Kenneth was born in Waterboro in 1923. He attended schools here and graduated from Waterboro High School. He was the son of Harley and Forestina (Johnson) Roberts who were life long residents of Waterboro.

Kenneth was married to Marjorie Knight and they had four children. Marjorie died in 1997.

Kenneth was Road Commissioner for the Town of Waterboro in 1946. He was a member of the Road Review Committee from 1986 – 1992.

He was very active in the Waterboro Fire Department. He was instrumental in the building of the North Waterboro Fire Station and was the Fire Chief (North Division) for several years.

After retirement from the State Highway Department, he worked 15 years for the Waterboro Road Commissioner's until approximately a month prior to his death.

NOTICE TO DOG OWNERS

Your 2002 dog license was due and payable January 1st. A \$5.00 late fee will be applied to all dog licenses after January 31st. If unpaid after January 31st, a \$5.00 fine will be added. If unpaid on April 1st, a warrant will be issued by the Selectmen to the Animal Control Officer directing him to proceed forthwith to enter complaint and summons to court the owner of any unlicensed dog. This officer will first call on you demanding that you comply with the law. At this time you will be liable for a fee of \$10.00 to the officer in addition to the cost of the dog license which is:

Neutered Males & Spayed Females - \$4.00 (6 months or older) All dogs 6 months or older capable of producing young - \$7.50

Failure on your part to comply will mean that you will be summoned to court and be liable for a fine of up to \$25.00.

Revised Statutes, 1964, Title 7 as amended by Public Laws of 1975, 1967, 1969, 1973, 1974, 1975, 1976, 1977, 1978, 1979, 1982.

To the Citizens of Waterboro:

We are going to enforce the Dog License Law (Title 7, Chapter 713, Section 3702 of the Maine State Law) in Waterboro, the owners or keepers of any dog in Waterboro must get a license from the Town Clerk by January 1st.

On April 1st, we will issue a Dog License Warrant. The warrant enables the Enforcement Officers to legally call on the owners of keepers of unlicensed dogs. After we issued a warrant, the owners of keepers of unlicensed dogs must obtain a dog license from the Town Clerk within seven (7) days and pay to the Town Clerk a \$10.00 Constable fee in addition to the regular dog licensing fee.

If a dog license is not obtained within seven (7) days of the warning the officers holding the warrant will proceed to summons to court the owner or keeper of the unlicensed dog.

So, you're getting fair warning - GET A LICENSE FOR YOUR DOG!

BOARD OF SELECTMEN

This should have been written by Millard Genthner. Had we not lost him, I am sure Millard would have been on the ballot this town meeting seeking his second term. I did my best to do good work to honor his memory.

Brenda Charland, the first and only woman ever elected selectmen in this town, winner of two elections had to resign because of health reasons.

Just as Brenda and Willis Lord ran the town alone until I was elected to replace Millard, so did Willis and I work without a third member until Doug Foglio, Sr. was elected to finish Brenda's term.

Growth in Waterboro caught up with us. The second consecutive year of increased new building permits added to our population, increasing the cost of our school and of town services. In addition, with a new jail on the agenda, county taxes took a huge spike. Taxes in Waterboro went up 14 percent last year.

With building caps in surrounding communities and lower fees in Waterboro, the growth spike in our town continued. In addition, the cost of running the Solid Waste Facility, which nearly doubled back in 1995, continued to rise, now to a half million dollar a year operation.

A transfer committee, brought to life at the spring 2001 Special Town Meeting, worked hard and many hours to come up with a new fee system. Selectmen had to increase the sticker fees.

The census of 2000 said this town had 6200 citizens. I think the census figure was low. I believe his town is close to

or over 7000 residents today. Townspeople needing more law enforcement hired a contract deputy. We are very fortunate to have over 50 dedicated volunteers in our municipal fire department but with more residences, and more people, the demands grow each day on this department.

We have a terrific Parks & Recreation Department but the population increase, especially that of children, has greatly increased the demands on our director, and his volunteer committee.

Charters have been defeated twice by voters in Waterboro, but a new Charter Committee is working to try to improve town government by writing a new charter to present for voter approval next year.

There are differences of opinion about where commercial growth should be allowed. The Comprehensive Plan Update Committee is working hard to bring our Comprehensive Plan up to date.

We have a new fire barn and a new addition to town hall, both the result of voter approval and increased needs of hard work by our Municipal Complex Committee.

Other volunteer committees have felt the blunt of increased growth and resulting activity-Planning Board, the Finance Committee, the Conservation Commission, the Recycling Committee, the Road Review Committee, the Public Safety Committee and all the other volunteer committees.

A Lake Arrowhead Committee was started, and many meetings held. A new era of understanding and tolerance is taking shape because of better communication.

The growth has tremendously increase the workload within the town hall for elected and employed personnel, the Selectmen's Assistant, the Secretary, the Town Clerk, the Motor Vehicle Agent, the Tax Collector, the Code Enforcement Officer and Secretary, the Treasurer, the Tax Assessor, the Road Commissioner, etc. Growth has elevated every person's workload.

We had some past problems with accounting and the past year has been a

difficult task to get or figures reconciled correctly.

We are a "big" little town now, not a sleepy little hamlet anymore, we are a bursting community with a major grocery store, and the resulting tag on commercial growth on the way.

There has been many changes in our community, and how it is run, and there will be more. I urge everybody reading this to subscribe to a new responsibility, a new commitment to our town. We all need to get involved, to share ideas, to become the improved citizens that this community needs us to become.

WATERBORO FIRE DEPARTMENT

The Waterboro Fire Department has had a very busy year. With numerous calls answered and the endless training and preparations by our loyal members. We have seen this department grow and become a professional service. Through our department personnel, we have spend countless hours in striving to provide this excellent service to the community, also I am very proud that I am Waterboro's first full time Fire Chief.

We have moved in to the new Central Station that through the overwhelming support of the taxpayers, we thank you for the support. A little about this station. It is 68' wide and 130' deep; it has 4 doors with 8 bays in the apparatus room. It also has a kitchen, meeting room, a SCBA repair room, Decon room, EMS storage room and a radio room and 4 offices. This will greatly enhance our ability to operate and serve you better. It is the goal of the fire dept. and the town EMA director to set this facility up for a shelter. As a shelter, Central Station will

be able to operate at full capacity during all emergencies.

Waterboro Fire Department EMS has purchased a brand-new 2001 PL Custom ambulance with the revenue from the billing account. This is the first time that the taxpayers of Waterboro did not have to pay for the ambulance. It is located at the new Central Station, stop by and let us give you a tour of the new ambulance.

I would like at this time to thank the men and women of the Waterboro Fire Department for their endless unselfishness in providing the fire suppression, EMS fire prevention and support services to the community. It is with their hard work we have been able to do this. And, to the community for providing the ability and the equipment to enable us to serve you best

WATERBORO PUBLIC LIBRARY

Data entry has been the main focus at the library this year. Each of the books in the library is being input one at a time by staff and volunteers, a very slow, time-consuming venture. As we input books, we are looking at each one to not its condition, the last time it was taken out, and especially with nonfiction, the date of publication, to see how current the information is. This is getting to be the only way for us to make space for new materials in the library. We have already run out of space for adult and children's videos.

We continue to find spots for a few more bookcases this year, but space is getting harder and harder to find. Due to lack of space, the library board did not increase the book budget last year or for this coming year. Therefore, our patrons will be seeing less new books and other materials this coming year.

Our new Friends Group spent the year organizing themselves and working on a few fund-raising events. In May they held a silent cake auction, in June a "No Clothes" yard sale that did very well. The group has made a beautiful book quilt which will be raffled off at town meeting. With some of the money they made, the Friend's have purchases a onyear's pass to the Children's Museum in Portland which may be used once daily by a group of up to four people. The group's latest project was having library book bags made for people to purchase. It is a wonderful bag that can be used a variety of ways besides carrying books. I continued to meet with the librarians from Hollis, Salmon Falls, and the West Buxton libraries monthly this year. We combined ideas and materials for out summer reading program - "2001, a Library Odyssey", making passports for children to have stamped when they visited other libraries. We shared crafts and held a party here at the end of the reading program for all who participated in the program. We have spent the year exchanging books and ideas, sharing problems, and attending area meetings together.

We replaced and upgraded a couple of our computers this year and hope to have our computer catalog and on-line catalog system in place soon. As soon as we get more of the collection in the system, we will begin scanning books when our patrons check them out. Jean and I attended an all-day seminar this past spring to help us become more familiar with the computer program we are using. Also, if you have not done so, check out the library's web page. Many thanks to Molly McDaniel who spends hours each month updating and adding information to the site. It is a continuous work in progress.

Our annual American Girl party featured "Kit", who grew up in the 1930's during the depression. Mr. Neal Hurlburt entertained the girls by coming dressed as a hobo and talking about life during the depression. Mr. Jim Hammond also told the girls what it was like to grow up during that time. Melanie Stockholm along with some helpers, played music from the 20's and 30's and taught the kids to "Charleston". The girls made "Hobo" packs using hobo signs, played "Hobo Sign" bingo and ate "Hobo Stew", mashed potato cake, fruit squares and hot chocolate.

Our library Holiday Open House was held December 8th this year. Santa was in residence for children both young and old to have their picture taken with, our Friends group held a book and bag sale. Six gingerbread houses were raffled off

and plenty of goodies were available for anyone with a sweet tooth. A regular event at the library, enjoyed by all who come to it.

We continued with our regular activities at the library this year. Story Hour was run by Michelle Dion at 10 a.m. each Wednesday morning. We held our April read-a-thon and our summer story hour. The summer recreation group came in each Wednesday after story hour for six weeks this past summer. It was the largest Rec. bunch yet, about 80-90 children, divided into four groups. It took them about an hour or more to choose their books each week. If it weren't for our teen helpers-Hannah and Julia Stiles, Danielle Cote, Amy Brocato and Kayla Braden, it would have taken hours to card books and get them back on the shelves. Each received a volunteer t-shirt for helping out.

A continuous problem at the library has been the number of books and materials not being returned by patrons. Even after several phone calls, letters, amnesty month and more calls, we have between \$300-\$400, worth of books not returned. The board instituted a new policy that our local patrol officer will be called as a last resort to collect materials or their replacement costs from patrons who refuse to return them to the library. As the cost of materials increases, the library cannot continue to lose money on books, videos, etc. that is not returned. A book drop is available twenty-four hours a day for anyone who cannot get to the library when we are open. We even placed a book box at the school to collect summer recreation overdue books.

A new home school group formed in March, and has been meeting at the library the first Friday of each month. A wonderful support group, they have several volunteer organized opportunities, a soccer team, and helped each other out with books and materials. Contact the library for more information.

We held an Usborne Book fair here in September and received \$250. in free books due to the amount of sales that we had. All non-fiction, they are a great addition to our collection. We thank everyone who donated books and other materials to the library. Anything we couldn't use went into our book sale and was used to purchase one of our new computer programs.

The library board is considering a new building to meet the future needs of the town. They held several meetings concerning a new library this past year, one with the Selectmen and one with an

architect about the current building. Several Focus groups met to gather ideas from patrons and non-patrons in town. The Board has come to realize that expansion or renovation of the current building is not feasible to meet our future needs. Plans for a new library will continue to be developed in 2002. If you are interested in being on a focus group, or on the building committee, please call the library.

MOTOR VEHICLE AGENT

For a Maine dealer sale, you will need to bring (1) Green Sales Tax form, (2) Blue Title Application, (3) Window Sticker if new vehicle and (4) CURRENT Insurance card.

For a Private sale (from one person to another), you will need (1) Bill of Sale, (2) Title-if 1985 or newer (signed on the back by previous owners and transferred to you on the top lines of the back.) Erasures, cross outs or whiteouts will void the title and then that part will have to be replaced by a form MVT16. (3) And Insurance card.

Starting Jan 1, 2001, it will be 1987 and newer vehicles that will need a title. (Maine is a

Please remember that your insurance card dates MUST cover the day you are here to register. It cannot be expired and it cannot start at a later date. We can accept a fax of insurance coverage from your company. There is a \$1 fee and the number is 247-5456.

To transfer credits from one vehicle to another, you can no longer own the old vehicle. You will need to bring the old yellow registration from the vehicle you don't own any more. If you transfer, you will be using the same plate and dates as your old vehicle.

Re-registrations can be done by mail if easier. Just call and get the amount due. Send a copy of current insurance, a self addressed stamped envelope, and mileage. Please write "No one on the front of the registration has to file an SR-22 insurance with Motor Vehicle or has had their right to register a vehicle suspended" Your stickers and new registration will be mailed as soon as possible.

On September 13, 2000 a 120 day expansion was granted on the deadline to file a reclamation plan to the following pit owners: Forest Owen, Town of Waterboro, Glenn Bean, and James MacDonald.

On October 11, 2001 the board reviewed the reclamation plans submitted for the Jewett pit and the Dearborn Bros. pit, with the pit owners. Mr. Dearborn was asked to provide the information regarding his DEP permit application and approvals from. Mr. Jewett was asked to amend his reclamation plan with added information.

On December 13, 2000 it was reported for the record that the four reclamation plans that were granted an extension on were received by the deadline.

At the December 13 meeting the Dearborn pit was voted as exempt from the new gravel ordinance because they had prior approval by DEP, which involved a process for the town to object, and the town did not object to the approval of the permit.

A decision to request DEP approval for the Brandt pit was made.

On January 10, 2001 the reclamation plans for the Town's pit, Glenn Bean's pit, MacDonald pit and the Forest Owen pit are reviewed. Based on this review a request for more information is sent to all of these pit owners based on the new ordinance. It was decided to send a registered letter to the pit owners giving notice that they submit this by the deadline given.

At the January 25, 2001 meeting it was discussed that Susan Dunlap is currently researching the dangers of gated entrances to gravel pits and the # of injuries occurring. Susan does not feel that the town should get involved in demanding pit owners to gate their properties based on the research that she

is finding. To be discussed at a later date.

At the February 14, 2001 meeting the board worked on creating a checklist for reviewing the reclamation plans for pits based on the new ordinance.

Section 10 of the Zoning Ordinance regulates the appeals process. There are two types of appeals. An administrative appeal is an appeal from a decision of the CEO or Planning Board. The other type of appeal is a variance request such as setback, lot coverage, or parking requirements.

An appeal must be submitted to the board within 30 days of the issuance of a decision by the CEO or Planning Board by an aggrieved party. The fee for an appeal is \$100. If you have received a variance from the board you must record it at the York County Registry of Deeds within 90 days or it becomes null and void.

Despite the sadness and concerns surrounding the 9/11 terrorist attack the year 2001 was favorable for the Waterboro Water District. There were ten customers, one hydrant and a 620 foot 12 inch main extension added to the distribution system. The extension was funded by the Gorham Savings Bank to supply their new branch office. The new main was installed along Route 202, across the Route 202/5 intersection and heading a short distance in both directions on route 5.

Also, water quality testing was acceptable meeting all Federal and State standards and requirements. The 2001 Consumer Confidence Report, available at the Town Office, provides additional information regarding the District's water quality, tests, results and other details.

The watershed's supply was sufficient to meet the district second highest annual demand of 9,338,557 gallons. Below average precipitation for the last few years has created in an ever-increasing drought condition. The water level in the watershed is regularly monitored and lower that normal elevations support the State of Maine Drought Task Force alert. Presently no requests for conservation have been issued. The District will consider other actions first, however, if current precipitation trends continue conservation requests may be necessary.

The Terrorist Threat raised the concerns of everyone and whether their water systems were at risk. Industry and government professions consider the potential low however it does exists. The best deterrent against is at the local community level through citizen awareness. We strongly encourage everyone to be aware of all activities occurring near

the District's watershed or facilities and to notify the police or district representative of any questionable or unusual activity. Regretfully, we request unauthorized individuals to avoid restricted areas also be cooperative and understanding if questioned about your presence. A combination of citizen awareness and preventative actions the District has taken will increase the difficulty and likely discourage any malicious intentions. In closing we thank everyone who have already been conducting themselves in this manner.

Indeed, there are many Maine towns with budgets, services and responsibilities that are much smaller in comparison to the \$22,197,197 budget costs for MSAD #57. SACO RIVER CORRIDOR COMMISSION

The Saco River Corridor Commission (SRCC) administers, the Saco River Corridor Act, which was established by the legislature in 197. Through the Act, the Commission regulates land use within 500 to 1000 feet of the Saco, Ossipee & Little Ossipee Rivers, the Little Ossipee Flowage, and Balch Lake. The Commission is made up of representatives from twenty communities bordering these water bodies. Each of the twenty municipalities has an opportunity to be represented by one regular and one alternate member who are appointed by the Selectmen or mayor.

The Town of Waterboro is fortunate to have Doug Blackwell and Mike Towns as their voice on the Commission. In a practical sense, this gives Waterboro an opportunity to participate in the present and future development patterns throughout the corridor. The consideration of permit applications for development is one of the major functions of the Commission. During the past twelve months, the Commission considered a total of 94 applications for permits and amendments, and held public hearings.

The major project for the past year has been the initiation of our new water quality-monitoring program. For our pilot ear, this program began with twenty-one testing stations along the Maine portions of the Saco, Ossipee, and Little Ossipee Rivers. A report will be made available to the town and interested citizens summarizing our first year's experience. Information to look for will include the parameters we used for the program and why, specific testing results, and the futures of this program. Our number one goal for this venture is to have a basin wide monitoring program that provides useable planning and management information for towns and their residents. Our rivers do not recognize political boundaries. We want to do our part to prove to them that people can see beyond political boundaries as well. Consequently, the SRCC has partnered with a New Hampshire agency located in the Ossipee Watershed known as the Green Mountain Conservation Group. In the testing years to come, it is all of our hope to have one program operating within one basin under one common goal; to protect the water we all depend

PARKS AND RECREATION DEPT.

Fiscal year 2001-2002 saw tremendous growth for the Parks & Recreation Department. Existing programs such as Summer Day Camp, Teen Adventure, Tennis, Recreational Basketball, and others saw significant increases in participation. New programs such as Mad Science Camp and the town's Golf League both were filled with residents eager to meet and make new friends. Other new programs such as volleyball, family roller skate, mom and tot splash, poetry contest, Friday night child drop off, and others allowed for the participation of all of Waterboro's citizenry. Programs like our bi-monthly luncheons and weekly cribbage tournaments continue to thrive and grow. Yes, 2001-2002 was a year of growth that watched Waterboro Parks & Recreation serve nearly 2000 people for a variety of activities both therapeutic and recreational! The great news is that none of these programs new, or otherwise, caused the town to take on a significant financial burden, and all of them should maintain themselves for years to come.

Currently, with the advice and guidance of the Parks and Recreation Committee, the Department is in the process of constructing a multi-purpose field at Friendship Park. Despite the lack of grant monies (we were denied funding) we should be able to bring the project to fruition by fall 2002. Neighboring town's have watched similar projects total \$100,000.00, a figure which exceeds this department's entire budget by nearly 25%, but, with the help of

volunteers, concerned local contractors, and the generous donations from area businesses and citizens, Friendship Park will have two fields instead of one before long.

Two other construction projects exist as well. One is the erosion project at Gobeil Park, which was begun by the previous director of this department. It is a project that I have continued to support. Again, without the assistance of concerned citizen's and the members of the Ossipee Lake Association, this is a project that may have been left on the back burner due to lack of funding. With the help mentioned, we can stabilize the beach area erosion and secure a great recreation area long term.

The other construction project is the attempted conversion of the now empty Fire Barn on the corner of Old Alfred and Ossipee Hill road. Originally targeted for destruction, the project is the brainchild of our Road Commissioner David Benton, who asked for my support of the project prior to June 2001 special town meeting. I gave it unequivocally. Converting the Fire Barn into a community center, which could be utilized by residents young and old, is the goal of the project. Significant obstacles exist: the area around the barn is dangerous and roadwork must be completed prior to opening the center, we lack funding, construction materials, and manpower. However, I have alerted the citizen's of our intentions, in the department's first ever Newsletter, and the response has been good. People have

already offered to donate pool tables and computers, money and skylights, desks and tables. We need a lot more. I hope that all of you will become involved and take advantage of a great opportunity for Waterboro.

I would be remiss if I didn't mention the significant maintenance detail that this department is responsible for and the person that head's it up: Mr. Donald Macomber of Waterboro. With a glut of new programs and responsibilities, as well as a new director seemingly every year, Don has continued to take care of our vast acreage with care and attention to detail. When games are scheduled at the Little League Park, Don is there making sure the field is in great shape for the kids. When a new program begins I count on Don to help dot the I's and cross the T's. His flexibility and knowledge make him invaluable to this department. People like Don are the reason why Waterboro has one of the best, if not the best, little league park in all of Maine. I give all of you my promise to keep it so while I am director.

I must mention several issues of concern: the lack of self-sufficiency, and lack of funding being foremost. A department that is responsible for maintaining several acres of land needs to be self-sufficient. We simply cannot request donations for work materials and labor each time we require something. A yard of loam is cheap. Getting it delivered is where the expense lies. Having a vehicle that can transport loam, gravel, mulch, equipment, etc to our various locations is essential. To me, the director, the maintenance aspect is just as important as the recreation aspect. Beautiful parks and beaches remind visitors and residents alike that all of us

take pride in Waterboro. Certainly, a vehicle capable of transporting a variety of materials, is not only necessary, it is imperative.

I mentioned a lack of funding, and the lack essentially exists across the board. We're responsible for park and beach upkeep and maintenance yet we lack much of the equipment necessary to perform these duties. Currently, the town's maintenance man uses his own truck to pull the town's trailer around. This requires us to pay a mileage fee, which adds up. But the lack of funding doesn't end there...with a department of one we can only do so much and the time is rapidly approaching when we'll simply not be able to put any more on our plate. With twenty-two programs/activities, and more already planned, we are stretched very thin and the result of more programs will inevitably cause a lack of organization, which in turn makes the department look poorly. It is a give-and-take issue. The more the department gives to its citizen's the more is taken out of it. The time approaches when we will reach our limit. However, research is being done to secure a grant that would allow us to hire a fifteen-hour per week assistant, which could help with programming and researching potential new programs. Neighboring towns have secured similar grants and I have high hopes that we will secure one in the near future.

In summation, I encourage all of you to get involved. Donate materials or your time, or, bring your hobbies and interests to my attention and together we'll see if we can organize a new group, club or event. Two of last years most successful programs began this way: Waterboro resident, and head professional at

Province Lake Golf Club, Ed Chamberlain called my office early last spring and asked if I might start a League which could play Wednesday's at Province Lake. By June we had 27 male and female, young and old members. We expect membership to double for this (2002) season. The other program that was spawned by citizens is the Tennis Club. We had run lessons with professional Bob Gilpatric, but the members wanted more. A league,

complete with matches, standings, trophies and a year ending banquet thrilled us all! Next years season is already being anticipated. Other examples exist, and it is my sincere hope that I will mention your example, in next year's annual report.

PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTIONS FOR VETERANS OR THEIR FAMILIES

Veterans, their surviving spouses, minor children and widowed mothers may qualify for a tax exemption if the veteran was in active service in the armed forces of the United States during a federally recognized war or campaign period (listed below) and was honorably discharged.

Estates of veterans or their survivors, including real and personal property are exempt up to \$5,000.00 (\$7,000.00) for veterans who served prior to World War II) of just valuation in the town where the person filing is a resident. These following criteria must be met:

- 1) Applicant must be a resident of the State of Maine:
- 2) A one time application must be filed along with proof of entitlement with the assessor in the town where the applicant is a resident on or before April 1:
- 3) Veteran must be at least 62 years old (see #4 exception) on April 1 of the year in which application is made. If deceased, Veteran must have been born 62 years prior to filing of application by survivor;

OR

4) Veteran must be receiving a pension or compensation from the United States Government for total disability, either service or non-service connected, as a Veteran.

World War I (4/6/1917 to 11/18/1918)

World War II (service in Russia) 4/6/1917 to 3/31/1920

World War II (12/7/1941 to 12/21/1946)

Some Merchant Marines (12/7/1941 to 7/15/1945)

Korean Campaign (6/27/1950 to 1/31/1955)

Viet Nam War (7/6/1964 to 5/6/1975)

Persian Gulf War 8/7/00 to the date that the United States Government recognizes as the end of the Persian Gulf War.

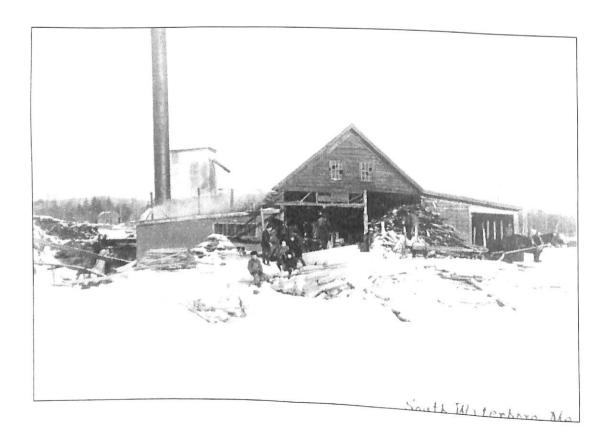
