THE TAYLOR HOUSE

The house known as the "Taylor House" in Waterboro Center was built in 1850 by James Leavitt, who came from Alfred Gore. James Leavitt was an astute businessman who bought farm produce locally and shipped it to Portland and Boston. He also opened a store about where the fire barn is located. In addition to the store and shipping business he pieced out cloth to the local women to make shirts, coats, and trousers for clothiers in Boston. The records for the store and the sewing business are still in the house. Also in the house are the postal records for the Waterboro Center post office. James Leavitt was the postmaster for many years. With the profits from his successful businesses, he invested heavily in timberland and became the owner of much of the land in Waterboro Center. The field in back of the house not only provided hay and pasture for the animals but was also used as a "drill field" for men in the militia and for those going off to the Civil War. Two of James Leavitt's sons, James Jr. and Alonzo fought in the civil war.

After the death of James in about 1880, the house became a summer residence for the "family." James' son Benjamin, a businessman in Saco, took care of the place and made it his summer home. His wife was Ethelinda Deering of the Deering's Ridge Family. After the death of Benjamin Leavitt the house passed on to his daughter, Mrs. Louella Frey and for many years it was known as the "Frey House." Mrs. Frey's daughters Helen Taylor and Ethelinda Innis later acquired the home. Mrs. Taylor and her husband Neil spent summers in the house until their deaths in the early 1980's. Mrs. Taylor wrote "A Time to Recall," which had this house as its focal point. The Taylor's sons William, Neil, and Howard sold the house to the Town of Waterboro in 1989.

The house is of the Greek Revival style common to country homes of the period, although it appears to be the only one left in Waterboro because of the two great fires of 1911 and 1947. It is truly an unspoiled dwelling owing to the fact that it was lived in year round for only thirty years.

There were six bedrooms upstairs, one of which was converted to a bathroom. Two of these bedrooms, the large ones on the front of the house, appear to have the original 1850's wallpaper.

The downstairs consists of the front hallway, parlor, living room, music room, dining room, and kitchen. The parlor also has its original wallpaper.

The woodwork in the house is grained (a technique of painting woodwork in shades of brown and yellow to represent the natural grain of wood). Graining was done with a comb while the paint was still wet and is now almost a lost art. The painter must also have had an artistic flair for a swan and a dove are grained into the cupboard door in the dining room. There is also a rooster grained into the door of the "wood box" in the living room.

The three chimneys accommodate one wood burning cookstove, a large cooking fireplace with a crane and beehive oven, and an original Franklin fireplace.

The ell, which contains the dining room and kitchen, extends into the woodshed where the outhouse, in graduated sizes, is located. The woodshed then extends into the barn. The cellar is unique in that the floor is brick paved, the pantry room is plastered, and the chimney has storage shelves.

The porch was probably added in the late 1800's. It extends across the front of the house and, until recently, across part of the Route 5 side of the house.

To step into this house is to step back in time. The traffic on three sides seems to fade, and you can imagine how the Leavitts lived over one hundred forty years ago, before the Civil War. The Town of Waterboro is very fortunate to have acquired such a rare find in today's world.

The Assessors of the Town of Waterboro hereby give notice to all persons liable to taxation in said Town, that they will be in session at their offices in the Municipal Office Building in said Town, on the 7th day of April, at 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. for the purpose of receiving lists of the estates taxable in said Town.

All persons hereby notified to make and bring to said Assessor's true and perfect lists of all their estates real and personal, which they were possessed of, or which they held as guardian, executor, administrator, trustee, lessee/lessor, or otherwise, on the first day of April 1990, and be prepared to make oath to the truth of the same.

When estates of persons deceased have been divided during the past year or have changed hands from any cause, the executor, administrator, or other persons interested, and hereby warned to give notice of such change, and in default of such notice will be held under the law to pay the tax assessed although the such estated has been wholly distributed and paid over.



WATERBORO FIRE DEPARTMENT RESCUE ANNUAL REPORT

Waterboro Fire Department Rescue responded to 285 calls in 1989. We actually treated 325 patients. Having two ambulances to run with has worked out as well as anticipated. We have used 526 thirty five times – not to count the times that it "stood by" for all accidents. The second ambulance has allowed us to attend all football games at Massabesic High School with a full crew in case they are needed. It has been a successful year in our treatment of patients and our growth as a unit.

Our service to Waterboro does not stop with providing an ambulance. We also sponsor CPR classes, take BP's at most community events and in private homes. We participate in career day at the Junior High School as well as providing coverage at sporting events when requested to. We've developed a first aid program for the SAD 57 bus drivers and have worked with the students at the high school as well. Our people continue to participate in the State Test Team and The CISD (Critical Incident Stress Debriefing) team through the EMS office in Portland. At Thanksgiving we collected food baskets for needy families and at Christmas time helped a family to have all that was needed to have a special Christmas.

WATERBORO FIRE DEPARTMENT RESCUE ANNUAL REPORT

The yearly Walkathon "The Great Bandaid Race" was a success again in 1989. We are looking forward to this year's Great Bandaid Race and hope that the community will join us in a fun day that helps to support their ambulance service.

The Ambulance Insurance Fund is available again this year. To date we have had a very good response. Every October applications are sent to all names on the taxpayers list. They are left at area businesses for renters and others interested in participating. For \$15 a year (\$10 for 62 and up) the immediate family in a residence is eligible for free emergency transport to the hospital. Those not participating pay the regular charges. The benefits are two-fold. It allows inexpensive emergency service to participants as well as helping defray the costs of running the ambulance. Our ambulance account saves the taxpayers more than \$12,000 a year for supplies, training and equipment replacement.

The Waterboro Fire Department Rescue would like to thank the Town of Waterboro for their support. The number of calls we've responded to has increased this past year as well as the requirements and time we have had to give to keep our license up to standards. The Officers of the Rescue would like to take this opportunity to commend their personnel for a job well done and thank them for volunteering so much of their time and energy to keep Waterboro Fire Department Rescue one of the best units around.

An extensive Agenda of Regular and Special Meetings, Public Hearings, a Workshop, Subdivision and Site Plan Reviews, Conditional Use Requests, On-Site Inspections, plus work on various changes to the Waterboro Zoning Ordinance and Subdivision Regulations, posed constant challenges to the Board.

Numerous changes in Laws affecting Shoreline Zoning, Subdivision Review, Gravel Pits, Wetlands, enacted by the State Legislature, required constant monitoring to insure that current Laws were applied to problems presented to the Board.

The Comprehensive Plan, due to be completed by January 1, 1991 will require the Zoning Ordinance, Subdivision Regulations and Site Plan Review Ordinances to be brought into compliance.

Due to continuing complexity of Laws and requirements for technical advice on roads, Hydrological studies and interpretation of various reports the Board has required the assistance of Attorneys, Engineers and other experts in various fields.

The Planning Board Clerk, Mrs. Sharon Abbott has rendered outstanding and unstinting service, thereby, increasing the efficiency of our operation.

During calendar year 1989, the Waterboro Planning Board held one Workshop, had two Special Meetings, held eight Public Hearings and held twenty three previously scheduled Regular Meetings. Twelve plus On-site Inspections were conducted.

WATERBORO CONSERVATION COMMISSION ANNUAL REPORT

The Waterboro Conservation Commission consisting of members Steve Everett, Fran Wheeler, Lucille Corthell, Doris Dyer, Stuart Miller and Dale Witman have been very busy this past year with a variety of major issues arising.

The Waterboro Conservation Commission submitted a proposal to the Land for Maine's Future Board in hopes of securing state funding for the preservation and conservation of lands in the Ossipee Mountain and Moody Pond area. This proposal was later deleted from their initial round of purchases. We remain optimistic, however, that our proposal might be favorably considered in the forthcoming year.

Again in 1989 we were delighted to have sponsored two children to attend the Bryant Pond Conservation Camp.

The Waterboro Conservation Commission has been asked to review all subdivisions and provide input to the Planning Board.

The Waterboro Conservation Commission has voted to become a member of the Maine Chapter of the Audubon Society and has since purchased several Wood Duck nesting boxes which we plan to have in place for the spring to assist this species of concern.

The Waterboro Conservation Commission has taken notice of an alarming increase in litter and debris throughout the towns roads. We feel this is attributed to loads of vehicles not being covered and request every citizen's active involvement to correct this unsightly problem to our community and environment.

The Waterboro Conservation Commission also feels very strongly that as our community continues to experience a rapid rate of growth that it becomes even more imperative that we set aside lands as conservation areas and open space for future generations. We hope to aggressively address this issue in the forthcoming year.

SACO RIVER CORRIDOR COMMISSION

The Saco River Corridor Commission administers the Saco River Corridor Act, which regulates land use within 500 to 1000 feet of the Saco, Ossipee, and Little Ossipee Rivers. The Commission is made up of representatives of the twenty communities bordering the three rivers, and each municipality within the corridor is represented by one regular and one alternate member appointed by the Selectmen or Mayor. The Commission meets at least once a month to consider applications for permits and to discuss other matters which relate to the Saco River Corridor region. Waterboro's regular Commission member is Roland Denby, and the alternate member is Tom Cole.

One of the Commission's major functions is the consideration of permit applications for building construction or other activities requiring a permit. 1989 was another busy year for the commission, and during the past year (January 1 through December 31, 1989), the Commission considered a total of 122 applications for permits or variances. It also considered 28 amendments to permits previously granted and held 35 public hearings. Of the permit applications and amendments considered by the Commission this year, 37 were for activities within the Town of Waterboro.

Any Waterboro residents interested in obtaining additional information about the Commission or about the effects of the Saco River Corridor Act on their land should feel free to call their representatives to the Commission or Margaret Roy, the Commission's Executive Director, who may be reached at the Commission office on Main Street in Cornish, Maine (Telephone 625-8123).

TOWN PLANNER ANNUAL REPORT

This being my first year as Waterboro Town Planner, I would like to start out by thanking the Selectmen, Planning Board, Town staff, and all residents of Waterboro for the warm welcome and friendly assistance that I have received since beginning work on April 3, 1989. It is my intention to continue to be of assistance to the residents of this community in any way that I can.

This year has been very busy. Working with the Planning Board, I have reviewed 4 subdivisions, 5 site plans, and numerous conditional use requests. All projects were reviewed to insure conformity with State and Local laws. In addition to the regular Planning Board business, I have aided the Planning Board with interpreting the new State laws pertaining to Shoreland Zoning, Wetlands, Natural Resource Protection, Mobile Homes and Subdivisions.

I have also been involved with the development of the Town's new Comprehensive Plan. This past summer the Town hired Sebago Technics, Inc. to help the Planning Board in the development of the new comprehensive Plan. Although things were slow at the beginning of the year, work on the plan is now starting to speed up. Thus far, the Comprehensive Plan is in the inventory and analysis phase, and the final Plan is expected to be complete by the end of September, 1990. I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the citizens who have volunteered their time and effort in helping to produce this State mandated document. I would also like to encourage any other citizens to volunteer some of their time in helping to develop the Comprehensive Plan. This document will help chart the path that the Town of Waterboro wil be taking into the year 2000.

This past year I have also assisted the Selectmen on a number of projects. I have been the contact person with the Department of Environmental Protection for the environmental problems encountered throughout the Town of Waterboro. This year the Waterboro Patent Leather Site and Southern Maine Finishing Site testing was finalized on paper, with testing expected to occur throughout the first half of 1990. This testing will determine the extent of the contamination in East and South Waterboro and what the cleanup process will be.

This year also saw the finalized contract between the DEP and Town of Waterboro for the design and construction of the South Waterboro Water System. The Town has hired Wright-Pierce Engineers to design the DEP funded Water System. With hard work and a little luck, this time next year I will be writing about the completed Water System in South Waterboro.

I look forward to the oncoming year. I believe that this will prove to be a very busy year with the completion of the Comprehensive Plan, The South Waterboro Water System, and the testing at Waterboro Patent Leather and Southern Maine Finishing.

As a final note I would like to thank the residents for the warm welcome I have received and I urge you to stop in at the Town Hall if you have any problems or questions with Town and State regulations.

WATER TASK FORCE COMMITTEE ANNUAL REPORT

The past year has been an extremely busy one for those of us pursuing the development of a water system within the **Town of Waterboro.** We have finally reached a point where we can enthusiastically say that we will soon have clean water to those of you in the "South Village" that have lived with less than desirable water for many years.

Through the efforts of the committee as well as those of Mr. Steve Levy of Maine Rural Water Systems, we have reached agreement with the Maine Department of Environmental Protection. This agreement which was signed by the town, and the DEP in October, 1989 starts in motion all the necessary steps required to design, construct and put into operation a Public Water System.


Subsequent to the town and DEP reaching agreement, the committee solicited bids from a number of engineering firms for the design of the system. After reviewing all proposals set forth, we signed a contract with Wright Pierce Engineers of Topsham, Maine. They have already begun the preliminary design work and should have final designs, ready for contract bidding, completed by the end of April, 1990. This should allow us to start construction sometime the beginning of the summer with the system becoming operational by fall.

The initial system will service approximately eighteen (18) homes which are contaminated and/or at risk of contamination. We hope to expand the system as much as possible during the initial construction phase and have secured a Community Development Block Grant to provide some of the additional funding that may be necessary.

As you can see, 1989 was a very busy year but 1990 will be even more so, as we transition the committee's efforts into those of a Town Water Department and/or Water District. But the most important thing of all upcoming in 1990 will be that there will be safe, affordable drinking water in the South Village.

Once again it is my privilege to report my activities during the first session of the 114th Legislature.

I was appointed to the Energy & Natural Resources Committee and the Ways & Means Committee. Speaker Martin also appointed me as one of the House Representatives on the Low Level Radioactive Waste Advisory Committee. He also appointed me to represent the Maine House on the New England Energy Committee.

This session I sponsored five bills and co-sponsored another twenty five bills.

Our Energy and Natural Resources Committee had a very busy year reporting out one hundred forty five bills. All but six were reported ought to pass.

The most important bills which took many hours of work included State wide Forestry regulations, the Solid Waste bill and the bill to increase recycling by expanding the returnable bottle act.

It is very important that all Municipalities in the State start a comprehensive recycling program. If they combine with other Communities, that unit will receive higher priority for State Financial Assistance.

With lower State Revenues reported in late spring and throughout the rest of the year, this State has had to cut back on our spending in the bi-annual budget. We, in the Legislature must take a hard look at future revenues and if necessary cut back on the spending.

We cannot expect our taxpayers to make up the deficit by increasing the sales or income tax. Another place we should reduce is the amount of money that the Legislature allows to go to Referendum next November. It's time we take a hard look at the total indebtedness and the amount of interest we are paying every year.

It's been a great pleasure to represent all the people in District 15 and I look forward to representing you in the first year of the nineties. If I can be of any assistance to you, don't hesitate to get in touch with me.

ARTICLE 12: Shall the town amend Section 10.04 paragraph one of its Zoning Ordinance to read:

The Board shall receive, hear, and decide all requests for variances (see Section 2.03). A variance shall be granted or denied within sixty (60) days of receipt of a completed request. A variance may be granted by the Board only where strict application of this Ordinance, or local subdivision regulations to the applicant's property would cause undue hardship as defined by state law, 30-A M.R.S.A. s4504 (3):

- 1. The land in question cannot yield a reasonable return unless a variance is granted; and
- 2. The need for a variance is due to the unique circumstance of the property and not to the general conditions in the neighborhood; and
- 3. The granting of a variance will not alter the essential character of the locality; and
- 4. The hardship is not the result of action taken by the applicant or a prior owner.

Before a variance may be issued, the Board must determine, in addition to its finding of undue hardship, that strict application of this ordinance or local subdivision regulations to the applicant's property would not be in the best interest of the community.

NOW READS:

The Board shall receive, hear, and decide all requests for variances (see Section 2.03). A variance shall be granted or denied within thirty-one (31) days or receipt of a completed request. A variance may be granted by the Board only where strict application of this Ordinance, or local subdivision regulations to the applicant's property would cause undue hardship or would not be in the best interest of the community. (See MRSA tit. 30 Section 4963 (3).).

ARTICLE 13: Shall the Town vote to amend the last sentence of paragraph six of Section 10.04 of its Zoning Ordinance to read:

All such appeals shall be decided within sixty (60) days of a notice of appeal.

NOW READS:

All such appeals shall be decided within thirty-one (31) days of receipt of a notice of appeal.

ARTICLE 14: Shall the Town vote to amend Subsection 3.06.03 of its Zoning Ordinance by adding the following:

18. All types of retail and service stores (repair shops, barbers, beauticians, cleaners, etc.) with less than one thousand (1000) sq. ft. of store area, except shops or stores required a daily water consumption in excess of one thousand (1000) gallons.

ARTICLE 15: Shall the Town amend its Zoning Ordinance by adding the following s4.04:

4.04 Special Requirements for Extraction Operation Approval

Under Sections 3.06.03-4, 3.07.03-4, and 3.08.03-7, and applicant for a extraction operation conditional use permit must obtain and submit a restoration/reclamation plan, erosion/sediment control plan, and Hydrogeological Study for review and approval by the Planning Board before conditional use approval of a new extraction operation can be granted. Extraction operations in existence and actual operation on March 11, 1989 cannot be expanded to encompass more that five acres in area unless Planning Board approval of a suitable restoration/reclamation plan, erosion/sediment control plan and Hydrogeological Study is first obtained.

In preparing the plans for the extraction operation approval, the applicant shall use United States Geological Survey (USGS) datum in establishing existing topography and final topography. A description of the USGS datum, bench mark height as specified by the USGS, shall be displayed on the plans.

The conditional use application along with four (4) copies of the set of plans, which include (1) a restoration/reclamation plan, (2) erosion/sediment control plan, and (3) Hydrogeological study shall be submitted to the Planning Office at least 14 working days prior to the applicant's initial appointment.

Owners of abutting property shall be notified by the applicant via certified mail of the date, time, and purpose of the appointment a minimum of seven (7) days prior to the appointment for the applicant's extraction operation conditional use permit. Return receipts documenting that notice shall be furnished to the Planning Board.

Applicants who are not required to obtain approval from the State of Maine Department of Environmental Protection under the site location development law must obtain approval of their restoration/reclamation plan, and erosion/sediment control plan, and Hydrogeological study from the York County Soil Conservation Commission and document that approval to the Planning Board. The Planning Board shall not grant approval of an extraction operation unless the applicant documents prior approval by either the Department of Environmental Protection or the York County Soil Conservation Commission.

In addition, the Planning Board reserves the right to:

- Hold a Public Hearing, pursuant to the provisions of Section 13.07, to either gather additional information, resolve conflicting information, or to inform the public before deciding an application to commence an extraction operation.
- 2. Hire outside professionals to evaluate a proposal or design's compliance with this Ordinance, with the expense of the review borne by the applicant. The estimated cost of the consultant's review fees shall be paid by the applicant to the Planning Board at the time the conditional use application for extraction operation is reviewed. The remaining balance due, if any, shall be paid prior to the issuance of a conditional use permit for an extraction operation.

NOTICE TO DOG OWNERS

Your 1990 dog license was due and payable January 1st. If unpaid on April 1st, a warrant will be issued by the Selectmen to one or more constables or sheriffs or the animal control officer directing them to proceed forthwith to enter complaint and summons to court the owner of any unlicensed dog. This officer will first call on you demanding that you comply with the law. At this time you will be liable for a fee of \$4.00 to the officer in addition to the cost of the dog license which is \$3.00 for Neutered Males and Spayed Females 6 months old or older. \$6.50 for all dogs 6 months or older capable of producing young. Failure on your part to comply will mean that you will be summoned to court and be liable for a fine of up to \$25.00.

Revised Statutes 1964 Title 7 as amended by Public Laws of 1965, 1967, 1969, 1971, 1973, 1974, 1975, 1976, 1977, 1978, 1979, 1982.

To the Citizens of Waterboro:

We are going to enforce the Dog License Law (Title 7, Chapter 713, Section 3702 of the Maine State Law) in Waterboro. The owners or keepers of any dog in Waterboro must get a license from the Town Clerk before April 1st.

On April 1st, we will issue a Dog License Warrant. The warrant enables the enforcement officers to legally call on the owners or keepers of unlicensed dogs. After we issued a warrant, the owners or keepers of unlicensed dogs must obtain a dog license from the Town Clerk within seven days and pay to the Town Clerk \$4.00 constable fee in addition to the regular dog licensing fee.

If a dog license is not obtained within seven days of the warning, the officers holding the warrant will proceed to summons to court the owner or keeper of the unlicensed dog.

So, you're getting fair warning - GET A LICENSE FOR YOUR DOG!

FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

The total of the budget requests to run the Town government is 28% over the amount of money appropriated last year. Last year \$1,107,000 was appropriated and this year's request totals \$1,428,000. The Finance Committee is recommending \$1,161,892 which is a 5% increase over last year's budget. If the Finance Committee recommendations are supported at the Town Meeting, your taxes will increase by 20%. If all of the monies being requested are appropriated, your taxes will increase by 33%. Waterboro's share of the SAD #57 budget is 11% higher. Included in our report are worksheets which illustrate how the request in the various departments of Town government have changed during the past 5 years. Also, comparisons are given for the county, school and Town budgets for these different years.

The Finance Committee urges all Waterboro taxpayers to attend and to participate in the annual Town Meeting and to express your views. Your views and support are needed in order to assure that Waterboro lives within its means.

EXPLANATION OF DEFERRED HOMESTEAD PROPERTY TAX LAW

Maine residents who are 65 years of age and who have a household income of \$32,000 or less may file this application with the Municipal Assessors on or before April 1st requesting deferral of the property taxes on their home and up to 10 contiguous acres. This application requires a one-time filing and is not required annually. Applications with the Municipal Assessors will be forwarded to the Bureau of Taxation within 15 days of receipt for purposes of approval/disapproval. All applicants will receive notification from the Bureau of Taxation as to the approval/disapproval of their application. In the case of approved applications direct payments of the deferred property taxes will be made by the State of Maine to the municipality. In the instance of a disapproved application, the applicant will be notified as to the reasons for disapproval and the available appeals process (36 MRSA, Chapter 101, subchapter II-A).

The deferred taxes plus interest at 6% will become payable to the State upon the death of the claimant, sale of the property, in the event the claimant moves, or removal of the home (mobile home) from the state. The State of Maine will have a lien against the Tax Deferred Property for purposes of securing its interest.

The Bureau of Taxation shall annually, by December 15th, notify each taxpayer receiving tax deferral benefits that their property taxes have been deferred for the current year and the total deferred taxes and interest since the first year of tax deferral.

If you filed a Maine Income Tax Beturn, complete Schedule I. Complete Schedule II if you are not required to file a tax return.

Household Income:

"Household Income" means all the income received by all members of the household. This is true whether the income is taxed or not. The following do not count:

Notes to Financial Statements December 31, 1989

NOTE A - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The Town of Waterboro, Maine operates without a charter under a selectman - Town Meeting form of government. The town was incorporated on March 6, 1787. The Town provides the following services: general administration, public safety, health and sanitation, highways and bridges, general assistance, education and parks and recreation.

The Town's financial report includes all of the Town's operations.

The accounting policies of the Town conform to generally accepted accounting principles, except the Town does not record its general fixed assets. The following is a summary of the significant accounting principles of the Town:

Principles Determining Scope of Reporting Entity

The financial statements of the Town consist only of the funds and account groups of the Town. The Town has no oversight responsibility for any other governmental entity since no other entities are considered to be controlled by or dependent on the Town. Control or Dependence is determined on the basis of budget adoption, taking authority, funding, and appointment of the respective governing board.

Fund Accounting

The accounts of the Town are organized on the basis of funds and account groups, each of which is considered a separate accounting entity. The operations of each fund are accounted for with a separate set of self-balancing accounts that comprise its assets, liabilities, fund equity, revenues, and expenditures, or expenses, as appropriate. Government resources are allocated to and accounted for in individual funds based upon the purposes for which they are to be spent and the means based upon the purposes for which they are to be spent and the means by which spending activities are controlled. The various funds are grouped, in the financial statements in the report, into generic fund types and broad fund categories including the following governmental fund:

General Fund - The General Fund is the general operating fund of the Town. It is used to account for all financial resources except those required to be accounted for in another fund.

Trust Fund - The Trust Fund is used to account for assets held by the Town in a trustee capacity or as an agent for individuals, private organizations, other governmental units and/or other funds.

Notes to Financial Statements December 31, 1989

NOTE A - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (cont.)

Basis of Accounting

Basis of accounting refers to when revenues and expenditures or expenses are recognized in the accounts and reported in the financial statements. Basis of accounting relates to the timing of the measurements made, regardless of the measurement focus applied.

All governmental funds are accounted for using the modified accrual basis of accounting. Their revenues are recognized when they become measurable and available as net current assets. Property Taxes are recorded as revenue when levied even though a portion of the taxes may be controlled in subsequent years. Penalties and interest and Miscellaneous Revenue are recorded when received in cash because they are generally not measurable until actually received. Intergovernmental Revenue and Interest Income are accrued when their receipt occurs soon enough after the end of the accounting period so as to be both measurable and available. Expenditures are generally recognized under the modified accrual basis of accounting when the related fund liability is incurred.

All fiduciary fund types are accounted for using the accrual basis of accounting. Their revenues are recognized when they are earned, and their expenditures are recognized when they are incurred.

Budgets and Budgetary Accounting

The Town follows these procedures in establishing the budgetary data reflected in the financial statements:

- (1) The various town departments submit requests to the town finance committee.
- (2) The finance committee receives the requests and makes recommendations for budget expenditures and budget revenue to the town's people at the annual town meeting in March.
- (3) At the meeting, the town's people vote on each recommended departmental budget expenditures and revenue item.
- (4) Once the elements of the budget are approved, the town's treasurer presents monthly a revenue and expenditure report to the selectmen.
- (5) Appropriations lapse at the end of each fiscal year.
- (6) The finance committee may, through the selectmen, call a special town meeting during the year to recommend additional expenditures, which must be voted on and approved by the town peoples' vote.

Notes to Financial Statements December 31, 1989

NOTE A - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (cont.) Investments

Investments include certificates of deposit with maturities within one year. Investments are stated at cost, which approximates market. No unrealized loss or gains have been recognized for financial reporting purposes.

Restricted Assets

These assets consist of short-term investments restricted for new municipal buildings.

Revenue Recognition - Property Taxes

Taxes are levied on August 15th and are due and payable by September 15th. All unpaid taxes levied commence accruing interest at the rate of 12% on September 16 and become delinquent December 31st of the current year.

Discounts were also offered during the billing process. A 2.5% discount is given on payments made in full by September 15th and an additional 2.5% on the prepayment of 1989 taxes.

Comparative Data

Comparative data for the prior year have been presented in the accompanying financial statements in order to provide an understanding of changes in the Town's financial position and operations.

Total Columns on Combined Statements - Overview

Total columns on the Combined Statements are captioned "Memorandum Only" to indicate that they are presented only a facilitate financial analysis. Data in these columns do not present financial position, results of operations, or changes in financial position in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles. Neither is such date comparable to a consolidation. Interfund eliminations have not been made in the aggregation of this data.


