## COUNCIL MEETING May 14, 2002

Called to order at 7:00 p.m.

Presentation of awards to young artists from Waterboro Elementary School.

**Selectmen's Report:** Reported that we have moved into the new building and will have an Open House soon. Nancy explained that the Contract Deputy brought 7 inmates from the jail and they moved everything in 5 ½ hours. Have hired Clinton Andrews from Limerick to work at the Transfer Station. Announced that stickers are available at the town hall and the Transfer Station. The Transfer Station Committee will be taking a break until the first Monday in August. Requested help from citizens on illegal dumping and will be turning all information over to the Sheriff's Dept.

**Assessor:** Reported that he hopes to have the field work done in July. Hope to have tax bills out by the first or second week of October.

**Parks & Recreation Director:** Accepting registrations or submissions on 11 programs. Summer day camp registrations are coming in very quickly. The multi-purpose field project is up and running and Mike thanked Selectman Foglio for all his assistance.

**Old Home Days:** Reported that Old Home Days will be held July 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup> with fireworks 9 or 9:30 on Saturday. Sanford Institution for Savings will be hosting hot air balloon rides. They are meeting every other week starting May 23<sup>rd</sup>. Plan to have the Maine Army Band in the parade.

**Road Commissioner:** Reported that he is finishing up some projects from last year. Will be starting the Jellerson Road project very soon. There is a new home going in on McLucas Road so will probably have to do some work up there. Still having problems with ATV's by the old fire station and up by the Transfer Station. Doing seasonal grading right now.

**Water District:** Reported that they are doing quite well. Have two more customers coming on line and are installing a new guard system on the tank.

**Road Review Committee:** Reported that they met with the Planning Board to discuss the impact of Mr. Cote's development on Brookside Drive.

**EMA:** Reported that things are very quiet right now and not to many problem's with water at this point.

**Library Board of Trustees:** Reported that they are having a problem with ATV's. Requested permission to put up some orange tape to prevent them from going across the parking lot.

Recycling Committee: Current recycling rate is 8.94%.

**Ossipee Lake Association:** Reported that they have had one gate open for the last month. On Monday he opened both gates fully. It is currently  $1 \frac{1}{2} - 2$ " above the summer level but should be back to normal in about three days. Also reported that they received the engineers drawing last week regarding the \$50,000 grant for Gobeil Park. Working on a second grant to help repair the shoreline at Gobeil Park and that will be submitted in the next few days.

**Fire Dept./EMS:** Reported 33 fire calls this month bringing the Year To Date total to 100 and 42 EMS calls for a YTD of 166. Served 131 at the bean supper and the new truck has arrived.

**Lake Arrowhead Committee:** Reported that the last meeting was held in Lake Arrowhead. Discussed controlling the building, water problems they are having, a watershed study and a possible satellite fire station.

Charter Commission: Reported that they are meeting tomorrow evening at 7 p.m.

**Comprehensive Plan Update Committee:** Reported that they had 70-75 attend the visioning meeting held on May 10<sup>th</sup>. They defined further from the previous meeting. The next step will be a report on the outcome of the two visioning sessions.

**Cemetery Committee:** Reported that they have just started for the year and have a new member. Have sent out letters on adopted cemeteries and have had five veteran's cemeteries adopted by boy scouts. The flags will be going out very soon.

**Transfer Station Committee:** Reported that they met last night and will be taking a break to see how the new fees and regulations are working. Discussed recycling and the cost of the Transfer Station.
