

COUNCIL MEETING

April 24, 2001

Called to order at 7:00 p.m.

Opened with the presentation of awards to some young artists from Waterboro Elementary School.

Selectmen's Report: Reported that we have moved into the new building and will be having an Open House soon. Nancy explained that the contract deputy brought 7 inmates from the York County Jail on Saturday and they moved everything in 5 ½ hours. Have hired Clinton Andrews from Limington to work at the Transfer Station. Announced that Transfer Station stickers are available at the town hall and the Transfer Station. The Transfer Station Committee is taking a break until the first Monday in August. Requested help from citizens with regard to illegal dumping in turning information over to the Sheriff's Dept. The town will prosecute to the fullest extent of the law.

Selectmen's Asst. Report: Nancy reported that the only thing she has been working on lately is the move into the new building.

Assessor's Report: Reported that he hopes to have the field work done in July and should have the tax bills out by the first or second week in October.

Parks & Recreation: Reported that there are currently 11 programs which he is accepting either registrations or submissions on. Summer day camp registrations are coming in very quickly but will only accept 150 registrations with priority going to Waterboro residents so requested that people get them in early. The Multi-purpose field project is up and running and thanked Selectman Foglio for all his assistance.

Old Home Days Report: Reported that the dates for Old Home Days are July 5th and 6th. The fireworks will be on Saturday evening at dusk. Sanford Institution for Savings will be hosting hot air balloon rides on Saturday evening. Will be meeting every other week starting May 23rd. The Maine Army Band will be in the parade this year.

Road Commissioner: Currently finishing up some projects from last year. Will be starting the Jellerson Road project very soon. There is a new home going in on McLucas Road so will probably have to do some work. Having problems with ATV's by the old fire station and up by the Transfer Station. Also doing the seasonal grading on camp roads.

Water District: Reported that they are doing quite well. Have two more customers coming on line. Are currently installing a new guard system on the water tank to try and prevent the graffiti.

Road Review Committee: Reported that they met with the Planning Board to discuss the impact of Mr. Cote's development on Brookside Drive.

EMA Director: Reported that EMA is very quiet right now. There are not to many problems with water

Library Board of Trustees: Reported that they are also having a problem with ATV's. Requested permission to put up some orange tape to prevent them from going across the parking lot area.

Recycling Committee: Reported that for the month of April Waterboro recycled 8.94%.

Ossipee Lake Association: Reported that one gate has been open for the last month and on Monday opened both gates fully. This evening, because of the heavy rains, the lake is about 1 1/2 " to 2" above summer levels but should be back to normal in about three days. Received the engineers drawing last week regarding the \$50,000 grant for Gobeil Park. Currently are working on a second grant to help repair the shoreline at Gobeil Park. This grant application will be submitted in the next few days.

Fire Dept./EMS: Reported 33 Fire calls making 135 for the year and 42 EMS calls making 166 for the year. Served 131 at the last bean supper and the new truck is in.

Lake Arrowhead Committee: Reported that the last meeting was held in Lake Arrowhead and they discussed controlling the building, water problems, a watershed study and a satellite fire station.

Public Safety Committee: Meeting tomorrow evening at 7 p.m. at the Fire Station.

Charter Commission: Meeting tomorrow night at 7 p.m.

Comprehensive Plan Committee: Reported that they had 70-75 attend the meeting on May 10th. They further defined from the previous meeting and the next step will be a defined report.

Cemetery Committee: Reported that they have just started for the year and have a new member. Have sent out letters to people who have adopted cemeteries. Have five veterans cemeteries adopted by a boy scout troop and the flags will be going out very soon.

Transfer Station Committee: Met last night and are taking a break to see how the new fees and regulations are working. Discussed recycling and the cost of the Transfer Station to the taxpayer.
