Jaycee Women: Requesting two names of needed families to supply Thanksgiving Baskets. Names will be provided.

Roads: Rd. Comm. Bean reported that he had 1,600 to 1,700 yards of the winter stockpile put up.

The Board of Selectmen agreed to accept the Road Commissioners Payroll although this is not a payroll week.

Don Horton, Downeast Foods, Inc: A written request for an Industrial Abatement was received from Horton. Dennis Abbott suggested that the Board write Mr. Horton a letter and tell him before the Board arrives at a decision the Board would like to visit his factory on Grist Mill Road in So. Waterboro. Fay and Woodsome agreed with Abbott. The Board will await a reply from Mr. Horton as to a date and time.

Town Hall Roof: In heavy rain storms the valley of the roof which connects the old Town Hall to the New Town Offices leaks. The Board has had Victor Wright of the Heritage Co. check the roof out. Wright said the he could do both sides of the valley for \$800. or patch the hole for \$250. or do one side of the valley for \$450.. The Board agreed to have one side of the valley repaired for the \$450. Victor Wright's father Russell Wright was contacted by Selectman Woodsome by phone and given the goahead to make the repairs.

Lake Arrowhead Bids: One bid received from the Midland Management & Marketing, Inc. Total of 28 lots for \$48,969. Three of the lots that were bid on are already sold, two of the lots were bid on previously by an associate of this company. A letter to go out accepting the other 23 lots, also will be mentioned in the letter the status of lots 868 & 2039 bid on by the associated that the Town expects the monies immediately for these two lots and that lot 1622 is bid for under 60% of the assessment, therefore, making it unbildable.
