundwater?

Amend Article III of the Town's "Land Subdivision Regulations" to add:

M. Will not, alone or in conjunction with existing activities, adversely affect the quality or quantity of groundwater.

Amend Article IV to add a definition of "Groundwater".

**Groundwater:** the water beneath the surface of the ground; the source of water in springs and wells.

26. A report prepared by a geologist registered in the State of Maine and qualified, by training and experience, to evaluate the impact which the proposed development, alone or in conjunction with existing activities, will have on the quality or quantity of groundwater. The report shall include an analysis of the groundwater impact predicted for the construction which is proposed; of the water supplies serving the development; and of any other aspects of the proposed development which may, either alone or in conjunction with existing activities, adversely affect the quality or quantity of groundwater in the area.

Amend Article VII §7.2.1 subsection 2 to read:

2. The name, registration number and seal of the land surveyor, architect, engineer or planning consultant; the soil scientist; and the geologist involved in its conception.

**An Ordinance Further Amending the Amended Hazardous Waste Ordinance**

Adopted \_\_\_\_\_, 1987.

The Town of Waterboro hereby Ordains:

**A. AMENDMENTS**

The ordinance entitled the " Amended Hazardous Waste Ordinance" of the Town of Waterboro, Maine as adopted and made effective by vote of the Town Meeting on March 8, 1986, is hereby further amended as follows:

**First**, at the end of Section II(A) (2), delete the period and add: "and further amended by vote of the Town Meeting on March \_\_\_\_\_, 1987." As amended, Section II(A) (2) shall read:

This ordinance shall be known as the "Amended Hazardous Waste Ordinance" of the Town of Waterboro, Maine, adopted and made effective by vote of the Town Meeting on March 8, 1986, and further amended by vote of the Town Meeting on March \_\_\_\_\_, 1987.

**Second**, in the first sentence of Section II(B) (2), insert the words "generate, process" after the words "site which will" and before the word "handle." As amended, Section II(B) (2) shall read:

No person shall construct, develop, establish, operate, own or maintain an industrial or commercial site which will generate, process, handle, store or dispose of hazardous waste without having first obtained a permit from the Hazardous Waste Commission. A permit or renewal permit shall be issued for a period of three (3) years from the date of issuance, unless suspended or revoked. Each permit or renewal permit shall be issued only for the site designated in the plans accompanying the application and shall not be transferable or assignable except with the written approval of the Hazardous Waste Commission.

**Third**, delete Section IV(A) in its entirety, and substitute the following:

All requirements of this Ordinance shall apply to any new facility or enlargement of an existing facility in or at which hazardous waste will be generated, stored, handled, processed or disposed. Proposals to construct a new facility or enlarge an existing facility shall be presented as a Site Plan of Development Application and reviewed under Sections IV, V, VI(A) and VI(B) of this Ordinance.

**Fourth**, delete Section IV(B) in its entirety and substitute the following:

Existing facilities in or at which hazardous wastes are generated, stored, handled, processed or disposed must comply with the requirements for triennial operations permits under Section VI(C) of this Ordinance.

**Fifth**, amend Section IV(C) by inserting after the word "Exemptions," the words "this Ordinance shall not apply to:" and by deleting subsection (3) in its entirety and renumbering subsection (4). As amended, Section IV(C) shall read:

C. Exemptions:

This Ordinance shall not apply to:

1. Agricultural waste: The storage and handling of products used for agricultural purposes on working farms or generated by farming activities.
2. Household waste: Products which are used for normal domestic housekeeping.
3. Retail gasoline stations, household heating fuels.

**Sixth**, amend Section VI(C) by inserting after the words "is to expire" the words "or, in the case of an existing facility for which no permit has been previously issued, within three (3) months after March \_\_\_\_\_, 1987" and by deleting the word "yearly" in the second sentence and substituting the word "triennial". As amended, Section VI(C) shall read as follows:

C. Triennial Renewal Permit Standards: A triennial operations permit application shall be submitted at least three (3) months before the current permit is to expire or, in the case of an existing facility for which no permit has previously been issued, within 3 months after March \_\_\_\_\_, 1987, to the Hazardous Waste Commission accompanied by a fee of \$50 for processing the application. The Hazardous Waste Commission shall grant a triennial operations permit contingent upon the findings that the following have been met:

1. Maintenance of a current operations plan;
2. An acceptable emergency exercise;
3. Test monitoring of wells and monitoring of air emissions when applicable;
4. An acceptable facility inspection by a registered engineer.

**Seventh**, amend Section VIII by adding a new subsection (A), as follows, and renumbering the following subsections accordingly. As amended, Section VIII shall read:

Section VIII - Violation, Enforcement and Fines

A. Right of Entry and Inspection: The Hazardous Waste Commission shall have the authority to enter any property at reasonable hours and to enter any building with the consent of the owner, occupant, or agent to inspect the premises and take samples or designate tests appropriate to determine compliance with any provision set forth in the Hazardous Waste Ordinance.

B. Suspension and Revocation of Permit:

1. The Code Enforcement Officer shall have the right to enter the property during reasonable hours upon presentation of credentials to perform duties imposed by this ordinance or to enter any building with the owner's consent.

2. Whenever the Code Enforcement Officer determines that a hazardous waste use, storage or disposal site is not being operated in conformance with any portion of this ordinance, he/she may cause to have issued a notice of violation indicating corrective action necessary to comply with this ordinance. Such notice may include an order to cease the operation of the site where violations of the permit constitute a threat to the public health, safety and welfare.

3. The Code Enforcement Officer is authorized to suspend or revoke a permit where he finds there has been a failure to comply with this ordinance.

C. Violation and Enforcement: The Selectmen or State Certified Code Enforcement Officer, upon a finding that any provision of this ordinance or the condition(s) of a permit issued under this ordinance is being violated, are authorized to institute legal proceedings to enjoin violations of this ordinance.

D. Fines: A person who violates the provisions of this ordinance or the condition(s) of a permit shall be guilty of a civil violation and on conviction shall be fined not less than \$100 nor more than \$2,500. each day such a violation continues, and shall also be liable for court cost and reasonable attorney fees incurred by the municipality.

Eighth, amend Section XI by adding the following new subsection (L):

L. "Generation of Hazardous Waste" means the act or process of producing hazardous waste.

#### B. REPUBLICATION

The Town Clerk of the Town of Waterboro is directed to republish the entire Amended Hazardous Waste Ordinance with the foregoing amendments incorporated therein.

Garland and shown as "COMMON OPEN SPACE" on said plan, a distance of one hundred thirty and 00/100 (130.0') feet to an iron rod set in the ground; (a tie line between the last mentioned iron rod and the iron rod at the point of beginning bears S 42° 31' E for a distance of fifty three and 60/100 (53.60') feet); thence continuing said course of S 36° 59' 10" W, by and along said Garland "COMMON OPEN SPACE" land, a distance of eight (8') feet more or less, to the Northeasterly side of said Westwinds Drive, on a curve to the left having a radius of six hundred seventy and 21/100 (670.21') feet, a distance of fifty four (54') feet, more or less, to said iron rod at the point of beginning.

**ARTICLE 56:** "To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to auction Town owned Lake Arrowhead Estates lots by sealed bid using the following categories and minimum prices:

- a. Abutting property owner - back lot - minimum bid \$500.00 - subject to non-buildable restriction.
- b. Abutting property owner - waterfront lot - minimum bid \$1,000.00 - subject to non-buildable restriction.
- c. Abutting property owner and non-abutters - minimum bid 60% of the Town's assessed valuation - not subject to non-buildable restriction.
- d. Non-abutters - lots unsuitable for residential structures - minimum bid 30% of the Town's assessed valuation - subject to non-buildable restriction.

In the event the Selectmen accept a bid for less than 60% of the Town's assessed valuation for a lot which is otherwise

suitable for the construction of a residential structure, then the bidder may have the non-buildable restriction removed by paying an additional sum so that the original bid amount in combination with such additional sum equal a minimum of 60% of the Town's assessed valuation (the Selectmen shall not accept less than 60% of the

In the event the Selectmen accept a bid for less than 60% of the Town's assessed valuation for a lot which is otherwise suitable for the construction of a residential structure, then the bidder may have the non-buildable restriction removed by paying an additional sum so that the original bid amount in combination with such additional sum equals a minimum of 60% of the Town's assessed valuation (the Selectmen shall not accept less than 60% and may require more than 60%). Whether a lot is suitable to be used for the construction of a residential structure shall be the sole responsibility of the bidder. All deeds resulting from accepted bids shall be Municipal Quit-claim deeds without Covenant and subject to all viable and enforceable restrictions on lots within the Lake Arrowhead Subdivision and subject to all right of way and easements of record. A non-refundable deposit of 10% must be paid by successful bidders to the Town within 10 days of notification of the acceptance of such bids and in the event of the failure of any bidder to pay such deposit or on his failure to pay the balance of the accepted bid price within the time as prescribed by the Selectmen, then the acceptance of the bid shall be deemed to have been automatically withdrawn and no cause of action shall accrue to the bidder as a result thereof."

## **WATERBORO FIRE DEPARTMENT RESCUE**

In the past year Waterboro Fire Department Rescue responded to 216 ambulance calls. This was done with a volunteer squad of twenty three attendants and four regular drivers. A total of 1,163 run hours and innumerable class hours were donated to the Town to make our Rescue a unit to take pride in. These people have responded to all types of calls and shown compassion, gentleness and knowledge in the handling of their patients.

At this time we have close to five hundred participating families in our annual Ambulance Insurance Program. Members of the Ambulance Insurance Program receive emergency ambulance transport for the immediate family members for \$15. a year. For those 62 and older the fee is \$10. Any non-participating patient is billed the regular transport fee. This program has proven to have many benefits. The patient is not faced with another bill when finances are already stressed. All supplies used on the ambulance are purchased from this account and the fund is continually growing to help defray the cost of a new ambulance. We thank the participating families for their support.

Aside from seeing and treating the townspeople on an emergency basis we also participate in community service programs. First aid classes for bus drivers, blood pressures taken at Old Home Days and at the Town Meeting, daily checks on many elderly in our community and acquainting our schoolchildren with the ambulance so they won't be afraid if we ever have to transport them, are just a few of the things done regularly. We would like to commend our Rescue personnel for their efforts this past year and thank them for continuing to serve Waterboro so well.

(The Conservation Commission also hopes for a full body of support from those in attendance, so that we, as a Town, can begin to take control of Waterboro's future, and that we will be able to insure a safe and prosperous community for all of us.)

The Conservation Commission has also continued its work on Ossipee Pines (located on Ossipee Pond) this past year. Unfortunately, as we are all aware, last Summer's weather made it very difficult to complete our plans. It is the intention of the Conservation Commission to have Ossipee Pines open to the residents of Waterboro by early Summer (1987). At that time the Park will have picnic tables, barbeque pits, and (hopefully) toilet facilities. The Conservation Commission is requesting funds to complete this project, and to make it suitable for public use; we urge you to vote for this item during Town Meeting.

The Waterboro Conservation Commission sees itself as a body of dedicated volunteers, who are active and viable resources to the Town of Waterboro. Unfortunately, as a volunteer commission, our members are few. Hopefully, during 1987, we may be able to interest other concerned citizens in the community to join us in our endeavors. New members are always welcome! At present, we meet at Town Hall, on the third Tuesday of the month at seven o'clock in the evening (just prior to the monthly council meetings).

Finally, I want to thank everyone for attending this Town Meeting, one that not only celebrates the Bicentennial

of the Town of Waterboro, but also the Bicentennial of the United States Constitution, the document that allows us to meet here today and vote to determine our future.

#### **PLANNING BOARD**

During the calendar year 1986, the Waterboro Planning Board held twenty regularly scheduled meetings, plus attending numerous other meetings held by other agencies of the Town Structure. Nine plus on-site inspections of Building and Sub-Division activities were made by various members of the Board. Three Sub-Divisions were processed and approved during the period. Records reveal the Board had Ninety Nine actions on various building permits and other items requiring review by the Planning Board. One Seminar to provide legal assistance was conducted by the Town Legal Counsel.

Assistance was provided to the Waterboro Fire Department in identifying locations of Sub-Divisions and probable areas of future growth in the Town.

Three new appointments were made to the Board, one of these, Douglas Foglio, a former long time member of this Board, has been a valuable addition capable of providing historical background and experience to aid in many decisions required of the Board. Two members resigned during the year.

Recourse to the Town Legal Counsel has been extremely intensive due to increasing demands caused by more complex laws requiring added actions for their implementation. In the coming year up-dating of the Comprehensive Plan, Zoning Ordinance and Land Sub-Division Regulations will be necessary.

The Planning Board wishes to express its appreciation to all the elected officials, Town Employees and the Public for their patience and assistance during the past year.

NOTE A - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The Town of Waterboro, Maine operates without a charter under a Selectman - Town Meeting form of government. The town was incorporated on March 6, 1787. The town provides the following services: general administrative, public safety, health and sanitation, highways and bridges, general assistance, education and parks and recreation.

The Town's financial report includes all of the Town's operations.

The accounting policies of the Town conform to generally accepted accounting principles, except the Town does not record its general fixed assets. The following is a summary of the significant accounting principles of the Town:

Principles Determining Scope of Reporting Entity

The financial statements of the Town consist only of the funds and account groups of the Town. The Town has no oversight responsibility for any other governmental entity since no other entities are considered to be controlled by or dependent on the Town. Control or dependence is determined on the basis of budget adoption, taxing authority, funding, and appointment of the respective governing board.

Fund Accounting

The accounts of the Town are organized on the basis of funds and account groups, each of which is considered a separate accounting entity. The operations of each fund are accounted for with a separate set of self-balancing accounts that comprise its assets, liabilities, fund equity, revenues, and expenditures, or expenses, as appropriate. Government resources are allocated to and accounted for in individual funds based upon the purposes for which they are to be spent and the means by which spending activities are controlled. The various funds are grouped, in the financial statements in this report, into generic fund types and broad fund categories including the following governmental fund:

General Fund - The General Fund is the general operating fund of the Town. It is used to account for all financial resources except those required to be accounted for in another fund.

Basis of Accounting

Basis of accounting refers to when revenues and expenditures or expenses are recognized in the accounts and reported in the financial statements. Basis of accounting relates to the timing of the measurements made, regardless of the measurement focus applied.

All governmental funds are accounted for using the modified accrual basis of accounting. Their revenues are recognized when they become measurable and available as net current assets. Property Taxes are recorded as revenue when levied even though a portion of the taxes may be controlled in subsequent years. Penalties and interest and Miscellaneous Revenue are recorded when received in cash because they are generally not measurable until actually received. Intergovernmental Revenue and Interest Income are accrued when their receipt occurs soon enough after the end of the accounting period so as to be both measurable and available.

Expenditures are generally recognized under the modified accrual basis of accounting when the related fund liability is incurred.

Budgets and Budgetary Accounting

The Town follows these procedures in establishing the budgetary data reflected in the financial statements:

- (1) The various town departments submit budget requests to the town finance committee.
- (2) The finance committee receives the requests and makes recommendations for budget expenditures and budget revenue to the town's people at the annual town meeting in March.
- (3) At the meeting, the town's people vote on each recommended departmental budget expenditure and revenue item.
- (4) Once the elements of the budget are approved, the town's treasurer reports a monthly revenue and expenditure report to the selectman.
- (5) Appropriations lapse at the end of each fiscal year.
- (6) The finance committee may, through the selectman, call a special town meeting during the year to recommend additional expenditures, which must be voted on and approved by the town peoples' vote.

Investments

Investments are stated at cost or amortized cost, which approximates market.

Restricted Assets

These assets consist of short-term investments restricted for new municipal buildings.

Revenue Recognition - Property Taxes

Taxes are levied on October 1 and are due and payable in thirty days. All unpaid taxes levied October 1 become delinquent December 31 of the current year.

Comparative Data

Comparative data for the prior year have been presented in the accompanying financial statements in order to provide an understanding of changes in the Town's financial position and operations.

Total Columns on Combined Statements - Overview

Total columns on the Combined Statements - Overview are captioned Memorandum Only to indicate that they are presented only to facilitate financial analysis. Data in these columns do not present financial position, results of operations, or changes in financial position in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles. Neither is such data comparable to a consolidation. Interfund eliminations have not been made in the aggregation of this data.

NOTE B - DJE FROM OTHER FUNDS

Amount due from other funds consists of \$481.20 due from the Cemetery Fund.

NOTE C - LITIGATION

Various claims and lawsuits are pending against the Town. In the opinion of the Town attorney, the potential loss on all claims will not be significant to the Town's financial statements.

The intergovernmental revenues other than Federal and State Revenue Sharing include \$22,195.36 from Maine for local road assistance and \$3,023.51 from other small Maine programs.
