Bob Fay asks every to speak on their feelings about Waterboro. What they would like to see retained or changed.

Many people speak about their thoughts. Some of the ideas to come out of the meeting are:

Willis Lord would like to see the exit to the transfer station, and around the recycling bins tarred or cemented. He would like to see the town go back to the calendar year as our fiscal year. He feels the cost for administrating government is too high in Waterboro.

Mike MacAlevey says Waterboro has a good sense of self. People in Waterboro value family. Another strength we have is our dedication to recreation for the kids. He would also like to see the Town Hall have office hours on Saturday.
