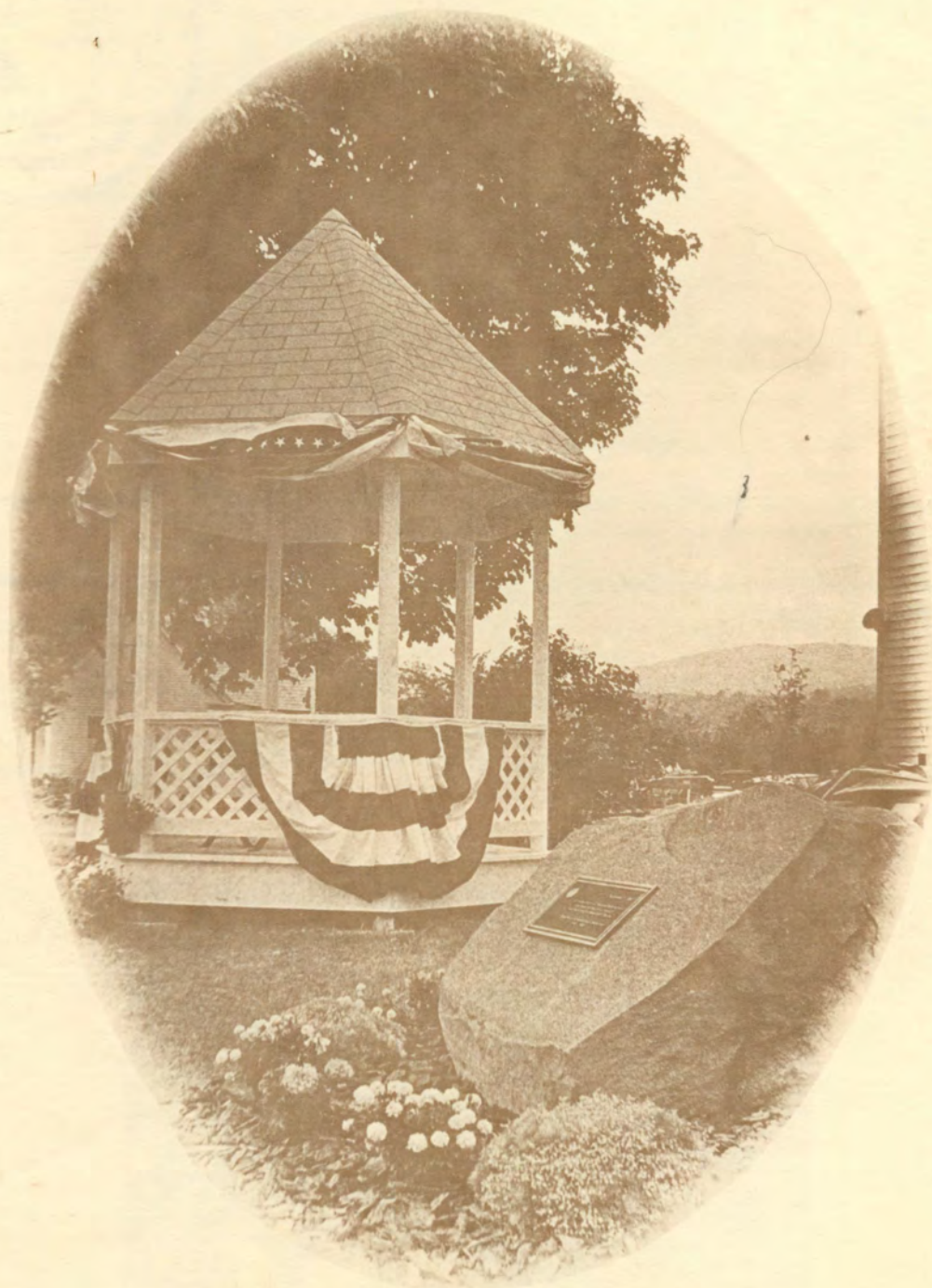

It is the hope of the committee that the feeling of community pride and involvement that was evident the past year will continue for the next 200 years.

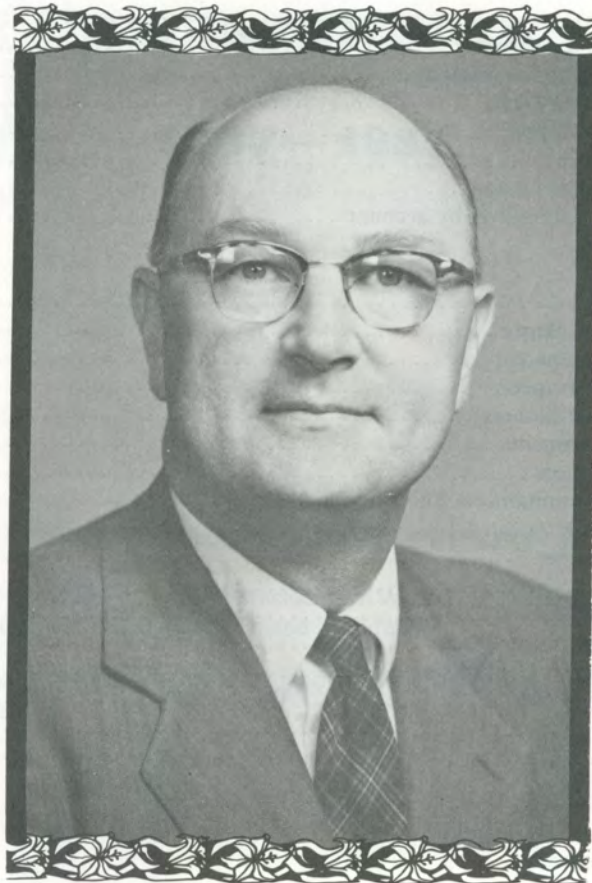

ASSESSOR'S NOTICE**

The Assessors of the Town of Waterboro hereby give notice to all persons liable to taxation in said Town, that they will be in session at their offices in the Municipal Office Building in said Town, on the 2nd day of April, at 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM for the purpose of receiving lists of the estates taxable in said Town.

All persons hereby notified to make and bring to said Assessor's true and perfect lists of all their estates real and personal, which they were possessed of, or which they held as guardian, executor, administrator, trustee, lessee/lessor, or otherwise, on the first day of April 1988, and be prepared to make oath to the truth of the same.

When estates of persons deceased have been divided during the past year or have changed hands from any cause, the executor, administrator, or other persons interested, and hereby warned to give notice of such change, and in default of such notice will be held under the law to pay the tax assessed although the such estate has been wholly distributed and paid over.

Any male or female veteran, or blind person, or widow or minor child of any veteran who desires to secure tax exemption under Chapter 399 of the 1955 Laws of Maine, shall on or before the first day of April 1988 give written notice of the Assessors of the City, Town or Plantation in which he or she resides, and furnish proof of entitlement.

## ANNUAL REPORT HAZARDOUS WASTE COMMISSION

The Hazardous Waste Commission held meetings on a monthly basis in 1987; members are G. Bates, K. Corthell, R. Dyer (chairman), P.L., Heureux (secretary), and T. Nelson.

The main concerns of the Commission during the year were pollution problems at the Southern Maine Finishing Co., and at the old Leather Mill/Tannery in South Waterboro; also efforts were continued to expedite the removal of illegally dumped material from the North Waterboro Scrambles Track site.

With regards to the So. Maine Finishing Co. problem the long awaited pollution cleanup should be forthcoming since the D.E.P. in Nov. of 1987 designated the site as an "uncontrolled hazardous substance site". This designation empowers the State to proceed with necessary cleanup and recovery of costs.

At the old Leather Mill work was continued by the D.E.P. and the Town to determine the nature and extent of the underground plume of organic pollutants. The Commission assisted with the premise inspections and in technical discussions of data.

At the No. Waterboro illegal dumpsite efforts were continued to expedite the removal of the waste. Early in the year all of the hauled in material (hundreds of yards) was excavated from the deposit site in the ravine to higher ground thus minimizing the potential of ground water contamination. Efforts are still being strongly directed to the complete removal of the waste from the premises.

In addition to the above, meetings were held with Officers of the Beeston Co. regarding the setup of a small business in the Town for packaging of silicone grease; a review of the chemical materials used in processing was made by the Commission and it was advised that a specific degreasing fluid should not be stored on the premises; the Company complied and removed the material.

At the 1987 Town Meeting eight amendments to Hazardous Waste ordinance were voted in thus making it much more effective for the protection of the health and welfare of the residents without creating undo problems to local businesses. Copies of the ordinance were distributed to all industries in the town and discussions were held with several businesses regarding compliance.

Early in the year on the advice of the commission a tank was placed at the town dump for the deposition of waste oil by residents since this material is a serious threat to ground water. There are several problems which are of concern for 1988. Some of them are: collection and disposal of household hazardous materials; removal of unearthed underground storage tanks from the Town to a licensed landfill.

I drove most of the Town roads, and studied the Town's soil, vegetation, and topographic maps. I also reviewed the Zoning Ordinance, Subdivision Regulations, and the Comprehensive Plan. To learn more about the history of Waterboro, I've researched the Town files, Planning Board records, local newspaper's and talked to members of the community.

Both the Selectmen and I have been assisting the Department of Environmental Protection, who are presently evaluating the groundwater problems of South and East Waterboro. I am working closely with Ed Bradley, the Town's Consulting Geologist, and Carol White & Associates, the firm performing a Hydrogeologic Study of the Town.

I am working with the Planning Board in a number of areas. Researching new projects as well as old cases, performing subdivision review, site plan review, and evaluating the present Zoning and Subdivision review, Site Plan review, and evaluating the present Zoning and Subdivision Regulations. These are a few ways in which I'm working to relieve the Planning Board's work load. I also work with developers and individuals who do not understand the Zoning or Subdivision Ordinances. I help them prepare for the Planning Board meetings to insure smooth proceedings.

I am here to help anyone with problems or questions with the Town Zoning or Subdivision regulations, so please feel free to stop in at the Town Office or call.

**WATERBORO FIRE DEPT. RESCUE  
ANNUAL REPORT**

The Waterboro Fire Department Rescue responded to 234 ambulance calls in 1987. At this time our volunteer squad consists of thirty attendants and four regular drivers. We are proud of our attendants and the levels they have achieved in state licensing, patient care and community participation. The Fire Department dispatcher and the firemen are also vital to the performance of our crew.

The Waterboro Rescue team has been involved in more than responding to ambulance calls. We have five of our people who are certified CPR instructors and three who are licensed to teach Advanced First Aid classes. This enables us to maintain our yearly CPR recertification and run Advanced First Aid classes for the community. Upon the completion of the AFA class a student is eligible to take the state licensing exam. We have generated nine new Licensed Ambulance Attendants through these classes this year. We have also provided CPR training for our firemen. These instructors are truly an asset to our squad and to the community.

We have personnel on the state Test Team. These people help to maintain a standard of testing throughout the state by attending training sessions and testing new personnel in a consistent and fair manner. This enables us to monitor the quality of the attendants being licensed throughout our region and maintaining a level of excellence for all attendants to achieve.

In 1987 a Critical Incident Stress Debriefing team was formed in Southern Maine. One of our attendants was selected to work on this team. The purpose of this team is to accelerate emotional recovery by normal people who are having normal reactions to abnormal events. The CISD team in Southern Maine has gained national recognition because it is one of the first teams formed in the United States. Many other states are looking to Maine to see how successful the team is in helping ambulance, fire, and police personnel deal with the emotions a crisis generates and how to facilitate a team of their own.

For our community, we have given the bus drivers of SAD 57 first aid classes again this year. We attend football games at the high school and take blood pressures at various functions throughout the year. As 1987 was our Bicentennial year the ambulance designed a float for the parade that won a first place trophy. We also put on a Bicentennial dance on Labor Day weekend that was a great success. We'd like to thank all the people who danced the night away — hoping that you had as much fun as we did.

Our annual Walkathon-Road Race, one of our major fund raising events was well attended. We hope to see everyone participate again this year. Applications are still available to townspeople if they are needed.

For the first time this year the Rescue and Fire Department collected enough food from their members, local stores and collection cans around town to provide three large Thanksgiving baskets to families in need. We also put together two Christmas food baskets and had a Christmas family that we were able to buy gifts for. This was a very rewarding project. We appreciate all the support from the town and our own Fire Department members that made this such a successful undertaking. Everyone's generosity was overwhelming.

This has been a very good year for Waterboro Fire Department Rescue. We've worked hard and are proud of our accomplishments. We'd like to thank the people in the Town of Waterboro for their continued support.

## PLANNING BOARD ANNUAL REPORT

During the calendar year 1987, The Waterboro Planning Board held twenty-one regularly scheduled meetings, three workshops, three Special Meetings, and four Public Hearings. Eleven on-site inspections of Building and Sub-Division activities were made by various members of the Board. Fifteen Sub-Divisions were brought before the Board with two being approved during the period. Records reveal that the Board had sixty-two actions on various building permits and other items requiring review by the Planning Board.

A Town Planner was hired by the Town and has been assisting the Planning Board since June.

Recourse to the Town Legal Counsel has been extremely intensive due to increasing demands caused by more complex laws requiring added actions for their implementation.

The Planning Board wishes to express its appreciation to all the elected officials, Town Employees and the Public for their patience and assistance during the past year.

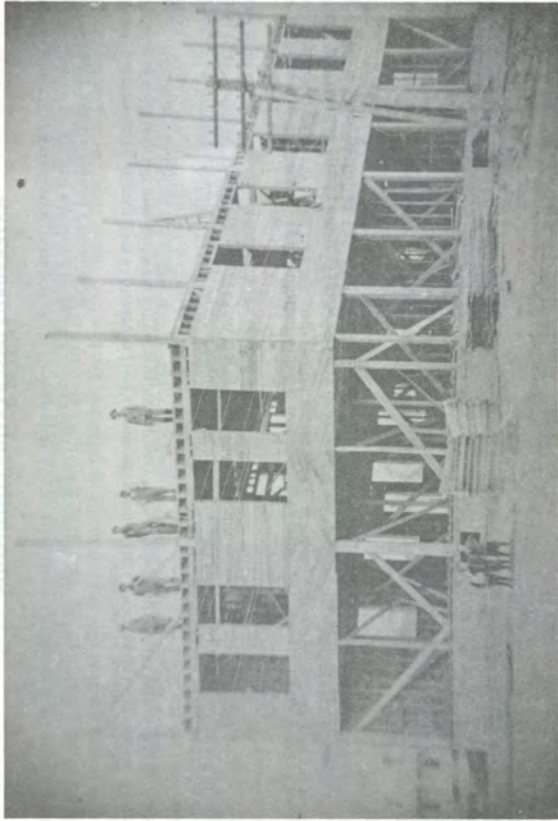

**ARTICLE 44:** To see if the Town will vote to amend Article 10, Section 10.03 of the Waterboro Zoning Ordinance by adding the following:

The Appellant or their Agent shall be present at his or her hearings pertaining to their Administrative Appeal or Variance Request. Failing to be present can be a reason for denial of Administrative Appeal or Variance Request.

**ARTICLE 45:** To see if the Town will vote to amend Article 12 Section 12.01 of the Waterboro Zoning Ordinance.

Building permit: the fee shall not be less than \$25.00 in any case except that there shall be no fee if estimated cost does not exceed \$500.00- (see section 2.03)-otherwise \$2.00 per One Thousand Dollars of estimated cost.

NOTE: Said Section now reads:

\$2.00 per one thousand dollars of estimated cost up to \$50,000  
plus  
\$1.00 per thousand dollars estimated cost between \$50,000. and \$100,000. plus \$0.50 per thousand dollars of estimated cost over \$100,000. The fee shall not be less than \$25.00 in any case except that there shall be no fee if the estimated cost does not exceed five hundred dollars (\$500.) (see section 2.03)

**ARTICLE 46:** To see if the Town will vote to amend Article 2, Section 2.03 of the Waterboro Zoning Ordinance by adding

the following as a second paragraph to the existing Section 2.03.

Plans and permits: A swimming pool or appurtenances thereto shall not be constructed, installed, enlarged or altered until plans have been submitted and a permit has been obtained from the Code Enforcement Officer. The approval of all city, county and state authorities having jurisdiction over swimming pools shall be obtained before applying to the Code Enforcement Officer for a permit. Certified copies of these approvals shall be filed as part of the supporting data for the application for the permit. All construction of pools to conform with BOCA Code, Swimming pools Section 616.0.

**ARTICLE 47:** To see if the Town will vote to amend Article 2, Section 2.08 of the Waterboro Zoning Ordinance by adding the following paragraph to the existing Section 2.08.

Lots created before the enactment of the Waterboro Zoning Ordinance that are substandard are required to have a "Class D" survey performed, or present evidence to show the true boundary lines, (i.e. a plot plan prepared by a certified surveyor), before a building permit can be issued.

**ARTICLE 48:** To see if the Town will vote to amend Section 10.05 first paragraph of the Waterboro Zoning Ordinance to read:

All Board meetings at which appeals or requests for variances are heard, considered and decided are public hearings (see Section 13.07). Notice of a public hearing shall be given at least seven (7) days prior to the hearing date by general advertisement to the public.

At least ten (10) days prior to the date set for the Zoning Board of Appeal's hearing on an appeal or a variance application the Zoning Board of Appeals shall cause written notice, by certified mail, of that hearing to (a) all property owners of record whose land abuts the property lines of the property and the property directly across private way, Town, State, or County Roads for which the variance is requested; (b) the person making the appeal; (c) the Planning Board; (d) the Code Enforcement Officer and (e) any other parties of record to the proceedings. The owners of property shall be considered to be those shown on the tax lists of the Town. Failure of any abutting property owner to receive notice shall not necessitate another hearing or invalidate the action of the Board.

The mailed and published notices shall include the following information:

- (1) The name of the applicant;
- (2) A brief description of the property involved;
- (3) A brief statement of the nature and extent of the variance requested;
- (4) The time and place of the Board's hearing on the variance.

**NOTE:** Said Section now reads:

All Board meetings at which appeals or requests for variances are heard, considered and decided are public hearings (see Section 13.07). Notice of a public hearing, which must include an agenda and the time and place of the hearing, shall be given

at least seven (7) days prior to the hearing date by general advertisement to the public and by mail to the following individuals each of whom shall be deemed a party to an appeal or a variance request proceeding, the person appealing and/or applicants whose variance requests are on the agenda, the Code Enforcement officer and members of the Planning Board. In addition to the parties listed above any member of the public present at the hearing who is recognized by the Chairman and participates by offering testimony in an appeal or variance request proceeding shall be deemed a party to that proceeding.

**ARTICLE 49:** To see if the Town will vote to amend Article VI s26 of Land Subdivision Regulations by adding the following to the existing Article.

26.A a hydrogeologic impact study prepared by a State of Maine Certified Geologist or a Registered Professional Engineer with experience in hydrogeology shall be provided for all subdivisions utilizing on-site septic disposal systems. This study shall contain, at a minimum, the following components:

A. 1. A map showing the soil types using the Unified Soil Classification System (USCS).

2. Groundwater levels and flow rates through the site, and the aquifer type should be determined.

3. An analysis of surface drainage conditions and their relationship to off site conditions.

4. Data on existing groundwater quality for the site should be provided. Collection of this data can either be provided by test wells within the proposed subdivision or by existing wells on abutting properties, provided that the data collected from those wells would represent the groundwater on the site.

5. A calculation of average nitrate nitrogen levels on-site after development and a calculation of nitrate nitrogen levels at the down gradient property line(s). These calculations should be done under normal rainfall and draught conditions.

6. A map showing the recommended sites for the individual subsurface waste water disposal systems and wells in the subdivision.

B. No development shall increase nitrate nitrogen concentrations at the property line of the development in excess of the primary drinking water standard. (Currently 10 mg/ l)

C. If groundwater contains contaminants in excess of the primary drinking water standards, and the subdivision is to be served by on-site groundwater supplies, the applicant shall demonstrate how water quality will be improved or treated.

D. Subsurface waste water disposal systems and drinking water wells shall be constructed in the locations shown on the map submitted with the assessment. Construction standards for drinking water wells and subsurface waste water disposal systems shall be included as a note on the final plan, and as restrictions in the deeds for the effected lots.

**ARTICLE 50:** To see if the Town will vote to authorize the municipal officers to spend an amount not to exceed 3/12 of the budgeted amount in each budget category of the 1989 annual budget during the period from January 1, 1989 to the 1989 annual Town Meeting.

Finance Committee recommends:

Ought to pass.

**ARTICLE 51:** To see if the Town will authorize the Collector of Taxes to charge **interest** at the rate of 11% per year on all unpaid taxes remaining unpaid on the 31st day after the date of mailing, and to see if the Town will vote to continue the **discount** of 2½% if paid within 30 days of the date mailed.

Finance Committee recommends:

Ought to pass.

**ARTICLE 52:** To see if the Town will vote to set the rate of **interest at 8% on abated property taxes** due to over valuation. As per Chapter 333 of the M.R.S.A.

Finance Committee recommends:

Ought to pass.

**ARTICLE 53:** To see if the Town will accept to plow and or maintain West Shore Road to the Dennis LaCroix residence.

Finance Committee recommends:

Ought not to pass.

**ARTICLE 54:** To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to sell lots in Lake Arrowhead Estates that have been

deeded and accepted by Town Meeting Approval as gifts.

Finance Committee recommends:  
Ought not to pass.

**ARTICLE 55:** To see if the Town will authorize the sale of Map 45 Lot 1374 of Lake Arrowhead Estates to Lake Arrowhead Community, Inc. for the amount of \$2,000.

Finance Committee recommends:  
Ought not to pass.

**ARTICLE 56:** To see if the Town will accept to plow and sand Hanscom Extension to the Dorothy Dugas residence, about 1/8th of a mile.

Finance Committee recommends:  
Ought not to pass.

**ARTICLE 57:** To see if the Town will vote to accept a 5.45 acre portion of land from Map 5 Lot 21 as a gift.

Finance Committee recommends:  
Ought to pass.

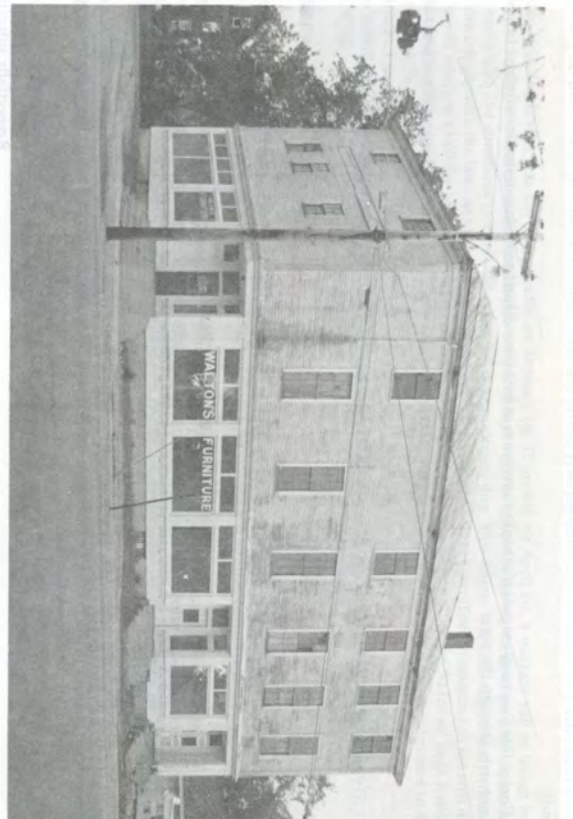
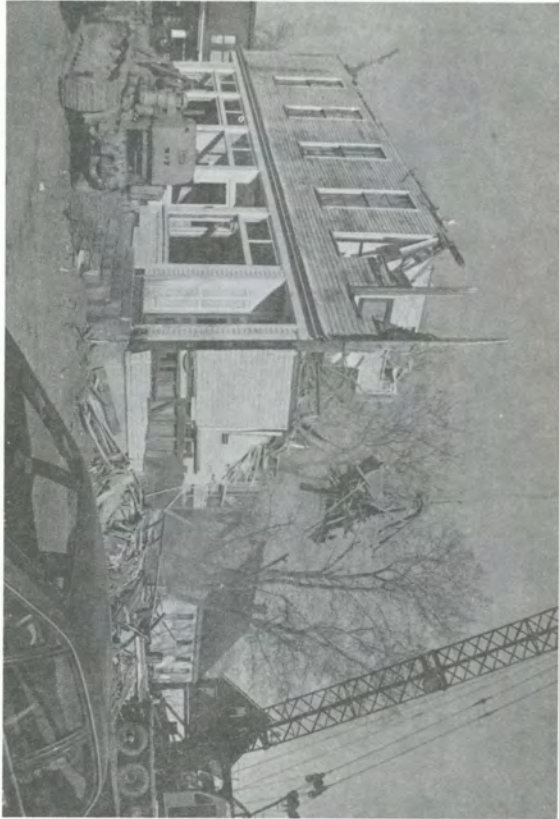

## NOTICE TO DOG OWNERS

Your 1988 dog license was due and payable on January 1st. If unpaid on April 1st, a warrant will be issued by the Selectmen to one or more constables or sheriffs or the animal control officer directing them to proceed forthwith to enter complaint and summons to court the owner of any unlicensed dog. This officer will first call on you demanding that you comply with the law. At this time you will be liable for a fee of \$4.00 to the officer in addition to the cost of the dog license which is \$3.00 for Neutered Males and Spayed Females 6 months old or older, \$6.50 for all dogs 6 months old or older capable of producing young. Failure on your part to comply will mean that you will be summoned to court and be liable for a fine of up to \$25.00.

Revised Statutes 1964 Title 7 as amended by Public Laws of 1965, 1967, 1969, 1971, 1973, 1974, 1975, 1976, 1977, 1978, 1979, 1982.

To the Citizens of Waterboro:

We are going to enforce the Dog License Law (Title 7, Chapter 713, Section 3702 of the Maine State Law) in Waterboro. The owners or keepers of any dog in Waterboro must get a license from the Town Clerk before April 1st.

On April 1st, we will issue a Dog License Warrant. The warrant enables the enforcement officers to legally call on the owners or keepers of unlicensed dogs. After we issue the warrant, the owners or keepers of unlicensed dogs must obtain a dog license from the Town Clerk within seven days and pay to the Town Clerk \$4.00 constable fee in addition to the regular dog license fee.

If a dog license is not obtained within seven days of the warning, the officers holding the warrant will proceed to summons to court the owner or keeper of the unlicensed dog.

So, you're getting fair warning, get a dog license for your dog.

Basis of Accounting

Basis of accounting refers to when revenues and expenditures or expenses are recognized in the accounts and reported in the financial statements. Basis of accounting relates to the timing of the measurements made, regardless of the measurement focus applied.

All governmental funds are accounted for using the modified accrual basis of accounting. Their revenues are recognized when they become measurable and available as net current assets. Property Taxes are recorded as revenue when levied even though a portion of the taxes may be controlled in subsequent years. Penalties and interest and Miscellaneous Revenue are recorded when received in cash because they are generally not measurable until actually received. Intergovernmental Revenue and Interest Income are accrued when their receipt occurs soon enough after the end of the accounting period so as to be both measurable and available.

Expenditures are generally recognized under the modified accrual basis of accounting when the related fund liability is incurred.

Budgets and Budgetary Accounting

The Town follows these procedures in establishing the budgetary data reflected in the financial statements:

- (1) The various town departments submit budget requests to the town finance committee.
- (2) The finance committee receives the requests and makes recommendations for budget expenditures and budget revenue to the town's people at the annual town meeting in March.
- (3) At the meeting, the town's people vote on each recommended departmental budget expenditure and revenue item.
- (4) Once the elements of the budget are approved, the town's treasurer reports a monthly revenue and expenditure report to the selectman.
- (5) Appropriations lapse at the end of each fiscal year.
- (6) The finance committee may, through the selectman, call a special town meeting during the year to recommend additional expenditures, which must be voted on and approved by the town peoples' vote.

NOTE A - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The Town of Waterboro, Maine operates without a charter under a Selectman - Town Meeting form of government. The town was incorporated on March 6, 1787. The town provides the following services: general administrative, public safety, health and sanitation, highways and bridges, general assistance, education and parks and recreation.

The Town's financial report includes all of the Town's operations.

The accounting policies of the Town conform to generally accepted accounting principles, except the Town does not record its general fixed assets. The following is a summary of the significant accounting principles of the Town:

Principles Determining Scope of Reporting Entity

The financial statements of the Town consist only of the funds and account groups of the Town. The Town has no oversight responsibility for any other governmental entity since no other entities are considered to be controlled by or dependent on the Town. Control or dependence is determined on the basis of budget adoption, taxing authority, funding, and appointment of the respective governing board.

Fund Accounting

The accounts of the Town are organized on the basis of funds and account groups, each of which is considered a separate accounting entity. The operations of each fund are accounted for with a separate set of self-balancing accounts that comprise its assets, liabilities, fund equity, revenues, and expenditures, or expenses, as appropriate. Government resources are allocated to and accounted for in individual funds based upon the purposes for which they are to be spent and the means by which spending activities are controlled. The various funds are grouped, in the financial statements in this report, into generic fund types and broad fund categories including the following governmental fund:

General Fund - The General Fund is the general operating fund of the Town. It is used to account for all financial resources except those required to be accounted for in another fund.

Investments

Investments are stated at cost or amortized cost, which approximates market.

Restricted Assets

These assets consist of short-term investments restricted for new municipal buildings.

Revenue Recognition - Property Taxes

Taxes are levied on October 1 and are due and payable in thirty days. All unpaid taxes levied October 1 become delinquent December 31 of the current year.

Comparative Data

Comparative data for the prior year have been presented in the accompanying financial statements in order to provide an understanding of changes in the Town's financial position and operations.

Total Columns on Combined Statements - Overview

Total columns on the Combined Statements - Overview are captioned Memorandum Only to indicate that they are presented only to facilitate financial analysis. Data in these columns do not present financial position, results of operations, or changes in financial position in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles. Neither is such data comparable to a consolidation. Interfund eliminations have not been made in the aggregation of this data.

NOTE B - DUE FROM OTHER FUNDS

Amount due from other funds consists of \$1,457.10 due from the Cemetery Fund and \$201.61 due from the Federal Revenue Sharing Fund.

NOTE C - LITIGATION

Various claims and lawsuits are pending against the Town. In the opinion of the Town attorney, the potential loss on all claims will not be significant to the Town's financial statements.

NOTE D - INTERGOVERNMENTAL REVENUES

The intergovernmental revenues other than Federal and State Revenue Sharing include \$29,301.00 from Maine for local road assistance, \$31,547.85 from Maine for educational block grant and \$1,137.01 from other small Maine programs.
