

ANNUAL REPORT A Message from Senator James D. Libby

118th Legislature

To the Residents of Waterboro:

It is my sincere privilege to serve as your State Senator in the 118th Maine State Legislature. I look forward to working with you during the second term covering the calendar year 1998. Having served previously in the 116th and 117th sessions of the Maine Legislature in the House of Representatives, I stand ready to respond quickly should you need assistance in dealing with the complexities of our agency structure of government.

In 1997, the State of Maine focused its efforts on paying some of the mandates which it requires of town and county governments. For example, the State is now meeting its funding obligations in county corrections and in the tree growth program for the first time in several years. We fell short, however, on the statutory requirement for state aid to education.

In the coming session, it is my hope that we revisit education funding as well as make a better effort to lower overall taxation of Maine citizens. Over my objections, the Legislature repealed an income tax reduction which I had helped to implement in the 117th Legislature. As a result, we now have close to \$140 million dollars in overcollected taxes. This money will be available in 1998 to reduce our tax burden and to properly fund some important programs, including education.

For the coming term, I have been appointed to serve on the Joint Standing Committee on State and Local Government and on a task force examining issues of children with special needs. In order for me to effectively represent your concerns on these and other policy issues, we will need to communicate often. Please don't hesitate to call my home at 929-4294. FOR YOUR INFORMATION

Vehicle Registrations:

New registrations, as well as re-registrations, can be done at Town Hall without having to go to the Department of Motor Vehicle. To register a vehicle you must have the vehicle identification number, year, model, make, color, optional equipment, current mileage and insurance card. With a new registration you will also need from a dealer the Dealer's Certificate and Application for Title, or from a private sale (from another individual) a Title and Bill of Sale.

Birth Certificates may be obtained from:

- 1. The city or town in which the child was born.
- 2. The city or town in which the mother was living at the time of the birth.
- 3. The State Department of Vital Statistics located in Augusta, Maine.

The fee for a Birth Certificate at the Town Clerk's Office is \$7.00 for the first copy and \$3.00 for each additional copy purchased at the same time.

Marriage and Death Certificates:

The Town Clerk's Office may issue copies of Marriage and Death certificates that are filed in that town

The fee is \$7.00 for the first copy & \$3.00 for each additional copy purchased at the same time.

Marriage Licenses:

A Marriage License may be obtained from the office of the Town Clerk, for a fee of \$10.00 per resident. For persons previously married, a certificate must be presented indicating the dissolution of the former marriage. The application for a Marriage License must remain on file for three business days after the application has been filed, and is valid for 90 days from the date of issuance.

Dog Licenses:

To license a dog, a current State of Maine Rabies Certificate must be presented along with a spaying certificate for females and a neutering certificate for neutered males. The fee for unaltered dogs, male or female, is \$7.50 and \$4.00 for altered animals. All dogs six months or older must be licenses each year, and are due on January 1st. A \$3.00 late fee will be applied to all dog licenses after January 31st.

▲Report of the BOARD OF SELECTMEN

As we approach yet another town meeting (they seem to come much faster these years) we again would like to extend our thanks and appreciation to all of you that have participated in one form or another over the past year. It's the people that get involved in this community that really make this a great town to live in and keep it on a path of success year after year.

As we entered this fiscal year, we again had a multitude of challenges and opportunities to deal with. As a result, the Waterboro Fire Department Inc., as an organization, has been eliminated and the department, its equipment, personnel and assets have been turned over to the town. The town will now manage the day to day operations of the department, utilizing the same personnel that have been elected to do so by the department members in the past. We look forward to the opportunity to enhance the departments ability to provide services to you, the citizens of Waterboro.

Along with the recommendation that the department be reorganized under town government, there are a number of additional recommendations with regards to equipment, building and operational improvements. This coming year will again represent a challenge to the Board, the Chief and his Deputies and various other departments within the town. We proudly dedicate the cover of this year's Town Report to the department.

As we enter our 1997-1998 fiscal year, we will continue to face significant issues like that of the fire departments. We will be faced with more and more responsibilities delegated down from State and Federal Government. I am confident that Waterboro will have the fortitude to accept these challenges and come out on top.

Again, the Selecmen thank each and every citizen for their support this past year. We trust that we will be able to depend on your support for the coming year.

▲Report of the TOWN CLERK

To the Citizens of Waterboro:

It is with great pleasure that I submit my first Town Clerk report for the fiscal year end June 30, 1997 to the Municipal Officers and the residents of the Town of Waterboro.

The following dog licenses were issued: Male/Females - 118 Neutered Males/Spayed Females - 416 Kennels - 6

As an agent for the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife, the following were issued:

Fish & Game Licenses - 1,399 Game Stamps - 101 Snowmobile Registrations - 311 All Terrain Vehicles Registrations - 220 Boat Registrations - 945 Non-Resident Snowmobiles - 36

Starting the 1998 year, there has been an increase in the boat registration fee based on the maximum horsepower of the motor. The fees are: 10 horsepower or less \$6.00, over 10 but not more than 50 horsepower \$10.00, greater than 50 horsepower \$15.00, all personal water craft (jet ski) \$20.00. These new fees replace the current \$4.00 registration fee.

There were 108 appointment certificates received from the Board of Selectmen for the various committees and officials that oaths of office were administered and recorded.

The Board of Selectmen held a Special Town Meeting on November 12, 1996 with 50 voters present. Annual Town Meeting was held March 8, 1997 with 170 voters present and 798 votes were cast. The States General Election was held November 5, 1996 with 2,526 votes cast.

22 Public Hearings were held: The Zoning Board of Appeals held 2, The Board of Selectmen held 12, the Planning Board held 7 and the Road Review Committee held 1.

Miscellaneous recordings included 1 Military Discharge, 3 Utility Pole permits, 2 automobile graveyard/junkyard permits were issued.

New business that filed their names included, Lisa's Cleaning Service, Maple Manor Products, Maine Pine Cone Co., East Village Grape Vine, Evergreen Custom Woodworks, Anything Tows Garage, Ossipee Lake Works, Snappy Pickup.

As Registrar of Voters, a listing of over 3,700 registered voters is maintained. Over 873 changes were made during the fiscal year due to deaths, new registrations, change of enrollment, etc.

I would like to thank the ballot clerks, Dusty Gerry, Dep. Registrar of Voters and Chauncey Gerry, Constable for their continued service and support.

I also would like to thank Dianne and Margaret for being deputies, and also Bertha. Thanks for all your help in my first year.

▲Report of the TAX COLLECTOR

The Board of Selectmen committed over 4,800 tax bills to be collected. The amount of the commitment is \$3,545,607.65. The listing of tax abatements and supplemental tax bills are listed elsewhere in this annual report, together with outstanding taxes and liens.

On October 10, 1996, there were 334 tax liens filed at the York County Registry of Deeds, for a total amount of \$220,481.94.

As Tax Collector, I would like to make taxpayers and renters of Waterboro aware of the State of Maine's Property Tax Refund Program, Rent Refund Program and the Elderly Low-Cost Drug Card Program. These forms become available around the first of September and must be filed by January 31st of the following year. The Town of Waterboro also has hardship abatement forms available at the Town Hall.

We also encourage you to make payments of any denomination during the course of the year, rather than try to come up with a lump sum when the tax bills are sent out.

WATERBORO PUBLIC LIBRARY

The library started 1997 with a wonderful show of support from the town's businesses. We held a Christmas campaign to purchase non-fiction children and young adult books and received over \$350 from the area's businesses. More than 30 books were purchased and have been used and enjoyed by the all patrons of the library. We also were able to purchase 68 books from the Libri Foundation with the money we had donated by patrons at the end of 1996.

January was Amnesty Month, with patrons bringing in food instead of fines for their over due books. The Waterboro Food Pantry was the recipient of several boxes of food through the generosity of our patrons. Our patrons liked this so much, we will make it an annual event at the library.

Our year continued with an American Girl Party in February, a National Book Week Contest in April, our Summer Reading Programs and Story Hours. The monthly meetings of our Chess Club have continued through the year. New and advanced players of all ages are welcome the last Saturday of each month. Two of the first grade classes from the Waterboro Elementary School used the library every Wednesday for six weeks from the end of April until the middle of June. The Summer Recreation Program children also came into the library for six weeks this summer, for some, the only time they use the library all year.

The librarian participated in the Traveling Tales Literacy program based out of the SAD 57 Adult Education building this year. Activities were held monthly by the group to encourage reading by children and adults alike. A "Beat the Winter Blues" party was a big success, along with a May Day party, family picnic and Movie night. Several patrons and their families attended these events.

The library became the meeting place for many groups -The Parenting Connection; the Brownies; a Medical Terminology class and a Round Table put on by York County Community Action. The library also hosted a Rubber-stamping workshop each month at

the Town Hall. A Home Schooling group, a Girl Scout troop and Cub Scout troop all came to the library for instruction on the use of the card catalog, Internet, and reference books. Several new patrons were signed up from each group.

We had several young adults help us throughout the year along with adults. We thank them all, as the library could not run as well without their dedication. They have put in hundreds of hours this past year. We are always looking for people interested in helping at the library, whether it be to design a bulletin board; put up a display; shelve or catalog books; or learn the circulation system. If you're interested, be sure to stop by and let us know.

We have had much usage of our three public computers, helping many people to become familiar with the Internet. Patrons have been amazed at the amount of information available to them through the Net. Molly McDaniel and Tom Williams have spent hours this past year keeping our Web page updated, adding new site information to it monthly. Many thanks to them for all the help they have given us this past year.

Our annual July Book and Bake Sale was a big success again this year. With the money raised, we have purchased books on Art History; painting; drawing; home remodeling and repair; and many different crafts. These were books requested by patrons on our surveys, be sure to stop in and take a look at them.

In May, the library held the grand opening of the first Traveling Art Show of SAD 57 students. Eleven pieces of art from painting to sculpture were displayed at the library for people to see. Students, parents and their friends all came out to see the art work during the two weeks the pieces were at the library.

The Waterboro Garden Club has begun to spruce up the outside of the library. They started by putting in flower beds on each side of the front steps of the library this year, a much better sight then what was there. Patrons coming in the library have commented on the hummingbirds and butterflies they have seen in the flowers, and are looking forward to an even better garden in 1998.

Pack 324, Den 2 of Waterboro donated a wonderful doll house to the library in October. This was put together with the help of Gerry Peters. Furniture was purchased for it, and it has been a fun addition to our toy room.

Cyndy Pike, assistant librarian for the last year and a half, left the library the first of November to start a new career with the Post Office. Cyndy will be missed by the library patrons, both young and old.

We are beginning to outgrow the space we are in and need to be thinking of the future of the library. Do you want the library to grow as the town grows, or remain as it is now? Does the town want a bigger, better library in a more central location? What does the

town see the role of the library to be for Waterboro in the future? These are the questions the library board will be asking Waterboro residents in the coming months.

SACO RIVER CORRIDOR COMMISSION

The Saco River Corridor Commission administers the Saco River Corridor Act, established in 1974, which regulates land use within 500 to 1000 feet of the Saco, Ossipee, Little Ossipee Rivers, the Little Ossipee Flowage, and Balch Lake. The Commission is made up of representatives from the twenty communities bordering these water bodies. Each of the twenty municipalities has an opportunity to be represented by one regular and one alternate member who is appointed by the Selectmen or the Mayor. The regular member from the Town of Waterboro is Rex Koller and the alternate member is Francis Towns. The Commission generally meets once a month to consider applications for permits and to discuss other matters which relate to the Saco River Corridor region. For the past year, the Commission has spent a considerable amount of time working toward educational programming for the school children of these communities, as well as other conservation efforts as part of our commitment to the protection of these great waters of Southern Maine. The Saco River Corridor Commission was recently notified of a grant award to design and create an education video about the connection between the rivers in the corridor and corridor communities. We look forward to producing this video and sharing the finished product with towns in the region.

One of the major functions of the Commission is the consideration of permit applications for development within the Corridor. During the months of January through November of 1997, the Commission considered a total of 107 applications for permits and amendments, including reconsiderations. The Commission also held 8 public hearings during this time. Of the permit and amendment applications considered by the Commission in 1997, 15 were for development activities within the Town of Waterboro. In addition, 4 of the public hearings were for development activities within the Town of Waterboro.

This commission has traditionally operated on a low budget, and state wide budget cuts are still affecting the Commission's program effort. The Saco River Corridor Commission did receive a financial boost with recently enacted legislation that provides a measure of consistent funding. The amount of money, based on a water consumption fee, is not enough to run the agency's programs and we are, therefore, again seeking financial assistance from all the communities within the corridor. The Commission is hopeful that citizens will support the community control over regional resources. The Saco River Corridor Commission member and alternate from Waterboro represent the town's voice when development and potential development impacts are reviewed anywhere in the

corridor. Our funding requests to municipalities were determined by using a \$200.00 base request per town, plus a mere \$.14 per person, based on a recent census.

The results, due in late this fall, will lead to recommendations in the spring of 1998.

The second major project was sponsoring a \$500.00 scholarship to a student graduating from Massabesic High School and pursuing further education in the field of environmental control. At the June graduation, Eric Daigneault was presented the scholarship. Many thanks to Florence Sagarino for chairing the project and to the school system for their fine support.

Our three newsletters published by project chairman Charlene Johnson communicated the many other meaningful projects that we hope represents the best interests of the community surrounding the Lake.

My thanks to the Board of Director members who attended our many meetings and gave so much of their time.

PARKS & RECREATION COMMISSION

To the Citizens of Waterboro:

The Parks and Recreation Department has continued its growth over the last year. More children have played in our programs, and more parents have volunteered to help the department than ever before.

Summer Recreation enjoyed another successful year under the guidance of coordinator Jeanne Robinson. Over 100 children attended the Summer Rec, which ran for six weeks between June and August. The program, now in its fifth year, has grown steadily, and we hope that this continues through its next five years. The Junior Recreation Program moved into its second year under the direction of Moe and Doreen Auger. The Junior Rec doubled its size to about 40 kids. Highlights of this year's program included a hike at Grafton Notch State Park, the challenges of the wall at the Maine Rock Climbing gym, and a fun filled day at Water Country in Portsmouth, NH. The Junior Rec participated in events in the Fall as well. Volunteers helped the Massabesic Lions with their First Cranberry Apple Festival in September, while in October, they moved the annual Haunted House to Friendship Park, where over 100 people walked through the Haunted Forest. Thanks to Marie Dittmer for her time and energy in the month long project.

Team Sports are growing in Waterboro, with both basketball and soccer growing steadily. The Soccer League joined forces with the newly formed Massabesic United Soccer Club to bring the first travel teams to the Waterboro area. Basketball brought fun and learning together with a kindergarten clinic, a recreational league, and boys and girls travel teams. Special thanks to George Dearborn, and Michelle Dion, as well as all of the coaches and volunteers for their help.

The Swim Program has grown in its scope in the past year. Rosemary Kaszubowski and the Lake Arrowhead Community have given the Parks and Recreation department the ability to do swimming lessons year round. We're hoping that more people take advantage of this unique service.

In the coming years, the Parks and Recreation Department will continue to offer sports to everyone who wants them. The Department is forming "strategic partnerships" with already existing organizations in order to better serve the public. By working with the Massabesic United Soccer Club, the Massabesic Ice Hockey Boosters, and the Shaker Valley Little League, we hope to encourage more people to join these organizations, as well participate in the Parks and Recreation programs. Parks and Recreation also plans to improve and restructure its existing areas to better serve the public. Included in this plan is a redesign of Friendship Park, to make it a multi-purpose facility capable of many different events, not just baseball.

The Parks and Recreation Department would like to say a special thank you to Andrea Lefebvre, Greg Mehlhorn, and Paul L'heureux for their years of service on the Parks and Recreation Committee, as well as Danny Chauvette for his brief, but enthusiastic time as Chairman. WATERBORO FIRE DEPARTMENT

1997 has been a year of transition for the Waterboro Fire Department and the Town of Waterboro. In October the vote was made to have the fire department become a municipal department. This move is advantageous to both the Fire Department and to the people of Waterboro. We look forward to developing a smooth working organization.

With the ever-increasing population in Waterboro there must be improvements in the equipment and quarters for the Fire Department. Looking to the future, the Fire Department anticipates building a new central station. The truck fleet will be upgraded to meet state and federal requirements. The needs of this community are the primary concern of the Fire Department and we will strive to meet them.

The Waterboro Fire Department responded to 790 emergency calls this year, 232 fire calls and 558 rescue calls. The time, energy and dedication of our personnel are truly appreciated. We want to publicly thank them for their commitment to the people in the town of Waterboro.

There is a regional training program that allows our firefighters become Firefighter 1 certified. Waterboro Fire Department holds monthly training sessions and there are many outside opportunities to upgrade firefighting skills. We encourage all firefighters to take advantage of these classes for their own protection as well as to improve their performance while on the job.

A Wildland Firefighting Group was started in southern Maine that some of our firefighters have joined. There were three major brush fires that they responded to this year. This is a great asset to the town as well as to the surrounding communities. We are all well aware of the dangers of a dry season. Fortunately, there is now a dedicated group of firefighters trained specifically for wildland firefighting that will help protect our communities.

The rescue personnel are required to maintain a license from the State of Maine. This entails continuing education that is provided in-house as well as from the local hospitals and conferences. We participate in the Quality Improvement program run by the sate to monitor all care provided. The data collected also allows the state to track trends of injury and illness throughout the state and develop education programs for the community and EMS.

Longtime Firefighter, George Whitehouse, died this past year. He was instrumental in the development of the Waterboro Fire Department. He will be missed.

We invite you to visit our stations and see how we operate. New members are always welcome. If you are interested in helping your community consider joinging the fire and rescue services. It is a very rewarding endeavor.

During the year of this report, 19 regular meetings were held. There were 7 public hearings, 1 public zoning forum and 16 non-confirming lot reviews and action on 8 within the Shoreland Zones. There were 9 conditional use or change of use reviews.

The Planning Board was aided by two Town Planners this year. Dianne Holden resigned and was replaced by Pat Sicard in September of 1996. The members of the Board wish at this time to thank Dianne and Pat for their efforts and assistance.

1997 marks the 20th year anniversary of the adoption of the Zoning Ordinance. This year the Planning Board worked on reviewing the zoning ordinance and will continue into the next year. Over the years, changes have been made throughout the Ordinance creating some inconsistencies and omitting important definitions. The Planning Board is making a major effort to identify these inconsistencies and is working with the Town's attorney to rewrite some sections of the Ordinance to make it consistent throughout and to bring back some definitions that were lost in some of the changes.

At the time of the writing of this report, the Planning Board sadly reports the loss of their long time secretary, Sharon Abbott, who left employment with the Town of Waterboro as of June 30, 1997. Her knowledge and her assistance to the Board will be greatly missed. Fellow employees of the Town of Waterboro, as well as citizens who had the pleasure to have worked with Sharon, know that it is a great loss to the Town. CONSERVATION COMMISSION

This commission is pleased to report that during the past year we have continued our efforts in the acquisition and management of several properties owned by the Town of Waterboro. One of which is a beautiful piece of property located on top of Ossipee Mountain. It consists of three adjoining parcels, a 25 acre lot located at the actual summit, a 45 acre lot located on the north side of the Old Ossipee Mountain Road and a one acre lot containing a spring. We are currently involved in preparing a management plan for this property so that it can best serve the inhabitants of Waterboro now and for years to come. During the past year this property was analyzed for timber and recreational resources, and the perimeter was surveyed by means of sub-meter GPS for the purpose of computing total true acreage and positions of important land features.

Parking facilities, bridge and foot path for the "Gilbert Thompson Preserve" have also been a major effort this past year. We are currently attempting to acquire an easement for parking and access to the Preserve and hopefully complete it's construction this construction season.

During the past year the Waterboro Conservation Commission was also involved in a joint effort with the Nature Conservancy providing a guided tour of our "Pine Barrens".

WATERBORO RECYCLING COMMITTEE

AGENDA FOR 1997:

- 1. Design and build a KIOSK to be placed at the dump to disseminate information at the dump. To build this KIOSK with recycled materials using student volunteers.
- 2. To develop a network of student volunteers to assist in recycling projects. The purpose of student volunteers is to instill a sense of community in the future of Waterboro. We would like to give as much recognition as possible to the students to help install pride and self esteem in them. The benefits to our community will be great.
- 3. We would like to start a couple of contests in art and essays in the schools to use in our promotion of recycling in Waterboro. We feel that run yearly they would create and sustain a momentum that will spread to the homes and increase the recycling activity in our town.
- 4. We would like to develop a Swap Shed at the dump similar to other communities. This can reduce what goes into the compactor and bring recycling benefits directly to the people. We will attempt to get the materials donated from contractors and suppliers in our community as well as the expertise's of builders. Lyman was very successful at building a library in this manner.
- 5. We would like to try a Well advertised silver bullet at J.D.'s Redemption that would be more convenient to the residents. They go there to do a type of recycling currently.
- 6. We intend to enter into projects with the recreation department that they are planning. Some are similar to what has been discussed by the recycling committee. We feel there is no reason we can't join forces instead of duplicating efforts.

To the Citizens of Waterboro:

It gives me a great deal of pleasure to notify the citizens of Waterboro, Maine, that our students continue to receive a quality, high impact education for a cost that is markedly less than corresponding school districts in our area. Although as of this writing the budget is not yet set for the 1998-99 school year, the increase of 148 new students to the enrollment totals of MSAD #57 (4.4% increase) will result in some additional burden to our taxes. Our current year total budget of \$18,079,991 rates us as twenty second out of twenty four in cost/per/pupil for funding secondary education (i.e. second from the bottom in cost). However, our students truly distinguish themselves academically through their success in the post secondary choices they make as well as in the most recent Grade Eleven MEA scores:

NOTICE TO DOG OWNERS

Your 1997 dog license was due and payable January 1st. A \$3.00 late fee will be applied to all dog licenses after January 31st. If unpaid after January 31st, a \$3.00 fine will be added. If unpaid on April 1st, a warrant will be issued by the Selectmen to the Animal Control Officer directing him to proceed forthwith to enter complaint and summons to court the owner of any unlicensed dog. This officer will first call on you demanding that you comply with the law. At this time you will be liable for a fee of \$10.00 to the officer in addition to the cost of the dog license which is:

Neutered Males & Spayed Females - \$4.00 (6 months or older) All dogs 6 months or older capable of producing young - \$7.50

Failure on your part to comply will mean that you will be summoned to court and be liable for a fine of up to \$25.00.

To the Citizens of Waterboro:


We are going to enforce the Dog License Law (Title 7, Chapter 713, Section 3702 of the Maine State Law) in Waterboro, The owners or keepers of any dog in Waterboro must get a license from the Town Clerk by January 1st.

On April 1st, we will issue a Dog License Warrant. The warrant enables the Enforcement Officers to legally call on the owners of keepers of unlicensed dogs. After we issued a warrant, the owners of keepers of unlicensed dogs must obtain a dog license from the Town Clerk within seven (7) days and pay to the Town Clerk a \$10.00 Constable fee in addition to the regular dog licensing fee.

If a dog license is not obtained within seven (7) days of the warning the officers holding the warrant will proceed to summons to court the owner or keeper of the unlicensed dog.

So, you're getting fair warning - GET A LICENSE FOR YOUR DOG!

PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTIONS FOR VETERANS OR THEIR FAMILIES

VETERANS THEIR SURVIVING SPOUSES, MINOR CHILDREN AND WIDOWED MOTHERS may qualify for a tax exemption if the veteran was in active service in the armed forces of the Unites States during a federally recognized war or campaign period (listed below) and was honorably discharged.

Estates of veterans or their survivors, including real and personal property are exempt up to \$5,000.00 (\$7,000.00 for veterans who served prior to World War II) of just valuation in the town where the person filing is a resident. These following criteria must be met:

- 1. Applicant must be a resident of the State of Maine;
- 2. A one time application must be filed along with proof of entitlement with the assessor in the town where the applicant is a resident on or before April 1;
- Veteran must be at least 62 years old (see #4 exception) on April 1 of the year in which application is made. If deceased, Veteran must have been born 62 years prior to filing of application by survivor;

OR.

4. Veteran must be receiving a pension or compensation from the United States Government for total disability, either service or non-service connected, as a Veteran.

These general purpose financial statements are the responsibility of the Town's management. My responsibility is to express an opinion on these general purpose financial statements based on my audit.

I conducted my audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that I plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the general purpose financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the general purpose financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall general purpose financial statement presentation. I believe that my audit provides a reasonable basis for my opinion.

The general purpose financial statements referred to above do not include the general fixed assets account group, which should be included in order to conform with generally accepted accounting principles. The amount that should be recorded in the general fixed assets account group is not known.

Notes to Financial Statements June 30, 1997

NOTE A - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The Town of Waterboro, Maine operates without a charter under a Selectman - Town Meeting form of government. The Town was incorporated on March 6, 1787. The Town provides the following services: general administration, public safety, health and sanitation, highways and bridges, general assistance, and planning and zoning.

The Town's financial report includes all of the Town's operations.

The accounting policies of the Town conform to generally accepted accounting principles, (GAAP), except the Town does not record it general fixed assets. The following is a summary of the significant accounting principles of the Town.

Reporting Entity

The financial statement of the Town consist only of the funds and account groups of the Town. The Town has no oversight responsibility for any other governmental entity since no other entities are considered to be controlled by or dependent on the Town. Control or dependence is determined on the basis of budget adoption, taking authority, funding, and appointment of the respective governing board.

Fund Accounting

The accounts of the Town are organized on the basis of funds and account groups, each of which is considered a separate accounting entity. The operations of each fund are accounted for with a separate set of self-balancing accounts that comprise its assets, liabilities, fund equity, revenues, and expenditures, or expenses as appropriate. Government resources are allocated to and accounted for in individual funds based upon the purposes for which they are to be spent and the means by which spending activities are controlled. The various funds are grouped, in the financial statements in the report, into generic fund types and broad fund categories as follows:

NOTE A - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONT.)

Governmental Fund Types:

General Fund - The General Fund is the general operating fund of the Town. It is used to account for all financial resources except those required to be accounted for in another fund.

<u>Special Revenue</u> - These funds are used to account for the proceeds of specific revenue sources or to finance specified activities as designated by the Town.

<u>Capital Projects Funds</u> - These funds are used to account for financial resources to be used for the acquisition and construction of major capital facilities other than those financed by proprietary funds. A budget/actual statement has not been presented. A separate budget is not prepared for this fund.

<u>Debt Service Fund</u> - The Debt Service Fund is used to account for the accumulation of resources for, and the payment of, general long-term debt including capital lease obligations, principal, interest and related costs.

Fiduciary Fund Types:

Trust Fund - The Trust Fund is used to account for assets held by the Town in a trustee capacity or as an agent for individuals, private organizations, other government units and/or other funds.

Account Groups:

Account groups are used to establish accounting control and accountability for the Town's general fixed assets and general long-term debt. The following are the Town's account groups:

General Fixed Assets - Fixed assets used in governmental fund type operations should be accounted for in the General Fixed Assets Account Group, rather than in governmental funds. No General Fixed Asset Account Group has been included in these general purposes financial statements.

General Long-Term Debt Account Group - The General Long-Term Debt Account Group is used to account for long-term liabilities to be financed from governmental fund types.

NOTE A - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONT.)

Governmental fund operating statement present increases (revenues and other financing sources) and decreases (expenditures and other financing uses) in net current assets. Accordingly, they are said to present a summary of sources and uses of "available spending resources" during a period.

Basis of Accounting

The accounting and financial reporting treatment applied to a fund is determined by its measurement focus. All governmental funds and expendable trusts funds are accounted for using a current financial resources measurement focus. With this measurement focus, only current assets and current liabilities generally are included on the balance sheet. Operating statements of these funds present increases (i.e., revenues and other financing sources) and decreases (i.e., expenditures and other financing uses) in net current assets.

All proprietary funds and non-expendable trust funds are accounted for on a flow of economic resources measurement focus. With this measurement focus, all assets and all liabilities associated with the operation of these funds are included on the balance sheet. Fund equity (i.e., net total assets) is segregated into contributed capital and retained earnings components. Proprietary fund-type operating statements present increases (e.g., revenues) and decreases (e.g., expenses) in net total assets.

The modified accrual basis of accounting is used by all governmental fund types, expendable trust funds and agency funds. Under the modified accrual basis of accounting, revenues are recognized when susceptible to accrual (i.e., when they become both measurable and available). "Measurable" means collectible within the current period or soon enough thereafter to be used to pay liabilities of the current period. The government considers property taxes as available if they are collected within 60 days after year end. A one-year availability period is used for revenue recognition for all other governmental fund revenues. Expenditures are recorded when the related fund liability is incurred.

NOTE A - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONT.)

The accrual basis of accounting is utilized by proprietary fund types and non-expendable trust funds. Under this method, revenues are recorded when earned and expenses are recorded at the time liabilities are incurred.

Budgets and Budgetary Accounting

Formal budgetary Accounting is employed as a management control for the general fund and special revenue fund of the Town of Waterboro. The budget is voted on at the annual Town meeting by the Town's people.

The budgets for the operating funds are prepared on the cash and expenditures basis. Revenues are budgeted in the year receipt is expected; and expenditures are budgeted in the year that the applicable expenditure is expected to be made. The budget and actual financial statements are reported on these bases.

Annual appropriated budgets are adopted for the general and special revenue funds. All annual appropriations unexpended at year end lapse unless voted to be carried over by the Town at Town meeting.

Investments

The Town has investments in certificates of deposit and repurchase agreements with Key Bank. Investments are stated at lower of cost or market.

Deferred Revenue

The Town reports deferred revenue on its combined balance sheet. Deferred revenues arise when a potential revenue does not meet both the "measurable" and "available" criteria for recognition in the current period. Deferred revenues also arise when resources are received by the government before it has a legal claim on them, as when grant monies are received prior to the incurrence of qualifying expenditures. In subsequent periods, when both revenue recognition criteria are met, or when the government has a legal claim to the resources, the liability for deferred revenue is removed from the combined balance sheet and revenue is recognized.

NOTE A - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONT.)

Short-Term Interfund Receivables/Payables

During the course of operations, transactions occur between individual funds. These receivables and payables are classified as "due from other funds" or "due to other funds" on the balance sheet.

Compensated Absences

Vested or accumulated vacation that is expected to be liquidated with expendable available financial resources is reported as an expenditure and a fund liability of the governmental fund that will pay it. Amounts of vested or accumulated vacation that are not expected to be liquidated with expendable available financial resources are reported in the general long-term debt account group. No expenditure for long-term debt has been reported for these amounts.

Fund Equity

Reserves represent those portions of fund equity not appropriable for expenditure or legally segregated for a specific future use. Designated fund balances represent tentative plans for future use of financial resources.

Cash Equivalents

For purposes of the statement of cash flows, the Town considers all highly liquid debt instruments purchased with a maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents.

Memorandum Only - Totals Column

The total column on the general purpose financial statements are captioned "memorandum only" to indicate that they are presented only to facilitate financial analysis. Data in these columns do not present financial position, results of operations or changes in financial position in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles. Neither are such data comparable to consolidation. Interfund eliminations have not been made in the aggregation of this data.

NOTE B - DEPOSITS AND INVESTMENTS

Cash and Investments

On June 30, 1997 the cash and investment accounts had carrying amounts of \$1,375,333 and \$259,706 respectively, and market values of \$1,375,333 and \$275,344 respectively.

The Town's cash and investment balances are categorized to give an indication of the level of risk assumed by the Town at year-end. Category 1 includes amounts that were covered by Federal Deposit Insurance. Category 2 includes amounts that were covered through a trust agreement between Key Bank of Southern Maine and Shawmut Bank, N.A. which allows the Town to have a continuing undivided security interest in the pool of underlying U.S. Treasury, U.S. Agency and U.S. Government Agency Mortgage-backed securities. Category 3 includes all other uncollateralized amounts.

The Town has entered into a repurchase agreement with Key Bank. The Town transferred many of its savings and certificates of deposit into this agreement. The current repurchase agreement carries a 5.30% interest rate and a repurchase date of November 12, 1997.

NOTE C - PROPERTY TAX, LIEN AND INTEREST RECEIVABLES (CONT'D)

Property taxes attach as an enforceable lien on property eight months after commitment. Taxes are assessed on November 26, and May 26, and are due and payable at that time. All unpaid taxes as of November 27, and May 27, become delinquent at that time, and interest accrues at the rate of 10.75% annually. The tax rate is \$17.85 per \$1,000 and covers the period July 1, 1996 to June 30, 1997 which coincides with the tax year.

NOTE H - COMMITMENT - CATERPILLAR LEASE

On September 27, 1995 the Town entered into a lease agreement for a Caterpillar 426B backhoe loader from Caterpillar Financial Services Corporation for a period of 84 months with a monthly payment of \$777. The lease payment is recognized in the department in which the Caterpillar is used.

There is no liability for this lease until the funds have been approved each year by the Town vote. If such funds are not approved in a given year, the lease can be terminated with no penalties or obligations.

NOTE J - NOTE PAYABLE AND AMOUNTS PROVIDED FOR

This bond is for 28 years with interest at 5.625% per annum, both principal and interest due annually on September 3 of each year beginning September 3, 1995 and ending September 3, 2021. The payments are \$7,176.00 and are for the water system. The annual outlay for this bond including interest is as follows:

NOTE L - FUND BALANCE CAPITAL PROJECTS FUND

The Town voted at the March 9, 1996 Town meeting to purchase an ambulance for \$84,000 to be financed by Town monies at an interest rate of 5.95% for a period of five years. The repayment for the year ending June 30, 1997 was 18,800 from surplus. The Town will vote over the next four years regarding the funding of this ambulance. The amount due on this funding arrangement is \$65,200.

NOTE M - NOTE RECEIVABLE

This note is from the Waterboro Water District and is associated with the construction of the water system. The Waterboro Water District agreed to reimburse the Town for the Town's unreimbursed costs incurred during the final phases of construction. These amounts were formalized and are to be paid with an annual payment of \$8,279.62 for thirty years at 6.375% interest, due on July 1 of each year. The balance as of June 30, 1997 is \$105,393.

NOTE N - DUE TO/FROM FUNDS

The following accounts were established to account for amounts set aside or expended by one fund on behalf of another. The General Fund is due \$50,290 from the Capital Projects Fund for the ambulance less amounts needed to complete the project on Webber Road. The Special Revenue Fund is due \$7,276 for interior maintenance, conservation and Taylor House.

NOTE 0 - LOAN AGREEMENT

On March 20, 1995 the Town agreed to guarantee a loan of the Massabesic Lions' Club Regional Medical Center if the loan goes into default. The original loan is for \$50,000. The Town owns the property and has consented to a leasehold mortgage and collateral assignment of leases pertaining to the lease through its Town meeting.

NOTE P - DISASTER ASSISTANCE

During the year ending June 30, 1996 the Town applied for disaster assistance from the Department of Defense related to flooding on April 16 and 17, 1996. This assistance was approved for \$8,728 and an initial payment was received July 17, 1996. The completion date is October 16, 1997. The final payment was received during the year ending June 30, 1997 on this project.

During the year ending June 30, 1997 the Town applied for disaster assistance from the Department of Defense related to flooding on October 20-22, 1996. An amount of \$27,404 was approved and received during the year ending June 30, 1997.

NOTE Q - OVERLAPPING DEBT

The Town's proportionate share of MSAD 57's debt and Regional Waste Systems' debt is not recorded in the financial statements of the Town of Waterboro. At June 30, 1997 the Town's share was \$132,327 and \$3,864,620, respectively.
